Slow Roll Buffalo 2019 Season



Slow Roll is a group bicycle ride that meets every Monday night and has expanded into a Global network of community rides.

Slow Roll Buffalo, a program of GObike Buffalo and presented by Independent Health, released its 2019 schedule of more than 40 free and inclusive community bike rides beginning Monday, May 6th, at Hostel Buffalo-Niagara in downtown Buffalo.

With its mission to communities connect across the city through

free supported bike rides for all ages and skill levels, Slow Roll Buffalo, for the fifth year, will present 26 Monday night rides around the city with a new host venue and route every week. Each ride spotlights different people, places, and community organizations along the way.

The rides serve as bookends for GObike

Buffalo's sixth annual SkvRide, a fundraiser bike ride providing riders the opportunity to explore the past, present and future of Buffalo's roadways through a ride highlighting our legacy highways—the Skyway, Scajaquada Expressway, and Kensington Express-



Sabres Roster Surgery Needed

In his two seasons as the Buffalo Sabres general manager, Jason Botterill has had two busy offseasons, swapping 10 players off the roster each year as he attempts to restore the team to playoff calibre. The net result has been underwhelming as the Sabres continue to reside among the worst teams in the league.

One of the big questions is what to do with Kyle Okposo? In 2018-19, Okposo earned a base salary of \$3,000,000 and a signing bonus of \$3,000,000, for a salary a cap hit of \$6,000,000. He had a no move clause in 2016-17 & 2017-18. He is eligible to be traded subject to a 15 team no

trade list. But how may teams would want a slow 31 year old winger who scored a decent 14 goals but carries a \$6,000,000 cap hit thorough the 2022-23 season?

The Calgary Flames may provide the answer. James Neal has been a disappointment there since signing a five year free agent deal paying \$5.750,000 per season through 2023. Neal was the original darling of the stats nerds at the dawn of the analytics era. Following a 21 goal season with the Dallas Stars in 2013-14 he was signed as a free agent by the Pittsburgh Penguins. The Pens had identified Neal as a player who had the

ability to put the puck in the net when in scoring position. They felt he was underutilized in Dallas and could produce for the Pens playing with high quality line mates like

Sydney Crosby.
The experiment paid huge dividends for Pittsburgh as Neal scored 40 goals and was named a first team all star in 2014-15. And he continued to produce with six consecutive seasons scoring 21-31 goals. But like Okposo, Neal looks slow as the pace of the NHL game has evolved and gotten faster. He produced seven goals and was a healthy scratch when the Flames were eliminated in game five of their opening round playoff series.

Okposo's 14 goals is actually great production on a fourth line. If Neal could drop some weight and work on his skating in the offseason maybe he could regain his form as a sniper that he displayed for Las Vegas just one season ago when he scored 25 goals. A trade would give both of these players a fresh start.

Roll's mission for covering the entire city, among 10 new hosts this year are Walden Park on the eastern city line (June 3) and Broderick Park at the foot of West Ferry along the Niagara River (June 24), while past favorites returning to the schedule include Richardson Olmsted Campus (August 12) and Silo City (July 29) along with annual staples Buffalo and Erie County Naval and Military Park (Memorial Day, May 27) and Big Ditch Brewing Company (Labor Day, September 2).

Slow Roll Buffalo will continue to grow beyond Mondays and the City of Buffalo beginning with a Niagara Falls Bike Stampede hosted by the African Heritage Food Co-op on Saturday, May 11 to encourage participation in GObike Buffalo-led Niagara Falls Bicycle Master Plan while

returning to suburbs and rural areas including Clarence and Eden, and adding more rides in the City including the Pride Ride with Evergreen Health on May 29 and the Ride for Freedom with Project Mona's House on July 5.

Once you enter the sacrament of Marriage, friendships change, you






One would imagine that when Facebook was originated it was more

Ask Rusty - Windfall **Elimination Provision**

Dear Rusty: I have a question in regard to the "windfall act." I am receiving a pension from the State of Nevada. I retired from the State, and did not pay into Social Security, but I worked in the private sector before and am currently working in the private sector. My question is: How much "penalty" will I be subject to when I decide to finally hang it up? Signed: Štate Retiree

Dear State Retiree: The State of Nevada is one of 27 states which, for all or some employee categories, do not participate in the Federal Social Security (SS) program; rather their State pensions are designed to provide a retirement benefit in lieu of Social Security. Because you receive a Nevada state pension and have also worked in the private sector long enough to be entitled to a Social Security (SS) benefit, your SS retirement benefit, when you claim it, may be reduced by the Windfall Elimination Provision (WEP), with the amount of reduction based upon how many years of substantial SS-covered earnings you have. If you have $\bar{2}0$ or fewer years of SS-covered employment, here's how WEP will affect your Social Security benefit:

Your actual benefit amount is based upon your "primary insurance amount" (PĬA), which is computed using the average monthly earnings from the 35 highest earning years over your lifetime, known as your Average Indexed Monthly Earnings or "AIME" (only earnings up to the maximum payroll tax cap for each year are counted). Your PIA is the Social Security benefit you are entitled to at your full retirement age. Normally, when WEP doesn't apply, your Social Security benefit amount is computed by taking the monthly average of those inflation-adjusted years of earnings (your AIME) and using a standard formula to arrive at your PIA. That formu-

la includes using 90%

of the first part (called a "bend point") of your AIME to be the first portion of three used to arrive at your PIA amount. For those first becoming eligible for benefits in 2019 (usually at age 62) that first bend point is \$926, which means that \$833 (90%) would normally be the first contribution to your PIA. But when WEP applies the formula is different; instead of using 90% of that first bend point, if you had 20 or less years of covered-SS substantial earnings they use 40%, which would mean that the first bend point would add \$370 to your PIA amount instead of \$833, a reduction of \$463. Remember that the bend points used are those for your year of Social Security eligibility, not for the year you claim benefits.

The percentage used to compute that first "bend point" goes up by 5% for each year over 20 years of substantial

SS-covered earnings you have - for example, if you have 22 years of SS-covered substantial earnings the formula would use a 50% multiplier instead of 40%. And at 30 years of SS-covered earnings you're no longer affected by WEP. WEP can't reduce your PIA by more than half of your NV pension amount, and there is also a maximum WEP reduction which might apply. And finally, please note that any benefit estimates you might get from Social Security now will not include the WEP reduction, which will be applied only when you actually claim your Social Security benefits.


