It's Fish Fry Season!



Fish is often served on Friday nights during Lent as a restaurant special or through church fundraisers. Beer is a common beverage of choice to accompany a fish fry.

Next Wednesday is Ash Wednesday and the beginning of the Catholic Lenten season. Catholics practice various acts of penitence and spiritual self-discipline during Lent, the (approximately) forty days leading up to Easter. One of those disciplines is a fast that requires Catholics to abstain from meat on Fridays during Lent. The

rule that Catholics cannot eat meat on Fridays during Lent is actually more lenient than what most Catholics in history have had to observe. Čenturies ago, the Catholic Church had a law that forbade consuming meat on all Wednesdays, Fridays, and Saturdays. Later, this rule was relaxed to remove meat from the diet on Ash

Wednesday and all Fridays. In 1966, Catholic bishops in America, with the blessing of Pope Paul VI, further relaxed the rule. Nowadays meat is only prohibited on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday, and Fridays of the Lenten season. Catholics are obligated to observe this fast as a minimum; they can make up Continued on page six.

Sabres Fail Again In Big Game

With a 2-0 lead early at Ottawa on Tues-day the Senators should be reeling. The Sabres were coming off three consecutive wins, most recently a 5-2 dominant win against the Toronto Maple Leafs on Sunday February 16th. One game prior the Sabres had trailed 2-0 against the Columbus Blue Jackets who were called the leagues top defensive team by Coach Ralph Krueger, before roaring back for a 4-3 OT victory. With Toronto losing to Pittsburgh, a Buffalo win in Canada's Capital would put them six points away from a playoff spot. Buffalo was in the drivers seat. It was time to put the pedal to the floor.

Instead the Senators ratcheted up their game in a hurry and scored four straight goals sending the Sabres to a 7-4 defeat. Carter Hutton was in the nets for six goals against. Hutton regressed looking like the goalie who lost 11 consecutive games rather than the winner of his last three.

The frustration grows over Buffalo's failure to defeat the leagues' bottom echelon teams like Ottawa. The Senators have 53 points which rank 29th in the league. But the reality

is that Buffalo is also a bottom echelon team. Since November 1st the Sabres record of 18-22-7 ranks them 28th out of 31 teams. Their three losses to Ottawa cost them six points which put them in strong playoff contention. Losses to teams like Ottawa and Detroit shouldn't be surprising at all. But why shouldn't Buffalo lose to Ottawa? Because realistically, they are Ottawa.

Montreal's traded of Marco Scandella to St Louis has subjected Sabres GM Jason Botterill to criticism because Monteal GM Marc Bergevin reaped far more from the trade than Botterill got when he traded

Scandella to Montreal for a fourth round pick in January. The Sabres flipped the pick to Calgary for Michael Frolik who was scratched from the lineup in Ottawa.

Montreal landed a 2nd round pick in 2020 and a conditional 4th rounder in 2021 for Scandella. The conditions being that Montreal will receive the 2021 4th round pick if St. Louis re-signs Scandella before Oct. 7, 2020 or if St. Louis wins two rounds of the playoffs and he plays in at least half of the games

least half of the games. Criticism of Botterill is out of place here. The Blues are stuck in a five game losing streak. They've been struggling all month. And with Jay Bouwmeester's health problems St. Louis needed to add to their defense depth. That makes demand high for a player like Scandella whois not a star by any means but is a very useful player. These conditions didn't exist when Buffalo traded him so criticism of Botterill in way off base.

The Blotter **Felonies**

From "D" District

North Buffalo February 15, 2020

Taunton Avenue - Complainant did com into D District to have items that were in the vehicle listed as stolen so that she could get various documents replaced. Ask Rusty - Will Selling Large Asset **Affect Wife's Social Security?**

Dear Rusty: If I have reached full retirement age (FRA) and wish to sell a \$500,000 asset, will it affect my wife's Social Security if we file jointly? I have heard that it will affect my Medicare (the amount withheld each month) but she still has three more years before she can receive benefits. Is it better to liquidate assets before she reaches FRA if we will be penalized? Would her Medicare be affected as well as mine? Signed: Planning Ahead

Dear Planning: Only earnings from working can affect Social Security (SS) benefits, so passive income from selling a large asset won't affect your wife's future Social Security benefits (nor yours). However, if your "combined income" from all sources (which is your

Adjusted Gross Income plus any other non-taxable income you may have, plus 50% of your SS benefits) exceeds certain levels, your Medicare premium will be subject to the Income Related Medicare Adjust-ment Amount (IRMAA) rule, which will add a supplemental amount to your base Medicare Part B premium. If your combined income (including that sold asset) for the 2020 tax year is between \$326,000 and \$750,000 then your Medicare premium for 2022 will be at least \$462.70 (I say "at least" because the Medicare Part B premium can increase each year).

The IRMAA premium increases on a sliding scale starting at \$174,001 of combined income for a married couple filing jointly (\$87,001

for an individual). If you liquidate that large asset this year, it will be reported on your 2020 income tax return which will be filed in 2021. That will mean that your Medicare premium for 2022 will be affected by IRMAA, and so will your wife's if she has enrolled in Medicare at age 65 in 2021 (which she need not do if she has other "creditable" healthcare coverage through an employer).

Šo, should you liquidate that large asset before your wife reaches her SS full retirement age? It doesn't matter for Social Security purposes because that passive income will not affect your wife's SS benefit. But, if your wife enrolls in Medicare at age 65, her Medicare Part B premium, as well as yours, will be subject to IRMAA and, thus be considerably higher than the standard premium of \$144.60 (the amount for 2020). Note that if your combined income for the following year is low enough to reduce your IRMAA premium, the Medicare premium will revert back to the lower level. Medicare typically uses income data from 2 years ago to determine

current year premium, so they wouldn't normally change your IRMAA premium back until they receive your income data for the previous year from the IRS. But, it is possible for you to contact Social Security earlier and provide them with proof that your income is now lower than reported in a previous year (causing the higher IRMAA premium) and they will adjust your Medicare premium sooner than they otherwise might.



stricter requirements for themselves, if they so desire. The stated reason for Catholics not being allowed to eat meat on Fridays during Lent is to remind the faithful that Jesus died on a Friday. Jesus gave up His body (His flesh), and Catholics, in an effort to attain greater communion with Christ, refrain from consuming flesh. If there is no eating meat on Fridays, then why is eating fish allowed for Catholics? The United States Conference of Catholic


