Sabres Season Goes From Bad to Worse

Just when you think it can't get any worse, back to back shutouts show how low this years Sabres team can go. The lowest point of this season was the 3-0 loss on the road against the Colorado Rockies.

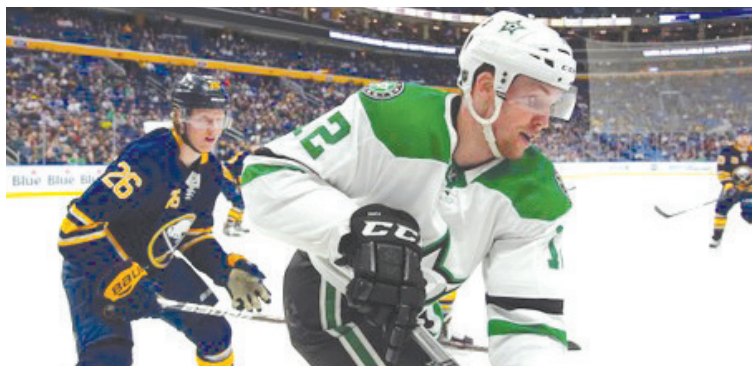
Especially troubling about that game was the one sided loss against a team just as disappointing as Buffalo. The Sabres were outshot 43-18 and those numbers were flattering in a game that was much more onesided than the score indicates. The shots were 43-9 until seven minutes left in the game. Only after the Sabres pulled their goalie late in the game was there any semblance of an offensive attack. Only with that manpower advantage and winning several faceoffs in the Av's zone with their goalie pulled were the Sabres able to get some point shots through and inflate their anemic shots on goal total.

This game featured the latest example of the disturbing trend of opponents pushing the Sabres around physically. A crushing hit to the boards on Jack Eichel from ex Sabre Nikita Kucherov including ripping Eichels helmet off his head and throwing him to the ice drew a meek response from his teammates. Casey Nelson was the closest man and his failure to stick up for his teammate drew a benching the next game. Eichel later drew a two game suspension for his hit to the head of Colorado player Carl Soderberg. That play may have been Eichel's response to the mugging he endured

from Kucherov.

With Eichel out of the lineup the Sabres put forth another listless effort at the Keybank Center on Tuesday March 13 against the Dallas Stars in a 2-0 loss. The Sabres started the game by shooting the puck over the glass for two consecutive delay of game penalties. This is the absolute worst play in hockey and they did it twice.

Of special note to a Buffalo team that can't stop their opponents from scoring, this was Ben Bishop's third consecutive shutout for Dallas, he stopped 35 shots while Linus Ullmark blocked 25 of 27 shots for

Buffalo. This was Bishop's second shutout against the Sabres, he blanked them 1-0 on January 30 in Dallas. Bishop has won his last 12 starts against Buffalo, which is tied for the longest active streak against a single opponent in the NHL. Nashville's Pekka Rinne has won 12 straight against Edmonton. Both teams on the wrong end of those streaks are the same ones that "tanked" for the 2015 draft.

Jeff Skinner has not scored a goal in his last 12 games despite getting

plenty of chance said, "We just couldn't seem to find one to maybe give us a lift and go from there, It's not a good feeling. But at the same time, you have to stick with it and create some more."

Sabres coach Phil Housley saw room for improvement for his team, "We could've gotten to the net a little bit more to try for a second or third opportunity, but we had guys around the net, we just never found the rebound. Not to make an excuse, we ran into a goaltender that's been playing terrific hockey right now. It's his third shutout in a row, so we got to find a way to make it difficult for the goaltenders. But I can't fault the way our guys worked hard."

Despite the back to back shutouts, Housley liked the improvement his team showed by generating 61 shots attempts after only 38 attempts and 18 shots against Colorado. "We've just got to keep digging and working," Housley said. "We're going to break

through. I really like the checking detail. I mean, we give a team 15 chances against, we're usually winning that game or going into overtime. We got to find a way to make it tougher on the goalies."

Following their worst game of the season, he Sabres played well defensively limiting Dallas to very few good scoring opportunities and outshot them by a good margin. And yet lost both games by shoutouts.

The Sabres have just one regulation win in their last 12 games.

Ask Rusty - Maximizing Social Security Benefits

Dear Rusty: I am currently 68 and am waiting to take maximum benefits at age 70. I have been retired for 3 and a half years. My wife turned 62 in February of this year. She stopped working around 1994. What is the best way to maximize our ss benefit? Both of us have longevity on our side. My wife's parents lived into their 80s, her grandmother lived to 96. My mother lived to 84, my father to 98. We are both very active, no big health issues. Signed: Planning Ahead

Dear Planning: You're already on a path to maximize your benefits by waiting until you are 70 to claim. Given that both of you are in good health and assuming you both live a long life, maximizing your wife's benefit will yield you the most in cumulative Social Security benefits. Assuming you are the higher-earner, your wife's highest benefit will probably be her benefit as your spouse, so maximizing her spousal benefit would be an excellent strategy. Although your wife is eligible to collect her own SS benefit at age 62, if she does so her eventual spousal benefit will be reduced to something less than 50% of your full retirement age (FRA) benefit. Here's how that works: A spousal benefit, if taken at one's full retirement age (66 ½ for your wife), is 50% of the higher-earning spouse's benefit at his full retirement age (not the increased benefit you get by waiting until age

70). But if the spousal benefit is taken earlier than full retirement age it is reduced actuarially according to the number of months before FRA it is claimed. If your wife claims her own SS benefit at age 62, her eventual spousal benefit will be less than 50% of your benefit, because the spousal boost is added to her early benefit amount. Said another way, any time any Social Security benefit is taken earlier than one's full retirement age it is reduced. In your case, when you claim your benefits at age 70, your wife will be 63 ½. If she is already receiving her own SS benefits she will be automatically deemed to be filing for a spousal benefit at that time, and the amount of her spousal benefit will be reduced due to starting it earlier than her FRA. However, if she is not yet receiving her own SS benefit, she will not be deemed as filing for her spousal benefit until she files for her own SS on her own work record. The only way your wife can get the full 50% of your FRA benefit amount is by waiting until her full retirement age to claim her benefits. And if you are both in good health and expect to live at least until your mid-80's, your wife waiting until her FRA to apply will give you the most in cumulative lifetime benefits (as well as the highest combined monthly benefits). But keep in mind that the decision of when to claim benefits must always

take into account current financial needs, current health and lifestyle, and anticipated longevity. If you don't need the money right now, and if you're both in good health and expect a long life, then maximizing both of your benefit amounts as described above would be a very sound strategy.
