

# Sabres Swedes Shine in Early Games

The Sabres have shown a great deal of interest in Swedish players. Looking at early season results it's apparent that interest has paid off. The Sabres opened with two wins and an overtime loss for a 2-0-1 record. (Wednesday nights game four against Montreal took place after this story went to press.)

Rasmus Dahlin currently sits tied for third in NHL scoring with five points (1-4-5) in three Three assists games. have come on the power play. He also has an outstanding plus four which is the fourth best ranking in the league. Compare this to Jack Eichel's minus one ranking to see who is driving the teams early season success. Dahlin will eventually become the teams top

player surpassing Eichel. That transition may have already begun.

Victor Olofsson has scored three goals in three games, all on the power play, along with one assist for four points. He is 12th overall in NHL individual scoring. While Olofsson has been

playing left wing on the top line with Jack Eichel and Sam Reinhart their five on five play has been unproductive. Eichel has not produced any five on five points. All of his scoring has been on the power play and came in the same game, the 7-2 victory against New Jersey on October fourth.

The Sabres power play has carried the team so far with a league leading six man advantage goals on ten power plays for a 60% success rate. This is unsustainable production and the teams five on five play must begin to produce some offense at even strength or the teams early season success will come to a rapid halt.



# West Side Gangs, Three

I will continue my trilogy of encounters with gangs on the West Side of Buffalo. The incidents happened back in the sixties while trying to raise my family of eight children. Let me say that I was born and raised on the West Side and loved growing up there. I expected it would be the same for my kids as it was full of ever so friendly neighbors. But in any neighborhood there is always change. New people move in and older people either pass away or move out. I still thought it was worth sticking it out as most of the neighbors were good to talk and associate with. Even with a lot of the new ethnic groups moving in as the Beta gang. In my first column I told about my confrontation with the leader of that gang about a remark made toward a member of my family.

That, although somewhat tense at the moment, turned out ok. In the second column I was actually on the side of this same gang as they seemed to be trying to do some good for the area. Of course, if you read the column you know that turned into a disaster. It resulted in a riot with riot police confronting a crowd of mostly just ordinary people. If you missed either column and are interested you can find them online at BuffaloRocket.com. This week I will tell about the scariest of all the West Side Gangs encounters.

This one I was a little more concerned as I thought my family was in danger. It started with our family having supper at our dining room table. This was an event in itself as there were ten of us. Without any warning we heard someone calling me from in front of our

house. "Hey Mister G, come on out as the Puerto Ricans are here". My wife and children pleaded with me to ignore it as they knew what my reaction would be. I did ignore it for about five minutes as they continued to call me out. I peeked out the front window and saw about ten young men and a few women calling me out. Now for the life of me I had no idea what this was all about. Obviously this group was upset with something I said or did. My first thought was to go out and confront them and see what the problem was. Just imagine sitting having supper and have a gang out in front of your house with the intentions of doing you bodily harm? My family insisted that I first call the police. So I did call and explained that a gang was calling me out in front of my house. There were about ten of them and seemed upset about something. Now you would think that would warrant some kind of quick response from the men in blue. After waiting about ten minutes and this group still mingling in front of my house, I went out to put an end to it, or me,




Our home on 15th street. Small fence in front caused the controversy.

one way or the other. I walked out into the middle of this assemblage of young people, the leader wearing a Karate shirt. Fortunately, I stood almost a foot taller than most of them and loading boxcars earlier in life left me kind of well built. I think this may have influenced their thinking and what happened next. I will admit that I was apprehensive and maybe a little up tight. I figured the police should arrive soon, or so I thought. The leader then came face to face with me and said, "I hear you do not like Puerto Ricans and do not want us in the neighborhood". So I asked were this came from? Seemed earlier in the day the young girl next door had one of her frequent male visitors. I had constructed a fence in front between one side of my house and the house next door. It was rental property and always had new neighbors so I found a fence was necessary. In any case one of these male visitors leaned against the fence and pushed it in. I was not too happy about this

and made it clear I was upset.

My comment was taken the wrong way as I told him I did not want his kind around my house. He promptly went back and told his group I was unhappy with their influx into the neighborhood. The leader of this group repeated what he had heard I said. I confirmed that I did say that and did not want anyone who is going to destroy my property, no matter who they are or where they are from, near my house. He turned and glared at the fellow who had broken the fence and said, "Why did you not tell me you did damage to this man's house?" The question was followed with a hard push to the kid. He turned and apologized to me for the inconvenience to me and my family and left. Whew!!! About a half hour later the doorbell rang. It was the police responding to my call. I explained what had happened and said I could have been hamburger by now. They said they answer calls of priority first. Guess they knew I could handle myself.

# Ask Rusty - Understanding the Family Maximum

Dear Rusty: My husband passed away when our children were 3 and 5 years old. I received benefits for myself, our two children and my 14-yearold son from a previous relationship. When my 14-year-old son turned 18, the amount he received stopped and was added to ours, keeping the total family amount the same. Then in July of this year my youngest daughter turned 16 so I fell off with that amount now going to my kids. Again, the total family amount stayed the same - \$625.00 each for my daughter and son. The very next month in August, my youngest son turned 18 so of course, he fell off. I called Social Security and the representative said that she couldn't guarantee that my son's full amount will go to my daughter. It turns out that none did, decreasing the family amount by \$625.00. My question is why was the family amount reduced when she still has 2 years before she turns 18? Signed: Confused Survivor

Dear Confused: I understand your confusion let me clarify what happened in your situation: Social Security (SS) sets a "Family Maximum" amount, which is the most all eligible family members combined can receive from a worker's (your husband's) record. SS uses a rather complex formula to compute the Family Maximum amount, but it comes out to be somewhere between 150% and 180% of your husband's "primary insurance amount" (or "PIA," what he was entitled to when he passed). The family maximum is in effect whenever there are multiple beneficia-

ries on a worker's record. The benefits you were personally receiving were "child in care" benefits which entitled you, as a surviving spouse with a minor child, to collect 75% of the benefit your husband was receiving, or entitled to receive, at his death. Child in care benefits stop when the youngest child reaches 16 years of age. Each of your 3 minor children were also entitled to receive 75% of their deceased father's (or stepfather's) benefit amount. Minor children can receive 75% of the deceased parent's benefit until they reach 18 years of age (or 19 if still in high school). However, all benefits are subject to the "family maximum." The total of benefits paid to all survivors of the deceased is limited to that family maximum and, if that amount is reached, all eligible survivors share equally in that family maximum amount. Then as each survivor becomes ineligible due to their age, the remaining survivors each receive a proportional share of the family maximum amount, but that adjustment cannot result in an individual's benefit being more than they are otherwise entitled to (their maximum individual benefit of 75% of your husband's PIA).

When your oldest son turned 18 and became ineligible, the sum of benefits due all remaining survivors was still more than the family maximum, so the family maximum amount was equally divided among the remaining eligible survivors. Then, when your eligibility for child-in-care benefits ceased when your youngest turned 16, your two remaining

minor children each received either a) their equal share of the family maximum, or b) 75% of their father's PIA (their normal entitlement as a surviving minor child). When your youngest son turned 18 and became ineligible, your youngest daughter was then eligible to receive only her full benefit as a minor surviving child (75% of your husband's benefit), which she can continue to receive until she is 18 (or 19 if still in high school). So, as you can see, the family maximum isn't an amount which is fully available to any survivor, it is an amount that restricts the total amount which can be paid to all when there are multiple eligible survivors.

Please note that at age 60 you are once again eligible for a surviving spouse benefit, which will be based upon 100% of the benefit your husband was entitled to at his death, subject, of course, to normal reductions and earnings restrictions for claiming benefits before your full retirement age.




