Sabres Stumble Before Heading To Sweden

With one regulation win in their last five games the Sabres early season success has faded into the rearview mirror. They have been outscored by a wide margin 16-7 in their last five games, losing 6-2 at the New York Rangers, winning 2-0 at Detroit, losing to Phoenix 3-2 in overtime at the Keybank center, then losing 6-1 against Washington and 1-0 to the New York Islanders in Buffalo.

Their frustrations extend to both sides of the puck. Their defense was unable to stop the offensive power of the Capitals. The Sabres have failed to score more than two goals during this stretch. Their offense was unable to penetrate the stifling defensive play of the New York Islanders in a 1-0 loss in downtown Buffalo. After the Isles took an early 1-0 lead on a fluke goal, the Sabres consistently shot wide against the visitors because the shooting and passing lanes were defended by perfectly positioned opponents.

The offense has dried up because the team has not put forth the defensive effort like they did during their first ten games. Their strong defensive play had directly led to offensive success. Against the Rangers Buffalo had five blocked shots against 22 for New York so it's easy to see which team wanted the win more. In the win against Carter Hutton was strong in the nets as Detroit outshot Buffalo 41 - 25. Phoenix outshot Buffalo 44-26. You will not win many games in the NHL when you give up more than 40 shots.

Leading scorer Jack Eichel had only three points combined over these five games, a big dropoff as compared to 14 points in his first ten games. He now has 17

points in 15 games. The next highest scorer is Rasmus Dahlin with 11 points. The teams top scorers are all on the wrong side of the plus/ minus stats, Eichel in -5, Dahlin -4, Sam Reinhart -3 and Victor Olafsson at -4. While many progressive thinkers scoff at the value of the plus minus stats it remains as a valid accounting of a players success during even strength play. Winning teams are loaded with plus players while losing team are replete with minus players. The Sabres are trending in the wrong direction here and need to re-establish their commitment to strong defensive play. Their two games against the Tampa Bay Lightning in Stockholm Sweden this Friday and Saturday as part of the NHL's Global Series present an opportunity to get back on track against a Tampa Bay team that has not been as strong as last season when they led the NHL in points.

Northwest Buffalo Beat

Kiwanis Pediatric Trauma Center

Back when I was a member of the North Buffalo Kiwanis Club, NW division of New York state district, it was our goal to raise one million dollars to add a Pediatric trauma center to Buffalo's Children's Hospital. A lofty chore for a rather small group of dedicated people who had other obligations and lives to lead. I won't go into details here on how we did it, but one way or another we were able to do it. We raised half of the million and the other half was matched by the Wente Foundation. We still were able to name it after Kiwanis

Before this, the nearest Pediatric trauma center was in Boston, Massachusetts. Pediatric trauma centers are geared for children. Emergency rooms before ours was built were

this did was provide a trauma center designed for adolescents, without the long wait and equipment specifically made to address adults. In any case we accomplished it and had the first Kiwanis Pediatric Center in Western New York.

I had a personal interest in this project as being the father of eight children, the emergency room at the hospital was like a second home. So many times, we had the occasion to rush one of our little ones to the ER for one reason or another. The frustrating thing about any ER is the long wait, as we all know. It seems even longer when you have a screaming crying child to deal with. We had that happen more than once.

A few of the events I re-

er years was the need for treatment immediately. I recall my eldest daughter having a bean in her ear. There was a song about someone not being able to hear as they had a bean in their ear. Kind of cutesy. So one day she put a bean in her ear and sang the song, "I can't hear you I have a bean in my ear" We all laughed and thought it was funny till we found out she did have a bean in her ear. As we tried to remove the bean, it just went in further and further. It then became hurtful and she panicked and so did we. Off to the ER with her screaming in pain and crying. The doctor there used a water pick to somehow pop it out to the relief of everyone.

Another time my boys were playing baseball out back when the ball went on the roof of the garage next door. It was a concrete garage and the wall went straight up with a flat roof. The wall was higher than the roof so there was a lip. They decided to get the ball as we had no ladder, they needed a strategy. decision was to tie a rock to a clothesline and toss it over the lip. Then climb

but the rock would need to be heavier than the person climbing the rope. They managed to get the rock up over the lip and thought that it was secure. One tug on the rope and the rock flipped over the lip and came down on my son's head.

The boys panicked as there was a lot of blood. So, my one son goes in the house to tell my wife. He calmly told her his brother was not feeling so good. She goes out to check on him. The blood looks worse than it was but with that it was off to the ER again. It did look

worse than it was, and some stitches stopped the bleeding and some baby aspirin helped with the headache.

There were numerous other times with broken arms, deep cuts, and just plain serious illnesses. With that in mind, when the opportunity came to contribute some time to build this trauma center, I was all for it. It did take years to raise that much money, but we did it and accomplished something that helped the community. Unfortunately, it was completed after my children had all matured.



Ask Rusty - Should I Claim Benefits at Age 67 if I'm Working?

Dear Rusty: My wife and I were talking to some other senior citizens who say it would be more beneficial to start drawing social security when I turn 67 next year, rather than wait till 70, even if I work full time. Can I do that? Signed: Working Senior

Dear Working Senior: Yes, you can do that, but it may not be your best strategy. Let's explore your options:

If your wife is already collecting Social Security on her work record, you might consider filing a "restricted application for spousal benefits only" and collect a spousal benefit from your wife, while continuing to delay your claim for your own benefit, thus allowing your benefit to continue to grow. You can do this because you were born before 1/2/1954, which is the cutoff date for filing in this manner. In this way you could collect 50% of the benefit your wife is entitled to at her full retirement age (FRA) until such time as you file for your own benefit. If you wait until age 70 to file for your own, your payment will be 24% more than it will be when you are 67. But you cannot use this option unless, or until, your wife is collecting her Social Security benefit from her own work record.

There is no simple answer to when you should claim. It depends upon your current financial needs, your current health and your anticipated longevity (considering your family history). If you anticipate a long healthy life and don't urgently need the money, then waiting until age 70 to claim your benefit will not only give you the highest possible monthly payment but also the most in lifetime benefits (assuming you live to at least the "average" age (84 for a man today). Waiting until 70 will also ensure that your wife gets the highest possible survivor benefit, should you predecease her (at her FRA, your surviving spouse gets 100% of the amount you were receiving at your death).

As for you working,

since you've reached your full retirement age you no longer need to worry about Social Security's "earnings test" which takes back benefits from anyone whose earnings exceed a certain limit. But it would be wise to consider that Social Security benefits are subject to Federal Income Tax (and, depending upon where you live, possibly a State income tax), so adding your Social Security income to your earnings from work could be an important tax consideration for you.

Člaiming your benefit at age 67 will give you a payment which is 8% more than you would have gotten at age 66. But if the factors discussed above suggest you should wait longer, then you'll earn an additional 8% for each additional year you wait to claim your benefit, up to age 70 when your maximum benefit is reached. What is the downside to waiting? Well, only that your wife, if she will be eligible

for a spousal benefit from you, cannot collect that spousal benefit until you start collecting your own benefit. Your wife's spousal benefit would be half of your age 66 benefit if she claims at her full retirement age.

So, as you can see, there is no easy answer to whether you should claim Social Security at age 67, but with the above information you should be able to make an informed decision. And here's one final suggestion: don't take Social Security advice from "armchair experts" and don't be swayed by those who might say "collect now because Social Security is going bankrupt." It's not. It's true that Congress needs to fix some portions of the program soon, and it's also true they've been dragging their collective feet to do so. But, historically, Congress has always stepped up to the task when they had to, and I'm confident they will eventually do so again.


