## Sam Reinhart Calls Out His Teammates

After scoring the Sabres only goal in a 6-1 loss to the Colorado Avalanche, Sam Reinhart called out his teammates. "I think it's all coming down to the players at this point," Reinhart told reporters. "I think that the systems and the game plans that are set out for us give us an opportunity to have success. I think it goes back to what I'm trying to preach here. Guys need to demand more out of themselves, and a lot of guys need to step the hell up." Rasmus Ristolainen added his thoughts, "Today was s---," ... No one wants to play games like we had tonight."

The blowout loss came shortly after Sabres GM Jason Botterill told WGR Radio that team owners Terry and Kim Pegula are unhappy with the Sabres performance. "I can understand our fans' frustration," Botterill said. "To put it bluntly, my conversations with Terry and Kim, they're frustrated with the results. They want better results... the dialogue goes to, 'What are the solutions? What are we doing to get better?'"

For one thing we can

expect Botterill to unload all of his unrestricted Free agents (UFA'S) for draft picks by the trade deadline, if anyone will take them. That list includes Michael Frolik, Connor Sheary, Jimmy Vesey, Zemgus Girgensoons, Johan Larsson and Zach Bogosian. Evan Rodrigues, Brandon Mon-

tour and Lawrence are Restricted Free Agents (RFA) along with Sam Reinhart.

Since arriving from Calgary, Frolik has just one goal in 10 games and it was an empty netter. He is a minus three. Ve-

sey has a disappointing six goals in 49 games but leads the team with a plus 12 rating.

The long awaited trade of Rasmus Ristolainen for a top six goal scoring forward is just a fantasy. If any other NHL team saw his value as that high he would already be gone. There is no other expendable player who will bring anything but a 3rd - 5th round draft choice, which is basically nothing since those late picks almost never develop into NHL players. The only players worth anything are Jack Eichel and Rasmus Dahlin, who are obviously not available, and Sam Reinhart who should not be available. That's how dire the Sabres situation is, they have no real trade capital.

So what's the solution? Clean out the dead weight, over the summer fill in with free agents who will all disappoint. Add 19 year old Dylan Cousins and hope he can produce 50-60 points on the second line. Find a veteran backup goalie to replace Carter Hutton or replace him with Rochester's AHL all star goalie Jonas Johanson. Get goalie Ukko Pekka Luukkainen established in Rochester as the starter and continue his development towards becoming the starter in Buffalo in two seasons. Sorry, there's no quick fix here. Things should be better Thursday night0 when the leagues worst team Detroit visits the Key-bank Center.

## Buffalo Snooze

The recent headline in Buffalo is the selling of the Buffalo News to Lee Enterprises for 140 million. Not sure who this Lee Enterprises is but I have a bridge in Brooklyn I could sell them. Heck, Jeff Bezos paid 150 million for the Washington Post and that is a lot more paper than the News. I am sure there is more to it than meets the eye but I would not think the News, who has been a loser for years, is worth that much money. Maybe they will buy the Buffalo Rocket for a measly \$50,000. No big profit here either but it is not losing at the rate the news is. Things may have changed as I have not subscribed to the News for over three years. I see it sometimes in Doctor's offices or restaurants. Seemed awfully thin with very little substance. Not like it used to be in its heyday.

Okay, now I got the story straight. 30 other Berkshire Hathaway dailies are included which makes it sound a little more palatable. BH even has an interest in Lee Enterprises. Just hope the new people return the publication into a newspaper again. I may even subscribe.

Back before television took over the way daily news is presented, your only source of daily information was in the newspaper. We had two dailies in Buffalo, the Courier Express and the Buffalo Evening News. The Courier was the morning daily and the News came out later in the day. Hence it was called the Buffalo Evening News. BEN! When they went to radio they had to add the W to make their station WBEN. Enter TV and it was WBEN-TV. Not that long ago so we should re-

member that. It is now WIVB-TV.

The Courier was a weak daily but had a tremendous Sunday paper which kept it alive. The Buffalo Evening News was the stronger as far as circulation and advertising, except for Sunday. Strange that the morning paper was not the main stream but it was not. I delivered the Courier when I was a youngster and know about selling subscriptions. Not many daily customers but Sundays was overwhelming. Even had to ask my dad to help me sometimes, as it was so big with lots of Sunday only subscribers. Not so much the news content but the ads and inserts. As a kid you could only carry maybe six Sunday papers as to a dozen dailies. Back then the Buffalo Evening News did not have a Sunday edition. The Courier was too powerful and long established. Eventually the Courier and some say because of the union, folded much to the dismay of the community. Some of the columnists came to the Rocket soon afterwards mostly for exposure. Writers like Jim Baker, Doug Smith, Ray Herman, con-

tributed to the pages of the Rocket. Back then we had a circulation of 25,000 combined with the West Side Times and the Riverside Times.

I recall the News was owned by a local family, the Butlers, who lived right here on Delaware. Maybe that was a factor in the success of the News over the Courier back then, as they were very involved in the community. Did a lot for Western New York and it showed in the writings and knowledge of the area.

With the Courier folding, the News took over publishing on Sunday morning, followed by it becoming the morning paper. With that they dropped the Evening and became just the Buffalo News which is what it is



now. Wonder if there will be any editorial changes and content influence in their reporting. The News has been a bias paper for many years. I recall that my buddy Mayor Jimmy Griffin could do nothing right according to the News. They were so one sided, it becomes apparent, but he just kept on winning. Just that we look for good honest reporting from reporters with no twist. Columnists could say what they want. That way you could read the ones you agree with as long as they have both sides represented. Maybe that is why no one reads this column. I own the paper so it does not matter what the editor thinks.

## Ask Rusty - What Happens to My Social Security If I Die at Age 62?

**Dear Rusty:** I have worked my entire life and contributed to Social Security. I have been single my entire life with no children. What happens to all that money I have contributed to Social Security if I die at age 62? Signed: Curious Worker

**Dear Curious:** From its inception in 1935, Social Security has always been a "pay as you go" program where current workers contribute money from which current beneficiaries are paid. That's the way it has worked since the first Social Security payroll withholding occurred in 1937 and the first Social Security benefit was paid in 1940. And it works the same way today.

Social Security FICA payroll taxes collected from current workers are used to pay all those who

are currently receiving benefits. Any excess collected which is not paid out in benefits is deposited into a special Trust Fund and held in reserve for the future. My hope is that understanding this will dispel a far too widely held myth that the money you pay into the Social Security program from your paycheck is deposited into a personal account for you - it is not. Rather that money is used to pay benefits to all those who are already collecting Social Security. And the extra money in the Trust Fund is invested in special interest-bearing bonds which contribute further to the Trust Fund's reserves (more about the Trust Fund in a minute).

If you were to pass away at, or before, age 62, all the money you paid

into Social Security via FICA payroll taxes will have already been spent to pay benefits to those already collecting Social Security. With no surviving dependents, there are no benefits to be paid from your lifetime work record. True you will have paid a great deal over your working career, but the system is designed so that when you retire your benefits will be paid for by those who are still working and paying into the system. Of course, it's a game of averages and Social Security says the "average" longevity for a male today is about 84. So, unless you're already in poor health, chances are pretty good you will live beyond age 62. Chances are also pretty good that if you do, you'll get back much more in benefits than you have contributed. In fact, if you start collecting benefits at your full retirement age you will get back benefits at least equal to what you contributed within about 5 years (we've studied this carefully). Which brings us back to the Trust Fund.

The Social Security Trust Fund held about \$2.9 trillion in reserves at the end of 2018. But

over the years the ratio of workers to beneficiaries has declined from 16.5 to 1 in 1950 to less than 3 to 1 today, so there are far fewer workers paying for beneficiaries who are living much longer. Starting in 2019, Social Security will pay out more in benefits than it received from FICA payroll taxes, which means the excess paid out in benefits will come from the reserves in the Trust

Fund. That will continue, according to the most recent Social Security Trustees' Report, until the Trust Fund is depleted in about 2035, at which time Social Security will only be able to pay out about 80% of benefits due - unless Congress acts soon to resolve the issue. And the solutions are well known; what's lacking in Congress is a serious bipartisan effort to fix the problem.

cant funds in our mission to end cancer and broken records along the way, but there's still work left to do. I want to invite everyone to make a difference for our 25th anniversary by registering to ride, becoming a virtual rider, volunteering, or donating to someone you know who rides."

The Ride offers routes ranging from 3 to 100 miles, including an international trip through Canada and multiple start times for the most popular routes. On many route options, participants riding different distances can depart from the start line at the same time, making scheduling easier for families and team members looking to start together.

The 2020 routes and start times include:

**River routes (start at the University at Buffalo's North Campus)**

3-mile Family Route: 10:30, 10-mile: 9:30 & 11 a.m., 20-mile: 7, 8, 9, 10 & 11 a.m., 30-mile: 7, 8, 9, 10 & 11 a.m.

**Country routes (start at UB's North Campus)**

34-mile: 7:30 and 8:30 a.m., 45-mile: 7:30 and 8:30 a.m., 65-mile (metric century): 6:30 and 7:30 a.m., 100-mile (century):

6:15 a.m.

**Canada route (start at Roswell Park)**

44-mile: 6:30, 7 & 7:30 a.m.

To participate, riders aged 18 and over are required to reach the fundraising minimum of \$200 (\$500 for the Canada route) by Ride Day; riders aged 17 and under have a fundraising minimum of \$50 for all routes.

In addition to riders, more than 2,000 volunteers are needed to support the event. Volunteer signup is now available for the most critical volunteer positions. The Ride also offers a virtual rider option for those who are volunteering or cannot be present on June 27 but want to support Roswell Park.

Ride Weekend kicks off on Friday, June 26, with the Peloton, a 12-mile route that is reserved for a qualifying group of top fundraisers who raise \$2,500 or more. The Peloton riders will travel in two-by-two formation from Roswell Park to UB's North Campus and join the Celebration of Hope, a moving and inspirational community rally in support of the fight against cancer. The Celebration of Hope is also moving back

into its original location in the UB Stadium. After months of fundraising efforts, thousands of riders will embark on their routes from start lines at UB's North Campus and Roswell Park on Saturday, June 27.

More than 10,000 riders and volunteers of all ages are expected to take part in this year's Ride. Since the first Ride for Roswell was held in 1996, the event has raised more than \$53 million for cancer research and patient-care programs at Roswell Park. The funds raised through the Ride for Roswell have helped Roswell Park researchers investigate new treatment options; facilitated clinical trials for both common and rare types of cancers; supported the costs of important medical testing not covered by insurance; and made possible quality-of-life programs that help patients remember that cancer doesn't define them and assist with non-medical needs.

In addition, Ride Spirit Week will take place March 23-27, with the Ride Kick-Off event officially launching Ride season on March 25 at Buffalo Riverworks.
