Salvation Army Red Kettle Campaign

The Salvation Army says this year's Red Kettle campaign got off to a slow start and the annual fundraiser is far behind where it should be at this point in the season. The financial support from the community during the holidays supports The Salvation Army's efforts to help more than 225,500 people in need across Upstate New York throughout the year.

Right now, The Salvation Army says it is 24% behind where it was

last year with indicators that the needs they work to meet are even greater. Sabres Record Is Deceiving

With a 16-12-7 record for 39 points the Sabres are second in the Atlantic division following a 5-3 loss in Toronto against the Maple Leafs Tuesday night. When adding the losses and OT losses added together this is actually a sub .500 record at 16-19.

In fact every team in the division is sub .500 with the exception of the first place Boston Bruins and the Tampa Bay Lightning. With 110 goals for and 108 against the Sabres are the definition of mediocrity. Score one, give up one. Win one

lose one.

The loss in Toronto left Buffalo one point ahead of the Leafs in the standings. The Sabres seemed like they weren't ready to start the game. Their forechecking was nonexistent. The players looked overwhelmed in their defensive zone as Leaf defenders Morgan Reilly and Tyson Barrie played like rovers penetrating deep into the zone on the attack generating scoring chances. Reilly finished the game at +4 and Barrie was +3. The Leafs cycled the puck successfully and dominated the Sa-

bres building a 3-0 lead after 40 minutes.

The Sabres finally woke up for the third period. Jack Eichel set up a power play goal by Rasmus Dahlin and scored from the wing to give him two points extending his point streak to 17 games. The scoring streak is the highlight of the season so far. In 17 games he has scored 16 goals and 31 points. Nathan McKinnon with 25 points and Connor MacDavid with 22 are the closest to Eichel during the streak. But the Sabres are 7-6-4 during this streak, or a sub .500 7-10, a losing record.

They need more from the rest of the team. More scoring and better defensive zone play. Better forechecking. Better goaltending. Because Eichel can't win games on his own. And he can't keep scoring forever.

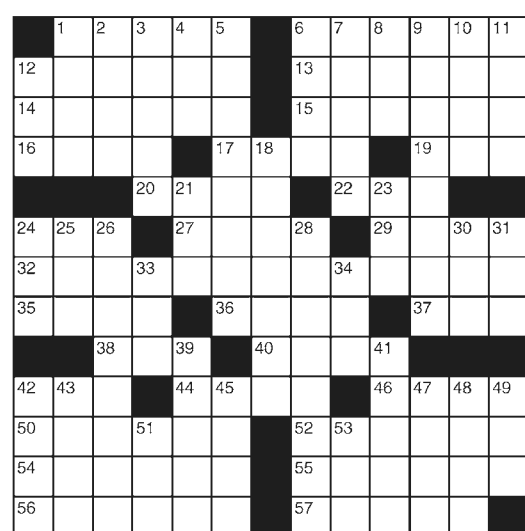

employment, unstable housing, and lack of education.

There are 5 fewer days this year for bell ringers to collect donations at the iconic Red Kettles, because of the late Thanksgiving. The State Commander, Major Ivan Rock, says that's a big part of the problem and a slow Red Kettle Campaign could lead to dire consequences.

Ask Rusty - How Can We Change Social Security's Earnings Limit?

Dear Rusty: How do we change the Social Security earnings cap amount? Do I need to go through my Congressman? Social Security is withholding my benefit because they say I earned too much. The system is very unfair! Signed: Disgruntled Worker

Dear Disgruntled: The Social Security earnings test has been a part of Social Security's rules and regulations since the original Social Security Act of 1935. In fact, benefits were originally paid only if someone was not working at all, and if a beneficiary worked after they started collecting, they lost all benefits. The law has undergone changes over the years to bring it to where it is today, which is to limit the amount of earnings someone can have while collecting Social Security prior to their full retirement age before taking back some benefits.

If the earnings limit is exceeded, and you have not yet reached your full retirement age, Social Security typically withholds your benefits until they recover what you owe for exceeding the limit. The limit is adjusted annually based upon changes to the National Wage Index, and the annual limit for 2020 is \$18,240, up from \$17,640 last year. There is also a "first year rule" which will subject those who haven't yet reached their full retirement age

and claim benefits mid-year to a monthly limit (1/12th of the annual limit) for the remainder of that year. The earnings limit increases significantly (by about 2.6 times) during the year you reach your full retirement age (FRA), and goes away entirely once your FRA is attained.

As you are probably aware, exceeding the limit will cause Social Security to take back \$1 for every \$2 you are over the limit, or if you're subject to the "first year rule" they will take back your entire benefit for any month you exceed the monthly limit. In the year you reach your FRA (but before your FRA) the "penalty" for exceeding the limit is less severe – \$1 for every \$3 over the limit. What you may not be aware of is that when you reach your full retirement age, Social Security will give you time credit for any months you did not receive benefits because you exceeded the earnings limit, and receiving that time credit at your FRA will result in your benefit being increased. For example, if, over the years before you reached your FRA, Social Security withheld 12 months of benefits due to you exceeding the earnings limit, when you reach your full retirement age Social Security will recalculate your benefit to account for those 12 months by changing your

claim date to 12 months later than when you actually applied. That will increase your benefit somewhat and, as a result, you may be able to eventually recoup some, or all, of the benefits which were withheld (depending upon your longevity).

How can we change the earnings cap? Well, the earnings limit already increases automatically each year with changes to the National Wage Index. But if you mean how can we eliminate it, I'm not optimistic that is possible since it would require full Congressional approval as well as Executive Branch approval to do so, and since Congress is now more focused on Social Security's broader issue of the Trust Fund being depleted in about 2035 (which will result in an across-the-board cut in benefits unless Congress acts sooner). Nevertheless, you should certainly feel free to bring your concerns about Social Security's "earnings cap" to the attention of your Congressional Representatives. Congressional Representatives are always willing to hear and understand the concerns of their constituents, and Social Security is very much a topic of discussion in Congress today.
