

## Safety Tips For Pets



**Keep your pet safe from the harsh bitter cold.**

You know it's coming. Cold weather! So please take every precaution in ensuring you dogs and cats are only outdoors for very short periods of time with your supervision! Other basic cold weather tips include: Keep a tight leash and never let your dog off the leash on snow

or ice, especially during a snowstorm. Pets frequently lose their scent on snow and ice, especially if snow is falling at a fast rate, and your pet can easily lose his sense of direction. Pets may also panic during a snowstorm and run away; many pets are lost during

the winter months. Remember to keep current identification on your pet at all times! Never leave your pet alone in a car during cold weather. A car can act as a refrigerator in the winter, holding in the cold. Your pet could literally freeze

to death. Leave your pet at home where they are safe. Thoroughly wipe off your pet's legs and stomach when she comes in and out of the rain, snow or ice. Check her sensitive foot pads, which may be bleeding from snow or ice encrusted in them. Your pet may also pick up salt and other chemicals on her feet accidentally. These chemicals could hurt her if she swallows them while licking her feet. Check cars for cats during the winter, stray or neglected cats outdoors sometimes sleep under the hood of the car where it's warm and comfortable. If you start the motor, cats could get caught in or flung about by the fan belt, causing serious injury or death. To pre-

vent this, bang loudly on the hood and sides of your car before turning on the ignition to give the cat a chance to escape. Take your dog outside only for as long as it takes for him to relieve himself. Dogs, particularly small, short-haired breeds like Chihuahuas and terriers, suffer from the cold despite their seemingly warm fur coats. Your pet runs the chance of catching a cold when wet, especially in cold weather so. If you absolutely must bathe your pet, consult a professional groomer or veterinarian. Limit the clipping of your pet's hair in the cold winter months, keeping your pet as warm as possible. Brush your pet daily in lieu of clipping to keep your pet's coat healthy,

shiny, clean and mat-free. Make sure your pet has a warm place to sleep far away from outside drafts. Speak to your veterinarian about increasing your pet's supply of food, particularly protein, to keep his fur thick and healthy through the winter months. Inquire about vitamin and oil supplements. ANTIFREEZE IS POISON TO PETS: antifreeze, even in small doses, is a lethal poison for dogs and cats! Because of its sweet taste, animals are attracted to it. Be sure to clean up spills thoroughly and consider switching to an animal-friendly antifreeze. Ensure that, if you store Antifreeze in a garage, shed, or other places accessible to your pets, it is well out of pets' reach.

The “snow birds” are heading south to sunshine, warmer weather, the absence of snow and cold and longer days. Mostly the older generation as shoveling the white stuff is no longer fun or energizing. Residents of the northeastern part of the US and lots of Canadians prefer the state of Florida as their winter residence. Please do not refer to them as the “lucky ones” as it takes years of planning to accomplish this feat. We (as I am one of them) all have to pretty much take the same routes. All the major highways seem to come together on I-95 which runs down the east coast into Florida. You could imagine what that is like in December.

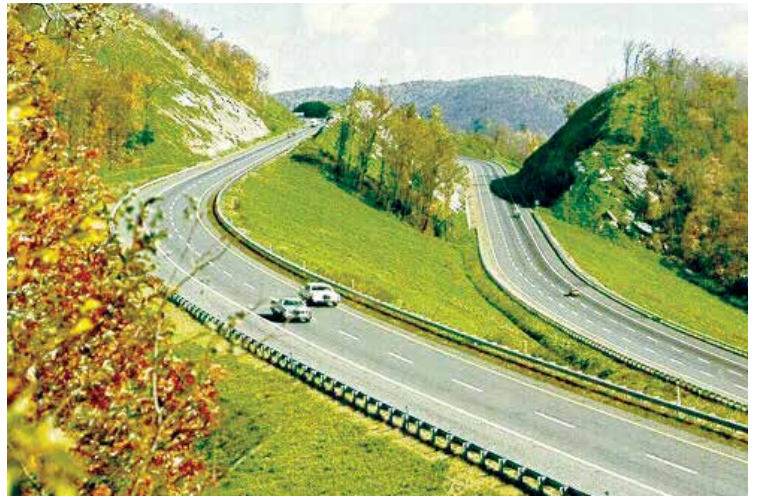
East coast city people

like NYC, Boston, etc take I-95 direct. Those from the more western states like Wisconsin, Indiana, Ohio, and even Western New York merge on to the I-77. We have to travel down the I-79 first. Ugh! Worst part of the trip especially in the winter, is through the mountains of West Virginia. The mountains are so high; they dug long tunnels through them instead of having to climb over or go around. These roads are loaded with 18 wheelers and RV's lugging up these steep inclines, struggling at lower speeds just to make it to the top. Then the trucks have to slip into low gear to stop from running away on the decline. There are even ramps for runaways! Getting through these mountains is an experience in itself. Finally you go through a small section of Virginia then one more tunnel and

it seems once you see the light at the end, you are going downhill into North Carolina. The rest of the trip is flat and gets warmer and greener as you go further south.

Made the trip so many times, I did not even take a map this last time. My wife and I used to make it pretty simple. We had a daughter in West Virginia, brother in Columbia, South Carolina, sister in central Florida, all overnight stops and visits. Nice easy trip, except for bad weather leaving Buffalo. One time we left it was 2 degrees. Another time we broke down in Pennsylvania in 14 degree weather in the middle of nowhere in a brand new vehicle. That is another story.

My wife can no longer make the long drive and she has to fly. We still need a vehicle for transportation so I have decided to drive our van down. Fortunately my son does not mind driving and has offered the last two years to go with me. Last year we made it non-stop. Do not plan on doing that again. Left in the cold, drove through rain in the mountains and encountered severe fog in Flori-

da. Left at seven AM and arrived at our place at 4:30 AM next day. The last 300 miles was in the dark and fog on I-75. Fortunately there was no traffic at that time.



This year we left early morning, weather was decent, went through the mountains with some rain. We stopped in South Carolina at an inexpensive motel that must have been in the Green book. As we left in spite of good weather, everything in the north was bleak and brown. Some snow still on the ground. The further south we traveled things seemed to come alive. The sun was shining the trees started to have leaves, and finally in Georgia, palm trees. As expected the one section of route I-95 was bumper to bumper. Lots of slow moving RV's and trucks on the right with the outside of the two lanes moving about 80 miles an hour. Once you hit Georgia it opens up to three lanes in each direction and traffic really moves.

There is a huge welcome center when you enter Florida. They used to give out free orange juice but that was discontinued as the masses were so large. Once in Florida you have three choices as to how to get to the southern part. You can take highway I-95, east coast, I-75 west coast or travel right down the middle. These are secondary roads. We chose the latter. Not a good call. We must have seen every small city and every stop light in Florida. It took us two hours longer this way than had we taken the highway. We got to see more of the center of the state than we wanted to. Found out not all of Florida is million dollar homes. When we arrived it was still daylight and we were able to take a swim before dusk. Going back is less of a problem as the weather is always good in May and the days are longer. Still have four months before thinking about that. Meanwhile, swimming, golfing, fishing and enjoying the sun.

# Critical Need For Blood and Platelet Donors

The American Red Cross currently has a critical need for blood donors of all blood types – especially type O – and platelet donors to make an appointment now to give and help replenish the blood supply after the holiday weeks. Right now, the Red Cross has less than a three-day supply of type O blood. To help tackle the critical need, the Red Cross and NFL are working together to offer one lucky winner a trip to Super Bowl LIV in Miami.

During the weeks of Christmas and New Year's, about 500 fewer blood drives were hosted by volunteer sponsor groups than required to meet patient needs. Many groups postpone blood drives during the winter holidays when travel and holiday activities may make it challenging for many donors to give. In fact, AAA estimated that a record 115.6 million Americans traveled during the holiday period of Dec. 21 through Jan. 1.

## Ask Rusty - Can My Husband use the "Restricted Application?"

**Dear Rusty:** My question is about the "restricted application for spousal benefits only" I saw referenced in an article. I will turn 66 in February and have applied for my "full retirement benefit" and will continue to work full time. My husband turned 66 this month and has not yet applied for his benefits. According to the Social Security paperwork sent to us, I will receive about \$1900 a month and my husband, who is self-employed, would only receive \$500 to \$600. If my husband claimed "spousal benefits only" using the restricted application, would I still receive my \$1900 and he would receive 50% of that for an estimated total of \$2850? Doesn't seem to make sense to me! As you can see, we must be in denial of our age and are not knowledgeable about Social Security!! Signed: Inquisitive Senior

**Dear Inquisitive:** Based on the amounts you quoted in your email (which I assume were recent estimates from the

Social Security Administration), your husband should claim his own benefits this month and then claim his normal spousal benefit in February when your benefits start. Since your husband has already reached his full retirement age of 66, his spousal benefit will be the full 50% of the benefit you are entitled to when you reach your full retirement age in February.

Although your husband qualifies for and can submit a "restricted application for spousal benefits only" (as described in the article you read), there is little reason for him to do so because his own benefit, even if he delays claiming it until he is 70, will be less than his spousal benefit from your record. Instead, since his spousal benefit from you will be the highest amount he will ever be eligible for, he can just claim his own benefit first and then claim his regular spousal benefit to begin when your Social Security retirement benefit starts. Here's why:

If your husband's current benefit at his full retirement age (FRA) would be \$600 and he's not yet collecting, he could earn delayed retirement credits (DRCs) at a rate of 0.667 per month of delay (8% per year of delay). That will mean his own benefit would be 32% more at age 70 then he is now eligible for at his FRA, which means his maximum benefit on his own earnings record will be \$792/month (\$600 plus 32%).

The only reason to file the restricted application (for which he is eligible only because he was born before January 2, 1954) is to let his own benefit grow while he collects a spousal benefit, so he can switch to his own higher benefit later. But since his spousal benefit from you will be about \$950 - more than the maximum benefit he can get from his own record at age 70 - his most prudent choice would be to simply claim his own benefit now and apply for his normal spousal benefit to start when your SS benefit starts in February. No need for him to file the restricted application because his own benefit will never be higher than his spousal benefit. And just for complete clarity, your husband collecting his spousal benefit from you will not affect your own Social Security retirement benefit in any way.

million to almost 805 religious institutions statewide.  
Westminster Presbyterian Church in Buffalo was awarded a \$30,000 Sacred Sites Grant to help fund spire, roof repair and repointing. Westminster Presbyterian Church was designed in Italianate style by Buffalo architect H. M. Wilcox and constructed in 1858-1859 of yellow Milwaukee brick, with a limestone foundation and trim. The church substantially predates the neighboring turn-of-the-twentieth century mansions. Highly intact at the façade, the church is one of the few remaining mid 19th century buildings within the Delaware Avenue Histor-

ic District. The church complex also includes a restored Victorian stable, which houses the church preschool. Westminster Presbyterian Church reaches 2,500 people a year through community activities such as music programming, 12-step meetings, prison outreach, LGBT Bingo, senior programs, after-school programs, immigrant outreach, and a nursery school.  
St. John's Grace Episcopal Church in Buffalo was awarded a \$10,000 Sacred Sites Grant to help fund construction documents for slate and masonry restoration. St. John's Grace Episcopal Church was designed by the firm of renowned architect Bertram G. Goodhue and completed

in 1925, after Goodhue's death in 1924. The complex consists of a long, gable-roof single aisle church oriented along Bidwell Parkway, and an older 1892, ashlar granite, gothic-revival cruciform chapel building, that now forms offices and a parish hall. A 1960s addition was constructed to the rear of the former chapel. Through activities such as 12-step meetings, concerts, a preschool, and a rental kitchen for food start-ups, the congregation reaches about 1,850 people a year.  
The New York Landmarks Conservancy has led the effort to preserve and protect New York City's architectural legacy for more than 45 years. Since its found-

ing, the Conservancy has loaned and granted more than \$52 million, which has leveraged more than \$1 billion in 1,550 restoration projects throughout New York, revitalizing communities, providing economic stimulus and supporting local jobs. The Conservancy has also offered countless hours of pro bono technical advice to building owners, both nonprofit organizations and individuals. The Conservancy's work has saved more than a thousand buildings across the City and State, protecting New York's distinctive architectural heritage for residents and visitors alike today, and for future generations.
