Buffalo Sabres Fire Coach Phil Housley

Buffalo Sabres general manager Jason Botterill fired head coach Phil Housley after two years behind the bench. Housley's record was 58-84-22 in two years and he failed to inspire a young team to play with the discipline necessary to play well enough defensively to be competitive.

Botterill appeared to struggle emotionally when he made the announcement on Sunday, showing that he had difficulty with the decision. The team had announced on Friday that Housley would be available Monday afternoon for the media on locker clean out day. Obviously Hous-

ley's status changed over the weekend as Botterill contemplated his impending decision. The decision was made before conducting exit interviews with the players although reportedly Botterill had met with the players last week. To a man the players including team captain Jack Eichel took responsibility for their poor play and absolved Housley of blame for their poor season.

Housley had been hired without any head coaching experience, and failed to adjust his system to his team and it's actual capabilities. The Sabres especially struggled in goals allowed as they were

outscored 546-419 this season, allowing an average of 3.33 goals per game which ranked 30th in the league. It's a far cry from where the team stood in November this past season when the Sabres rode a ten game winning streak to the best record in the NHL before dropping to sixth overall in the Atlantic Division and 26th in the league with a 33-39-10 overall record.

Botterill and the Sabres are expected to make an extensive search for a new head coach. The team was expected to give serious consideration to their AHL coach, Rochester Americans head coach Todd Richards but according to sources within the Sabres organization the team has not reached out to him about the job.

Other names already mentioned in association with the opening are veteran NHL coaches Alain Vigneault and Todd McLellan. The new hire will be the teams sixth coach over the past seven years.

Momentous Occasion In Rocket History

Next month, May 2019 it will be 50 years since the first single page Rocket hit the streets of North Buffalo. Lots have happened since that day in 1969. Many editors, columnist, salespeople, production workers and photographers have passed through the doors of the popular weekly making it one of the finest in Western New York. We would like to honor those who spent those years serving the residents and businesses of this great neighborhood. We will at least have a list of the editors and columnist who have contributed to the success of the North Buffalo Rocket, West Side Times and Riverside times.

One of the biggest moves we made in those 50 years was the purchase of our own Newspaper web press. For those who

have no clue what that is, the best was to describe it is, in the movies when they show headlines being printed and flying of a press, it is a web. They call it a web as it has many rolls of newsprint weaving through the machine with each section printing the pages and ending at the final chute as a finished newspaper. Since we were printing over 35,000 of our own papers, it became financially responsible to consider such a purchase. A small web that we would need with four units, used, was about \$100,000 back in 1987. Not overwhelming, but it was for a small business like ours.

I went to our bank at the time, Key Bank in Kenmore. Things were different in the banking business back then. All I did was go to the manag-

er, Tom Reilly and ask for a line of credit for the 100 thousand to bid on a press at an auction. He gave it to me with no question or collateral. Not like now, you would need to put up your first born, dog, cat, equity worth twice the loan and anything else you have of value. In any case I had the line of credit, and went to the auction in Fredonia that had a web and bought it. That was just the beginning. This is a huge machine, and not only did it need to be moved at a cost of 10 thousand, but it had to be installed in our building. Had to be aligned correctly for it to work and the base had to be set in concrete. Major production and began to think we may have bit off more than we can chew. Fortunately, I had built an addition onto our property on Delaware with 14-foot ceilings that would accommodate this press. Finally, it was done and running. Next problem, who is going to run it. None of our pressmen knew the first thing about this monster. We hired the fellow who ran the press in Fredonia.

That first night of trying to print our own newspaper was exciting, frus-

trating, and a learning experience. As the three of us watched and tried to contribute in any way to help our expert, Gary, print our first Rocket. I do believe it was about 2 AM when it was finally done. Turned out after a couple of months our own Bobbie Wright was able to run it by himself. At the peak of our web experience we printed 30 papers a month including our own. Even did the UB paper for a while and other weeklies. Things were good in the newspaper business back then. TV and the internet put an end to that. Not only the small papers

suffered but some dailies have bit the dust. It was fun while it lasted and a great experience for me and my family. At one time we were even considering bigger and better webs. Didn't happen. Turns out to be the right move.

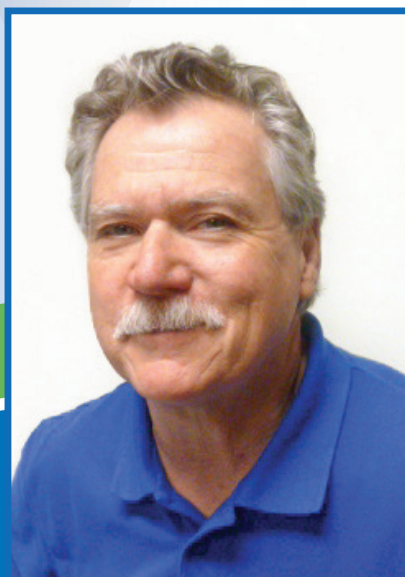

Ask Rusty- Widow Asks About Survivor Benefits

Dear Rusty: My husband passed away 7 years ago at the age of 64, at which time he was receiving SS Disability. I was 58 at the time he passed and could not apply for his Social Security. I was still working but let SS know he was deceased, so his check was no longer deposited. I am now 65 and my age to reach full benefits without penalty is 66. I plan to work three more years before applying for Social Security. My question is: Can I apply for my deceased husband's SS benefits now and not my own without any penalties? And if so, what is the process? Thank you for your time and the information and resources you provide. Signed: Widowed Wife

Dear Widowed: Yes, as a widow you have the choice of claiming either your survivor's benefit or your own benefit but claiming either before your full retirement age will reduce it. If you claim your survivor's benefit

before you reach age 66 it will be somewhat reduced from 100% of what your husband was receiving when he passed. Since you're now 65, the reduction won't be too severe (about 0.4% for each month before your full retirement age of 66). Your own benefit would be reduced by about 0.69% for each month before your full retirement age. I suggest you evaluate which of your future benefits will be greater – the survivor benefit at maximum or your own benefit at maximum. Your survivor benefit reaches maximum at your full retirement age of 66, but your own SS benefit can continue to grow until age 70 when it would be 32% more than it would be at age 66. You may want to set a goal to claim in such a way that you can get the highest benefit for the rest of your life. If you know what your own benefit will be at your full retirement age, add 32% to that, and compare that number

to the benefit your husband was receiving at his death. If your own at age 70 is more than he was receiving, then it would be wise to take the survivor benefit first and let your own grow by 8% per year until 70 and then switch from the survivor benefit to your own. If your survivor benefit at your FRA will be greater than your own at age 70, then it would be wise to let the survivor benefit

grow to maximum at your full retirement age and claim it then. In any case, to answer your question – yes, you can apply for your reduced benefits as a widow now or wait until you're 66 to get the full benefit, and the way to do that is to contact Social Security directly and request your benefit as your husband's widow. Survivor's benefit cannot be applied for online, so you should call Social Security

(find your local office at www.ssa.gov/locator) and request an appointment to apply for survivor benefits. When you make your appointment, Social Security will advise you if they'll require any additional documentation. And if you wish to let your own benefit grow to age 70, then be sure to specify you're applying only for your survivor benefit, not your Social Security retirement benefit.
