The Biggest Draft Days in Bills History

In 1978 the Buffalo Bills traded star running back O.J. Simpson to his hometown San Francisco 49ers. The team agreed to pay Simpson the final season of his three year contract at a salary of \$733,000. In return, the 49ers sent Buffalo five draft picks; number one in 1979, number two and three in 1978, and number two and four in 1980.

The number one pick in 1978 became the top pick in the draft and the Bills selected Ohio State linebacker Tom Cousineau. He never played a single game for Buffalo. The Montreal Alouettes of the Canadian Football League offered him twice as much money as Buffalo did. Cousineau signed a two year deal with Montreal. With a name like Cousineau he was a good fit in that cities French Canadian culture.

In 1982 Cousineau wanted play in the NFL and sought to be traded from Buffalo to the Houston Oilers. Instead, Buffalo sent Cousineau's rights to the Cleveland Browns for their first round pick in the 1983 NFL draft. Cousineau played the next four seasons for Cleveland then played two more years in 1986 and 1987 for the San Francisco 49ers before retiring.

Given that Cousineau never played a down for the Bills and had a mediocre NFL career as a former No. 1 overall pick, he is regarded as one of the biggest draft busts of all time. He followed another colossal draft mistake when the Bills selected Walt Patuski first overall in 1972. Patulski was ranked as the 27th worst draft bust of all time by ESPN.

The Bills used Cleveland's pick at 14th overall to select quarterback Jim Kelly from the Miami Hurricanes. Of course Kelly initially jilted the Bills, opting to play two seasons for the USFL Houston Gamblers because he didn't want to play for a team in a cold weather climate.

Initially, Kelly was resigned to playing for the Bills even though he believed that Ralph Wil-

son would not bring in the right players to build a championship team. While meeting with the team to negotiate his contract, a Bills secretary mistakenly let Bruce Allen, general manager of the USFL's Chicago Blitz, talk to Kelly on the telephone; Allen persuaded Kelly to leave the meeting. Kelly later claimed that the USFL offered him his choice of teams because of the league's interest in signing quarterbacks.

He eventually joined Buffalo in 1986 after the USFL folded. So the O.J. Simpson trade eventually brought Jim Kelly to Buffalo. That's how a team can manage it's player assets and stay competitive.

Snow Birds

The snow bird has landed! Just returned to Western New York from sunny Southwest Florida. Interesting that you can go from the mid-eighties to the low forties in a day. If you fly, it is a couple of hours. Two different worlds and not that far apart. Sunshine, warm temperatures, flowers and palm trees only to return to what seems to be a late Spring. Forgot to pack long pants and had to endure the colder air in shorts. Short pants are the attire of the day down south. Even if you do go out, dressier shorts are

One of my observations as a part time Florida resident, is how different the two areas are as far as immigrants. Florida has an abundance of Hispanic people who speak either no or broken English. I bring this up as they are so dominate in that area.

I had mentioned before that most of the manual labor, like landscaping. construction, restaurant and hotel personal are hardworking Hispanics. The overwhelming dominance of immigrants is not that way up north where we live. It is not just manual labor. I noticed this trip down here that a great deal of the medical profession is also Hispanic. Not just the nurses and assistants but many of the badly needed doctors are from either central or South America. Remember that Hispanic immigrants are not all from Mexico. The doctor that removed a bladder tumor I had was from Peru. He was great. My wife recently visited two Hispanic doctors, one who recently escaped from Cuba. Extremely dedicated to their profession and much needed in this senior citizen paradise.

Besides immigrants, the diversity of the "snow birds" which is what northerners are called who settle down there for the winter. My nextdoor neighbor is from Wisconsin, the other side is a Doctor from Costa Rica. Two of the residents across the street are from Canada. One is from Argentina. Other neighbors are from Maine, Mas-Pennsylvasachusetts, nia, Illinois, Michigan and most of the northern states. Not one is a Florida cracker, the term they use for born and raised Floridians. The important thing to point out here is that in spite of the different areas they come from; it is an extremely friendly atmosphere. You walk the loop your arm gets tired waving and your jaw gets sore from saying good morning. Reminds me of the good old West Side of Buffalo.

Grew up on Fargo and Massachusetts and raised my family on 15th street. Knew all the neighbors in both places. Talk about immigrants, back in the forties, it was mostly Italian importee's, some were right from the old country. In both neighborhoods we knew almost

everyone on the block. We shared the house with the Capozzis. Next door the DePaulos. The Barberas, the Maluccis, Lombardos, some right from the old country and spoke broken English. Great people and taught me a lot as a youngster.

On 15th street the Cadaros, Barbalotos, Missanas, DeCarlos, all from Italy and so friendly and good to my kids. Loved that time in my life as so many good people being so good and friendly. It is that way to some degree in Florida and that makes life good. In the neighborhood we live in up north, I know the next-door neighbor and not too many past that. Seems most just like

to keep to themselves and either spend the time inside watching TV or on the computer. Communicating on social media. No one sits on the porch like on the good old West Side. They do walk and seldom does anyone say hello or exchange greetings unless they know you. Guess that is the way it is up here now, sadly.

Ask Rusty - Mother Seeking SSI Benefits

Dear Rusty: My young daughter is disabled, and I am trying to make ends meet financially. Can you help with a child's SSI claim? Signed: Needy Mother

Dear Needy Mother: "SSI", or "Supplemental Security Income", is a Federal benefit program administered by, but separate from Social Security. SSI is available for low-income disabled seniors and disabled minor children. As your daughter's parent you must apply directly with the Social Security Administration (you cannot apply online). You can do this at the general SSA number (1.800.772.1213) or at your local Social Security office, which you can find by going to this link: www.ssa.gov/locator. Here, you can enter your zip code and get back contact information for your local office, including location, hours, and telephone number to call. You should call first to make an appointment so as to speed up the SSI application process and avoid long wait times. In order to expedite the application, you should first complete a Child Disability Report which will ask you to provide detailed information about the child and the child's medical condition. A child is considered disabled if suffering from physical or mental impairment which causes a severe functional impairment which has lasted (or is expected to last) more than a year. Go to this online link for complete information on applying for SSI for your child: https:// www.ssa.gov/applyfordisability/child.htm. In addition to information on the child's eligibility criteria and how to apply, at this SSA website you will also find a link to the Child Disability Report.

Completing the report online is relatively straightforward and intuitive if you have some computer skills but, if not, you can also obtain a copy of the form (SSA-3820) at this link: https://www.ssa.gov/forms/ssa-3820.pdf. You can download the Child Disability Report form (SSA-3820), print

it, fill it out as completely as possible by hand and provide it to Social Security when you submit the SSI application. Gathering all the information requested and providing it to Social Security via the Child Disability Report will serve to greatly expedite the SSI application for your child. Please be aware that there are household income limits and that SSI benefits are closely coordinated with the State in which you live. In fact, Social Security will contact your State's SSI benefit office to provide them with your application, and your State's SSI benefit office will verify the child's eligibility by contacting doctors, hospitals, teachers, medical providers, schools or other contacts you have provided who can verify the child's disability and eligibility. If the child is working, he/she must not be earning more than the monthly allowable amount (\$1220 for 2019) in order to be eligible for

Supplemental Security Income. Also, be aware that if the application is initially denied, you have the right to appeal that initial decision. And for clarity, money for SSI benefits is not taken from Social Security funds but rather from the Government's general funds.






