Critical Type O Blood Shortage The American Red

Cross has extended its urgent call for donors of all blood types to give blood or platelets. With escalating influenza across the country and preventing some donors from giving, and winter weather threatening to cancel blood drives, the Red Cross now has a critical shortage of type O blood and urgently needs donors to restock the shelves.

Currently, the Red Cross has less than a three-day

supply of type O blood available for patient emergencies and medical treatments. Type O positive blood is the most transfused blood type and can be given to Rh-positive patients of any blood type. While just 7% of the U.S. population has type O negative blood, it can be transfused to patients with any blood type and is what hospital staff reach for during emergencies when there

isn't time to determine a patient's blood type.

Every day, the Red Cross must collect nearly 13,000 blood donations and more than 2,600 platelet donations for patients who rely on blood to survive. Shortfalls in donations can cause delays in essential medical care for patients like 12-year-old Dagan Haw-

all star game. On January 24th 1978, the 31st NHL all star game was held at the Memorial Auditorium. Two Sabres,

Gilbert Perreault and Rick Martin, played for the Wales Conference.

Both players delighted their hometown fans by scoring with Martin tying the game with 1:39 remaining in regulation time and Perreault scoring the game winning goal 3:55 into overtime to defeat the Campbell Conference 3–2. Gilbert Perreault's goal was the first ever all star game OT winner.



Scary Drive Home

How many remember what happened 43 years ago in Buffalo? To refresh your memory those who where here recall the most famous blizzard of all. The unforgettable Blizzard of January 27th 1977. It was a day that will live in infamy. One that left us helpless and cold for over a week. We survived as many of us tough Western New Yorkers are used to doing. What's a little snow? Usually not much but this was a bit more than a little. Problem with that day was the snow had been piling up for weeks before, and there was no place to put it anymore. Each time we had an early snowstorm that year, it stayed cold enough for it to not melt, and it just accumulated. Not that it snowed that much the day of the blizzard, there was just no place to push

it out of the way anymore. There was so much previous snow that some of the side streets had not yet been plowed before the blizzard hit, so as the conditions got worse they became un-useable. Those that tried to get home that day were un-successful and eventually had to abandon their vehicle or freeze. Leaving the street impassable to traffic. This happened all over Western New York.

As most of us that lived through it, we remember it well. We all have our stories to tell. At the time our shop was on Tacoma and we still lived on the West Side. The day started out as any other winter day, cold with snow. My wife worked as a volunteer at the YMCA on Delaware in the day care center. She called me and said the weather was getting so bad they

were calling the parents to come and pick up their kids. They were closing the "Y". By the time she was ready to be picked up it was really getting bad. I had a tough time getting from Tacoma to the "Y" on Delaware and conditions were going from bad to worse. Had two kids with us and my older daughter and her boyfriend in our 1975 Chevy station wagon. Big heavy car and we had a load, which was to our advantage. We had to plow through some deep snow to continue on. Many others were unable to do so.

The usual trip home would be Delaware to Forest then down Grant. Got as far on Delaware and Bedford only to find traffic completely stopped. Thought I would cut down Bedford over to Elmwood. Proceeded halfway down only to find it blocked and un-passable. This was a street that is divided down the middle. I saw no cars coming the other way so drove over the median to the other side and made it down the wrong way to Elmwood only to find that also clogged. Maybe Grant Street being less used would be passable.




Blizzard of '77 in Western New York.

Back tracked to Amherst and was able to make it to Grant. We found that slow moving and looked for shelter. We were at the corner of Grant and Amherst so pulled into the now demolished Roc-Mar Bowling alleys to wait it out. Some people did find shelter wherever and did not get home for a week. Had to live and sleep in the same clothes they were stranded in until traffic was able to move seven days later. I just wanted to get home. I stood by the Front door and watched the slow traffic pass by. Then I spotted a bus slowly traveling down Grant Street. Figured it must be moving if a bus was able to travel down it. We jumped in the car and followed that bus. It was slow going but it was going.

Our street 15th street had not been plowed and looked like a disaster, but there was no abandoned cars only deep snow. We had to go down one block, so stepped on the gas and slipped, slid and fish tailed our way down that one block knowing if I stopped or slowed down I was done. Made it home and we all applauded. This was a trip home to remember. However, being home was just the beginning. Who knew it was going to last a week.

was not working. We lit the kitchen stove which was gas for heat. We also had a fireplace that we had never used. We used it now. In fact we all slept in the room with the fireplace to keep warm.

What about food? My son was home from the Navy so there were seven of us in the house. We could walk to a corner grocery store but even they were running out of supplies as nothing was moving. The streets were all filled with abandoned cars and only the main drags were passable. No one was allowed out except emergency vehicles. Walking anywhere was an experience. Naturally the sidewalks were not shoveled as there was nowhere to throw the snow. The piles were so high just the top of the signs were showing. Eventually the electric came back on and slowly the street becomes clear. We were in a state of emergency so the National Guard came with heavy equipment to help remove the snow. They dumped it into the river and the parks. What they found in those parks when the snow melted is another story. I walked to work and was able to put out the Rocket on time that week. We made it through and have nothing but memories of that day in Western New York.







Ask Rusty - We Took Benefits Early; Can We Get More Now?

Dear Rusty: My birth date is 1947. My wife is 1950. We both took our Social Security years ago at age 62 due to health concerns because we questioned if we would live to age 78 to equalize the extra payout if we would have waited to age 66. Taking early at 62 may have been a mistake and I am wondering if there are any options available to maximize my and/or my wife's monthly payment with a restricted application or any other available options? My gross monthly is \$946.60, and my wife's is \$543.60 before the deduction for Medicare. Together our gross monthly is about equal to the per person individual average monthly payment of \$1479. Signed: Regretful we took SS early.


Dear Regretful: I'm afraid the options for either you or your wife increasing your benefit at this point are extremely limited. You cannot file the restricted application you mentioned because that can only be done by someone applying for the first time (and who was born before 1/2/1954), and only by someone who has not yet reached age 70. Neither can you suspend your benefits to earn delayed retirement credits (DRCs) because DRCs are only earned up to age 70. Your wife has a very small window until she reaches 70 in March during which she could suspend her benefits, and by doing so immediately she could perhaps earn, at most, an additional 1% in DRCs (about \$5 more per month). That leaves only two other things which could increase your benefits: 1) Annual Cost of

Living Adjustments (CO-LAs) granted each year depending upon inflation, and 2) returning to work and having substantial current earnings which may replace the earnings in a lower-earning year in your lifetime work record (SS uses the highest earning 35 years over your lifetime to compute your benefit amount).

If you have some years in that 35-year history with no or very low earnings, working now could replace one or more of those years. I have no way of determining whether that is a possibility; you would need to get your lifetime earnings record from Social Security and see if that is possible by examining your earnings for each year over your lifetime. But remember, all early years of earnings are adjusted for inflation, so for example, \$10,000 earned in 1990 would be equal to about \$25,000 in today's dollars, and you'd need to earn more than the higher amount to have any effect on your benefit.

I wish I had better news for you, but the unfortunate reality is that once someone claims their Social Security, the benefit amount is quite fixed.

Although it's possible to withdraw an application within 12 months of initial filing, and it's also possible to suspend benefits once FRA is reached, neither of those is available to you. And your wife only has a very short window to suspend her benefits, which will reach maximum when she reaches 70 in March. So, except for the COLA increases and returning to work options I've discussed above, I'm afraid you have no other opportunity to increase your Social Security benefit amounts.


