## Sabres Look Lost in Philly Without Eichel

With Jack Eichel scratched from the line-up 15 minutes before game time in Philadelphia against the Flyers all of the weaknesses of the Sabres lineup were laid bare. Without their scoring and spiritual leader Buffalo generated an anemic 17 shots on goal in a 6-1 loss.

The score was a fair indication of the efforts of the teams as the Flyers were easily better than the Sabres by a factor of six. Philadelphia put 26 shots on goal scoring three goals in the first and second periods for a 6-0 lead. At this point Buffalo had only nine shots on goal. It was really that bad.

Carter Hutton got the start in the nets because of his 4-1 career record against the Flyers. But his luck ran out as he continued his miserable season losing his 11th consecutive game. But it's not like it was his fault. His teammates played like low level minor leaguers. Three of the Flyers goals were knocked into the net or deflected off of Sabres players making them virtually unstoppable.

The Sabres gave up three power play goals on five chances. Buffalo ranks 29th in the league on the penalty kill with 28 goals allowed in 108 times short for a 74.3%. Only Winnipeg and Detroit have a worse record. It's well past time for the team to change up their

penalty killing strategy. On the bright side at least the game was played on the road so that Sabres fans didn't have to pay money and spend four hours of their day to endure the loss. After the game Rasmus Dahlin said the Sabres

played too soft. That's good to hear because a lot of introspection was needed after this game.

Victor Olafsson scored the only goal, his 15th of the season. He continues to lead all NHL rookies in scoring and is a top candidate for the Calder Trophy as rookie of the year.

On the 21st the Sabres defeated the LA Kings 3-2 t Keybank Center. A win was likely against a weak Kings team. Linus Ullmark blocked 25 shots to earn first star honors. He improved to 11-7-3 on the season and is 7-2-2 in his last 11 games. He has won all four of his career meetings with Los Angeles.

This was another game where Sabres forwards could not put a puck past an opposing goalie as defensemen Rasmus Ristolainen and Marco Scandella beat Kings netminder Jonathan Quick while Victor Olafsson scored an empty net goal with an assist from Jack Eichel. Eichel's assist gives him points in his last 18 games (16-16-32) although his NHL point streak is considered stopped because he missed the game in Philadelphia.

The Sabres are now 17-13-7 on the season and 11-3-3 on home ice. Olofsson has 24 points (10-14) in his last 22 games. He's on a six game point streak with four goals and four assists in that stretch. With two assists against LA Reinhart now has 10 points (3-7) in the Sabres' last nine games.
