Halloween Safety



Kids love the magic of Halloween: Trick-or-treating, classroom parties and trips to a neighborhood haunted house. But for moms and dads, often there is a fine line between Halloween fun and safety concerns, especially when it comes to road and pedestrian safety.

In 2017, 7,450 pedestrians died in traffic or non-traffic incidents, according to Injury Facts. Non-traffic incidents include those occurring on driveways, in parking lots or on private property.

NSC research reveals almost 18% of these deaths occurred at road

crossings or intersections. Lack of visibility because of low lighting at night also plays a factor in these deaths.

Here's a scary statistic: Children are more than twice as likely to be hit by a car and killed on Halloween than on any other day of the year. In *Continued on page six.*

Defense is Key For Sabres Success

The key to the Sabres success this season is their commitment to laying defense. The team plays a defense first style, according to former player and current TV analyst Rob Ray. Coach Ralph Krueger has a standing order for his team, If you turn the puck over in the attacking zone you must beat the puck back to your own blue line, then identify your responsibility and go to it. Ray says that he has never seen this team work so hard to get back to their own end.

Before this season the Sabres have had five shutouts in their previous 193 games. This season, the team has had three whitewashes in twelve games.

The team is consistently hustling back and setting up, the defense clears people from out from the front of the net, takes them into the glass skates through would be shooters to take the puck away. Jake McCabe leads the NHL with 34 blocked shots in 13 games.

The biggest beneficiary from Ralph Kruegers

defensive system is Jack Eichel. While he is still a minus player (7-10-17 -2 in 13 games), he has shown a heightened interest in the defensive game. His lollygagging on line changes and back-checking is a thing of the past as he comes back hard into his own end and clogs passing lanes and open ice the way a defender should.

The Sabres rank fifth with a plus 11 goal differential. They are fifth

in goals scored at 3.3 per game but have dropped to eleventh in goals allowed at 2.38 per game. The team has been trending in the wrong direction lately, surrendering big shot totals in recent games. They were outshot 41-25 at Detroit in a 2-0 victory on October 25th and 44-26 at the Keybank Center on October 28th against the Arizona Coyotes in a 3-2 shootout loss. You won't win many games in the NHL by allowing 40+ shots. The 9-4 (9-2-2) Sabres have two wins and two losses (2-1-1) in four games where they allowed 44, 43, 41 and 44 shots. In their other nine games they have allowed an average of 24 shots against. There is reason to be concerned about their ability to stay at the top of the league unless they can drastically cut down the shots against.

In Search For Our Roots

Almost everyone has at one time or another thought about their roots and where and how they ended up where they are. What is their ancestry? What is their genealogy. More and more people are searching for the answers. I just sent in my 23 and me, DNA test, to see what happened way, way, back when. I know my father's side immigrated from Ireland and my mothers side came across from Sicily. My son had his 23 and me DNA done, and it goes way back. Back further than Ireland and Sicily. Her exhausting research paid off as she not only found the little town that my grandmother, Madeline Zanghi, came from, but the actual house she grew up in. This was before getting married and leaving her home for a new life in America. She visited the mentioned house and the little old man living there thought she came to repossess it. After convincing him that was not the case, she was allowed entry. What a wonderful accomplishment. She found relatives of the Zanghi clan and she was treated like a long-lost member of the family. They even pointed

out Frank's house. She walked the same streets, bought food at the same markets, saw the same mountains and streams as her great grandmother. This is the dream of so many descendants of immigrants, to experience what our ancestors experienced. To wonder why anyone would leave such a beautiful place and go through what they did to find a new life in the United States. You must wonder why. Through social media my daughter was able to send dozens of pictures of her visit. They are awesome. It is like we are there with her. I thank Facebook for the ability to do that. At the time of this writing, her stay in Sicily is over and it is on to Ireland. She departed Sicily from Palermo the largest city near our little town of Montemaggiore. While in Palermo she visited the port where my grandparents boarded a ship and

left their homeland, as it turned out, forever. Trying to re-live and understand the reason for the hardship endured on the trip across the Atlantic with few belongings and nothing more than hope. It is hard for us to understand as we have never been hungry. Having to worry about having the basic things in life, food, shelter and clothing. Somehow here, one way or another it is always there for us. Even more so now than in past generations. So, it is hard for us to understand why the journey as we do not have a grasp of their daily suffering. For what other reason could there be for leaving your homeland. I would think that would be the answer. I have only one thing to say. I am so glad they did, and I thank them for taking the risk and making me an American. God bless my ancestors and God bless America.

Ask Rusty- Does My Husband's Federal Pension Affect Benefits?

Dear Rusty: My husband retired at his full retirement age of 66. He qualified for Social Security but also qualified for Civil Service Retirement System (CSRS). Being so, he falls under the Windfall Offset Provision, and subsequently had his Social Security benefit reduced from around \$900 to \$450. His full CSRS benefit is \$3,400. I have not claimed my Social Security benefit, but I expect it to be around \$2000 at my full retirement age of 66 in November. At my full retirement age could I collect half of his benefit and let mine grow until age 70? Or upon filing, am I forced to take my full benefit instead? If I can take half of his benefit, would it be half of his full benefit or half of the reduced benefit? Also, upon claiming my benefit, would my husband be entitled to claim half, and thus increase what he is currently receiving on his own benefit? In addition, upon my death, would my husband qualify for my full Social Security benefit or is he subject to offset by the Windfall Offset or Government Pension Offset? Signed: Confused About SS

Dear Confused: Because of your husband's CSRS pension, his own Social Security benefit is reduced by the Windfall Elimination Provision (WEP), and any spousal benefit he may be entitled

to will be affected by the Government Pension Offset (GPO). Both WEP and GPO are provisions which affect anyone with a pension from employment which did not participate in the Social Security program.

GPO is the more severe of these two provisions, because it reduces any spousal (or survivor) benefit your husband might be entitled to by 2/3rds of his CSRS pension, which means that he will not be able to get a spousal benefit from you when you apply (2/3rds of his CSRS pension is more than he would get as a spousal benefit). You, on the other hand, will be eligible (at your full retirement age, or "FRA," of 66) to file a "Restricted Application for Spousal Benefits Only", which will give you half of his WEP-reduced Social Security benefit (about \$225/month). You are eligible to use the restricted application because you were born before January 2, 1954 (those born after January 1, 1954 cannot use this option). By doing so, you can collect a spousal benefit from your husband while allowing your own SS retirement benefit to grow by 8% per year of delay (2/3rds of 1% per month of delay) up until you are 70 years of age, when your benefit amount will be 32% more than it would be at age 66. But when you claim your benefit

at age 70 your husband's spousal benefit won't be based on your increased amount, but rather upon your FRA benefit amount of \$2000, which means he still won't get a spousal benefit due to the Government Pension Offset.

Finally, if you should predecease your husband, the GPO will also affect his survivor's benefit, which is based upon

100% of what you were receiving at your death (not on your FRA benefit). So, using the numbers you provided, if your FRA benefit would be about \$2000 your age 70 benefit will be about \$2640 (not including COLA increases). Since 2/3rds of your husband's CSRS pension is \$2268, he'd normally be entitled to the difference \$372) as his survi-

vor's benefit. But since that amount is less than his own WEP-reduced SS benefit, he won't get a survivor's benefit. As you may be aware, the Federal CSRS plan has been replaced by the Federal Employee Retirement System (FERS) which participates in Social Security, so WEP and GPO do not apply to those who retire under FERS.

2017, October ranked No. 2 in motor vehicle deaths by month, with 3,700. July is No. 1, with 3,830 deaths.

Costume Safety

To help ensure adults and children have a safe holiday, the American Academy of Pediatrics has compiled a list of Halloween safety tips. Before Halloween arrives, be sure to choose a costume that won't cause safety hazards. All costumes, wigs and accessories should be fire-resistant. Avoid masks, which can obstruct vision. If children are allowed out after dark, fasten reflective tape to their costumes and bags, or give them

glow sticks. When buying Halloween makeup, make sure it is nontoxic and always test it in a small area first. Remove all makeup before children go to bed to prevent skin and eye irritation.

When They're on the Prowl A responsible adult should accompany young children on the neighborhood rounds. If your older children are going alone, plan and review a route acceptable to you. Agree on a specific time children should return home. Teach your children never to enter a stranger's home or car. Instruct children to travel only in familiar, well-lit areas and stick with their friends. Tell

your children not to eat any treats until they return home. Children and adults are reminded to put electronic devices down, keep heads up and walk, don't run, across the street.

Safety Tips for Motorists

NSC offers these additional safety tips for parents and anyone who plans to be on the road during trick-or-treat hours: Watch for children walking on roadways, medians and curbs. Enter and exit driveways and alleys carefully. At twilight and later in the evening, watch for children in dark clothing. Discourage new, inexperienced drivers from driving on Halloween.
