Memorial Day



Memorial Day tends to mark the unofficial start of summer for many Americans (though the season really begins with the Summer Solstice in June).

Traditionally, on Memorial Day (U.S.), people visit cemeteries and memorials, and volunteers often place American flags on each grave site at national cemeteries. A national moment of remembrance takes place at 3:00 p.m. local time.

The custom of honoring ancestors by cleaning cemeteries and decorating graves is an ancient and worldwide tradition, but the specific origin of Memorial Day—or Decoration Day, as it was first known—is unclear.

In early rural Ameri-

ca, this duty was usually performed in late summer and was an occasion for family reunions and picnics. After the Civil War, America's need for a secular, patriotic cer-emony to honor its military dead became prom-Continued on page six.

Covid-19 Antibody Tests For Erie County Residents Starting Tuesday, May toms may include cough,

19, the Erie County Department of Health (EC-DOH) will offer a series of clinics for COVID-19 antibody testing throughout Erie County.

The antibody test conducted by the Erie County Public Health Lab requires a blood draw from the arm. Appointments will be available in halfhour increments at clinics held three days each week from 10 a.m. until 6 p.m. These clinics will be set up in locations throughout Erie County, including Amherst, Buffalo, Cheektowaga, Depew, Hamburg, Lackawanna, Orchard Park, Springville and Williamsville.

ECDOH will schedule appointments for Erie County residents ages 11 and older through its COVID-19 Information Line at (716) 858-2929, which is open daily between 8 a.m. and 8 p.m. Antibody tests for COVID-19 should be done at least 21 days after onset of any COVID-19 symptoms. Those sympshortness of breath, fever, chills, muscle pain, sore throat, or new loss of taste

Appointments are required and will be scheduled on a first-come, firstserve basis for the next three scheduled clinic days. There is no cost for antibody testing through ECDOH. To maintain physical distancing within each test site, only individuals who have a scheduled appointment and their parent or guardian, if under 18 years old, will be allowed into the testing area. Anyone entering the testing site will be required to wear a cloth face covering or other appropriate mask. Antibody test results will be mailed within 7-10 days, and anyone who receives an antibody test through ECDOH is encouraged to speak to their health care provider about their results. Parents should discuss with their child's pediatrician if they are interested in their child under 11 years getting tested for COVID-19 antibodies.

Memorable Sabres Moments

On this date in Stanley Cup history, an unforgettable night unfolded at Buffalo's Memorial Auditorium during game three of the Stanley Cup finals. The Buffalo Sabres had returned home trailing 2-0 in the series against the Philadelphia Flyers after dropping games one and two at the Spectrum in Philadelphia.

After joining the league in 1970, the Sabres had only appeared in one playoff series over their first four seasons. The Sabres had never played a game in late May, so the fact the Memorial Auditorium didn't have air conditioning like the newer arenas wasn't an issue. Until now. With a high of 82 that day and a game time temperature of 75 with 62 percent humidity, the temperatures near the ice at game time was in the high 80's.

A bat that had been living in the upper rafters of the Aud began flying around the ice surface during the first period.

The Sabres Jim Lorentz reached up with his stick and knocked the creature out of the air, killing it, earning Lorentz the nickname "Batman". The Flyer Rick MacLeish picked the bat up barehanded and carried it off the ice

to the penalty box. Flyers defenseman Joe Watson skated over to MacLeish and told him to not touch the bat because he could get rabies. MacLeish replied "What are rabies?"

That was just the be-

ginning.

Fog had begun to form and eventually covered the ice. The fans sitting in their seats could see the play fine but visibility was severely limited for the players at ice level. So the game was stopped five times with the Sabres and Flyers players and arena employees carrying sheets held between them skated laps around the rink to disburse the fog before resuming play.

The Flyers had led four times but the Sabres kept tying the score with defensive stalwart Bill Hajt scoring to knot the score 4-4 and send the game to overtime. The foggy conditions persisted during the extra period and play was stopped seven times to disburse the fog. The Sabres French Connection line performed it's magic when Rene Robert scored after 18:29 of play with a shot from a bad angle that goalie Bernie Parent never saw in time coming through the fog. The goal gave Buffalo a 5-4 win and cut the Flyers series lead to 2-1.

The Sabres would even the series with a 4-2 win in game four but the Flyers won game five and six to win their second consecutive Stanley Cup championship.

Ask Rusty - What Will My Wife's Survivor Benefit Be?

Dear Rusty: I am a 68-year-old retired male and had planned on waiting to collect Social Security benefits beginning at age 70. My wife is currently 53 years old. When I die, would my wife's spousal benefit at her full retirement age be equal to what I would be receiving at age 70 or be reduced? Also, if I were to die before 70 and before collecting social security, what would be my wife's survivor benefit at her full retirement age? Signed: Older Husband

Dear Older Husband: Your wife's survivor benefit as your widow will depend upon two things – the amount you were receiving (or were eligible to receive) at your death, and the age at which she claims her survivor benefit as your widow.

If you were receiving an increased benefit because you waited until age 70, your wife's benefit – if she has reached her full retirement age - will be 100% of the amount you were receiving at your death. If she hasn't yet reached her full retirement age when she claims her survivor benefit (she could claim as early as age 60) the benefit will be actuarially reduced according to the number of months prior to her full retirement age (FRA) that she claims it. The amount of reduction for claiming her survivor benefit before her FRA is 0.396% for each full month earlier, which is 4.75% per year earlier than her FRA, to a maximum of 28.5%. And for clarity, your wife isn't required to take the survivor benefit immediate-

ly upon your death; she can wait until the benefit reaches 100% at her full retirement age, if desired and if financially feasi-

If your wife is also eligible for a SS benefit on her own work record and vou die before she reaches her FRA, she will have the choice to take either her own Social Security benefit or her survivor benefit from you. If her survivor benefit will be her highest possible benefit, she would have the option to take her own SS retirement benefit from her own work record first and delay taking the larger survivor benefit until it reaches maximum at her FRA. Or, if her own benefit at age 70 would be more than her survivor benefit from you, she could take the smaller survivor benefit first and delay taking her own SS benefit until it reaches maximum at age 70 and switch to her own benefit at that time. The goal is for her to get the highest possible benefit for the rest of her life.

Finally, if you were to die before you started collecting your increased Social Security benefit at age 70, your

wife would still have the same options, but her survivor benefit amount would be based upon the amount you were eligible to receive at your death, even though you were not yet collecting. In other words, all those delayed retirement credits (DRCs) you are now earning (and will continue to earn until you are 70) will not be lost - the benefit you have earned up to the point you die will be what your wife's survivor benefit is based upon.


