

Buffalo Sabres Fog Game 1975

With the Buffalo Sabres on an eight year run wthout participating in the playoffs. It's been decades since shouts of "Thank you Sabres" echoed in the old Aud during April so many years ago.

Sabres Fever used to grip the City of Buffalo and western New York in April and May. In 1975 the Sabres finished the regular season atop the NHL standings with 113 points, tied with the Philadelphia Flyers and Boston Bruins. An epic playoof series victory against the Montreal Canadiens propelled Buffalo into the StanleyCup finals against the defending champion Flyers. On May 20th one of the most memorable games in league history took place in the venerable arena at the foot of Main Street.

A bat had found it's way into the building and had been flying around over the ice surface early in the game. Eventually, the Sabres Jim Lorentz reached up with his stick and knocked the creature out of the air, killing it, earning him the nickname "Batman". The Flyers Rick MacLeish picked the bat up barehanded and carried it off the ice. When asked by a teammate if he was worried about catching rabies he replied, "What's rabies?" That was just the begin-

It had been a warm outside and the day

building was not air conditioned so a fog had begun to form that eventually covered the ice. The fans sitting in their seats could see the play fine but at ice level visibilty was severely limited for the players. So during stoppages in play, the Sabres and Flyers players would carry sheets stretched

between them and skate laps around the rink to disburese the fog before resuming play.

Defensive stalwart Bill Hajt scored to tie the game 4-4 and send it to overtime where the French Connection line performed it's magic. Rene Robert scored after 18:29 of the overtime period with a shot from a bad angle that goalie Bernie Parent never saw coming through the fog. The goal gave Buffalo a 5-4 win and cut the Flyers series lead to 2-1. The Sabres would even the series with a 4-2 win in game four but the Flyers won game five and six to win their second consecutive Stanley Cup championship.

Some things to do on Memorial Day 2019 Buffalo include camping, fishing and golfing. Want to do something around Buffalo for Memorial Day 2019?

Kenmore's Memorial Day Parade is one of the largest in western New York. It takes place on Delaware Avenue, beginning in the Town of Tonawanda, continuing into the Village of Kenmore, and turning onto Lincoln Boulevard, ending at Elmwood Avenue. It features bands, service organizations, dance groups, and fire departments. Veterans and active members of the military are honored and thanked for their service to our country. Admission is \$5 per person (free for children 5 and under) and includes all rides and bounce houses. Tickets for this event can be purchased at Eventbrite. 10% of all ticket sales go to Totally Buffalo's Hope for the Holidays to help those in need in the community.



Ask Rusty - Worker Received **Overpayment Notice from Social Security**

Dear Rusty: I have a problem with Social Security. They told me if I went over the annual earned income limit they would withhold \$1 for every \$2 I went over. But they did not tell me about the monthly rule for the first year of retirement and now they want *\$13,000. I am a part time* bus driver with irregular hours and cannot afford this. Can you help? Signed: Feeling Wronged by SS

Dear Feeling Wronged: The so-called "first year rule" is one which surprises many who claim benefits early and continue to work. That rule says that if your monthly income, in your first year after your benefits start, exceeds a certain limit (\$1470 in 2019), you are not entitled to SS benefits for that month. In your specific situation there are two things in play that I suggest you focus

First, you should immediately request a repayment plan on the grounds that you cannot afford to repay the entire amount right away and that forfeiting your benefits until the \$13,000 is repaid will result in a hardship for you. Although the Overpayment Notice you received asked you to refund the money within 30 days, it also suggested repayment options if you cannot afford to do so. I recommend you contact Social Security immediately to arrange a repayment plan which is affordable for you. You can do this by submitting form SSA-632, which you can find at this link: https:// www.ssa.gov/forms/ssa-632.pdf. Be aware that if you don't get a favorable initial response from your first contact with Social Security, you have the right to appeal at several levels, including a review of your case by an independent Administrative Law Judge. But please note that it might take up to 60 days for Social Security to complete your repayment plan request. If you do not get action within that timeframe you should contact them again to determine your status.

since Social Security informed you of the annual

form you of the rule which limits your monthly in-

come in your first year of early retirement, you may also have grounds to request a waiver of the entire overpayment. Social Security's own rules state that if your overpayment was caused by misinformation received from Social Security, you may be found "without fault" for any overpayment in your first year of early retirement. You may even want to download Social Security's own rules on this topic, which you can access at this link: https:// secure.ssa.gov/poms.nsf/ lnx/0202250061. The onus will be on you to prove that the overpayment occurred as a result of misinformation supplied by Social Security, and you will need the name of the person(s) who supplied the incorrect information as well as the date and time. And as with all contact you have with the Social Security Administration, you should keep a complete written record of each transaction. In resolving this issue, you can and should use the appeals process if necessary, and you may even want to consider asking your on your behalf.

The Jimmy Collins Tournament

Buffalo's history with Baseball goes back further than both the Bills and Sabres combined. Here's a brief example of how the City was home to Hall of Fame player Jimmy Collins, who played for Buffalo in 1893 and 1894 before joining the Boston Beaneaters. Born in Buffalo in 1870, Collins helped lead the then Boston Americans to a World Series victory in 1903 over Pittsburgh. He was inducted into the Baseball Hall of Fame in 1945 after a 14 year playing career with a lifetime batting average of .294 with 65 homeruns and 983 RBI's as a third baseman for a club that soon changed their name to the Red Sox.




