

New Tiger at the Zoo



Please welcome Zhanna the Amur tiger to Western New York! As she gets used to her new surroundings we will make sure to let everyone know of a good opportunity to view her.

Zhanna the Amur tiger is the latest addition at the Buffalo Zoo. Zhanna is 11 years old and came to the Buffalo Zoo from the Bronx Zoo in Bronx, New York. The Association of Zoos and Aquariums recommended the Buffalo Zoo for Zhanna as part of the Tiger Species Survival Plan. “Zhanna will serve as an important ambassador to continue to educate our community about endangered species and what we can do to

help protect them,” said Norah Fletchall, President and CEO of the Buffalo Zoo. The Amur tiger is one of the largest cats in the world and it is estimated that fewer than 500 remain in the wild. Due to poaching, habitat loss, tiger-human conflict, and disease, Amur tigers are one of the most endangered animals on the planet. Found in Russia and neighboring regions of China, zoos like the Buffalo Zoo are

working together to raise awareness about wild tigers and help protect them. Zhanna’s arrival marks the return of the iconic species to Buffalo. In June 2019, Amur tiger Tamari passed away. Guests can see Zhanna at the Big Cat exhibit daily, but she may not always be visible as she becomes acclimated to her outdoor habitat. The Zoo is open daily from 10:00 am to 4:00 pm. Grounds close at 5:00 pm.

Evan Rodriguez and The Art of Timing

With injuries to the Sabres goal scoring wingers Victor Olafsson and Jeff Skinner, the team looked to fill those roster spots with NHL caliber players. Towards that end the team acquired winger Michael Frolik from the Calgary Flames.

What an opportunity this would have presented for Evan Rodrigueus who two weeks ago had reportedly let Sabres know he would like to be traded, according to Darren Dreger of TSN. Rodrigueus was scratched for the teams next game against Tampa Bay, last Tuesday on New Years eve. The next day he spoke with local media and confirmed that he is unhappy with his minimal role. "I'm a hockey player who wants to play hockey," he said. "I think that pretty much anyone out there will tell you the same thing. It's a job, it's a career. I just want to play hockey."

Rodrigueus averaged 10:42 of ice time and has just three assists in 24 games after playing 74 games last season when he scored nine goals and 29 points. He has been scratched from the line-up often starting from the first game and is clearly not valued highly by coach Ralph Krueger. Of course scoring a goal

now and then might help him to earn more ice time, Rodrigueus had no goals and only three points at the time. With a \$2 million salary there probably isn't much of a trade market for forwards who don't score goals although Edmonton supposedly has some interest.

He certainly had his chances in October when he played between 12 and 19 minutes in eight consecutive games. He sealed his fate with his play in back to back games against Minnesota and at Boston where he played 14:57 and 14:29, produced no points and only one shot on goal in each game and was a minus one. The next game at Florida he saw 40 seconds of ice time.

Krueger stated when

asked about the situation, "I can only speak to what is, and what is is we will end up with a group of players who really want to be here. We will work with the players who really want to be here and, quite clearly, play the players who really want to be here."

It's noteworthy that the Sabres signed tough guy Dalton Smith to a two way contract and dress him for his first NHL game rather than play Rodrigueus against Tampa Bay. Smith played only 1:26 and drew a two minute penalty before being waived and returned to the Amerks. He joined a small group of players with more penalty minutes than ice time in their NHL career. Playing Smith rather than the speedy skilled Rodrigueus doesn't represent playing your best lineup. But it did suggest that ERod may be skating out of Buffalo soon. Rodrigueus did aid his cause with a two goal game Sunday at Detroit against the woeful Red Wings, the NHL's worst team with 27 points in 47 games and owners of a -81 goal differential.

I object!

There is an old lawyer joke. Why do they bury lawyers 8 ft instead of 6 ft. Answer: cause down deep they are good guys. Now that does not mean that all lawyers are bad guys. Of course not. There are lots of good ones. Just hard to find them.

Obviously I have had some bad experiences with attorneys. Just a few cases and make your own summation. First a number of years ago a lawyer ran up an advertising bill in the Rocket for \$3500. When I went to collect he said, "Sue me." Chose to do that in what is known as small claims court. In order to proceed had to hire a lawyer. He was not free and the settlement in this case covered his fee. We ended up with nothing except spending time and money to get there. Distaste number one.

I did have a good lawyer for years who represented

me in house closing and a couple of accidents I had. Those settlements were nowhere near what are accepted today. He was good enough and seemed very caring and a friend. He may be the one excep-

tion. He had to retire early for health reasons. So the search for a new lawyer was on.

Found and hired a good attorney to do my will and some other small incidentals. We trusted his judgment as he really seemed to have it together and easy to work with. When we needed an attorney for a small business closing, he referred me to someone in his office as that was not his expertise. No problem with that as I had done this kind of closing many

times before and knew what was involved. It was a simple small business deal and we only met him once for a short time. Everything went smoothly until I received his bill. Unfortunately, the company paid the bill before I even saw it. He charged us \$300 an hour for 16 hours, \$4800.00. More than any house closing I have done. The \$300 is the going rate so no problem with that. I did ask for a breakdown of the hours as that was way too many for what



he had done. His answer was that there was none as the list was destroyed when the bill was paid. Now if you believe that, I have a bridge to sell you. The lawyer representing the seller of the business we were buying charged less than half. He had to

do most of the work. My lawyer who referred me to this fellow would not return my calls. Distaste number two.

Due to some really bad bookkeeping and a poor payroll company we fell behind with the IRS. We were looking for some relief as far as penalties and fees. Since none of it was our fault and we found the error and reported it, we thought there may be some forgiving. They claimed we were such good payers, they did not think there was a problem. Even the IRS agent assigned to collect agreed. She did what she could. Anything further would have to come from higher ups. Received no help there and some IRS people were downright nasty. No leeway was allowed or our case was not even considered.

So we hire an expert tax lawyer, supposed to be the best in the business. He looked it over and expressed his opinion that we had a good case and would work on it. He required a retainer of \$1500 which we thought was not that bad. After

many months and making our IRS payments on time and paying the full amount, we heard very little from this "expert." Finally the debt is fully paid, penalties and interest and anything else that went with it. So what did the tax lawyer do? They sent me another bill for \$2600. Now including the retainer the total comes to \$4100. For nothing. Not saying he did not try, but the bottom line is it was a waste. This firm accomplished absolutely nothing. He did take off \$600 so we ended up paying \$3500, again out of pocket for nothing.

You would think that him being the best in town, he would know ahead of time if he was going to be able to win something. Why try if you know you have no chance of winning. We were convinced he would get some relief. That did not happen. That makes me stupid. Distaste number three.

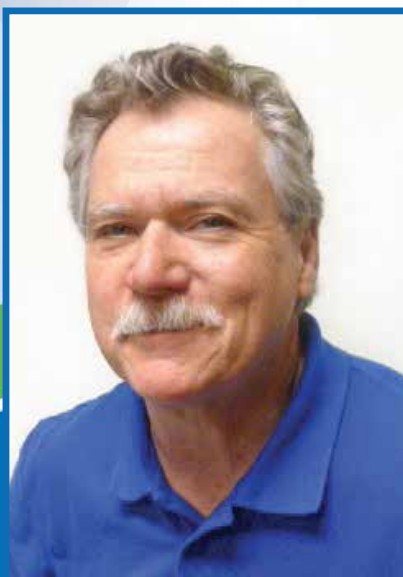

Ask Rusty - When Should I Claim My Widow's Benefit?

Dear Rusty: My husband passed away at the age of 52, and I was 53. I am currently 59. I've read about and been encouraged to file for widow's benefits from Social Security when I turn 60. My question is: does doing that impact when I should file for my regular Social Security benefits? In reading on any websites regarding my question, this never is addressed on what is best. Signed: Widowed Survivor

Dear Survivor: You have my sympathy for the loss of your husband at such a young age. I'll try to clarify your options for you. Provided you have not remarried you can claim your survivor benefit at age 60, but if you do it will be reduced by 28.5% from what it would be at your full retirement age (FRA) of 67. As long as you are explicit when claiming your survivor benefit that you are not also applying for your own Social Security benefit, there will be no negative impact to your eventual Social Security retirement benefit when you claim that. But, determining which benefit to take, and when, requires some thought.

Your goal should be to get the highest benefit possible for the rest of your life. To help you decide how and when to file, you should first see what your survivor benefit will be at your full retirement age (100% of what your

husband was entitled to at his death). If that amount is more than you are entitled to on your own at age 70 then you should consider waiting until age 67 (your FRA) to claim your widow's benefit, so you can get that higher survivor benefit for the rest of your life. Conversely, if your own age 70 benefit will be more than your widow's benefit at your FRA, then claiming your widow's benefit first and allowing your own benefit to grow until age 70 when it reaches maximum would be the more prudent choice. You can get estimates of both your survivor benefit and your age 70 retirement benefit by contacting Social Security. But if claiming the survivor benefit at age 60 is what you decide, or if you were to instead claim your Social Security retirement benefits early (e.g., age 62) there's more for you to consider.

If you are collecting any Social Security benefits before you reach your full retirement age (FRA) and you are still working, you will be subject to Social Security's "earnings limit" which restricts the amount you can earn before they take back some of your benefits (the earnings limit changes annually; for 2020 it is \$18,240). Up until the year you reach your FRA, they will take back benefits equal to one half of any earnings you have over the limit.

During the year you reach your FRA the limit increases by about 2.5 times and the penalty is less, and once you reach your FRA there is no longer a limit on your earnings. So, if you claim your survivor benefit at age 60 and are working, exceeding the earnings limit will result in you permanently losing some of your survivor benefits. If, instead, you claim your SS retirement benefit early (e.g., at age 62) you'll still be subject to the earnings limit until you reach age 67, but at your FRA they will give you time credit for any months you didn't get your retirement benefits and increase your benefit amount accordingly.

The important point to remember is that you have a choice of which benefit to take, and evaluating your options as described above should lead you to the right answer – whether you should claim your reduced survivor benefit at age 60, or to delay until it reaches maximum at age 67.
