

Curfew



A curfew is in effect for Buffalo and Erie County due to the violent protest that occurred throughout the City of Buffalo over the weekend. Businesses were forced to board up their property to avoid damage and looting. This building on the corner of Hertel and Lovering Avenues was boarded and then tagged by protesters.

Mayor Byron Brown announced a City-wide curfew will take effect tonight starting at 8:00 PM which will last until 5:00 AM and that the curfew order will remain in effect through, and including, Sunday, June 7th. Individuals traveling to and from work or for some other legitimate reason including child-

care, medical care, or other necessary activity, will be allowed to do so.

Mayor Brown said, “I have ordered a curfew for the City of Buffalo to protect the peaceful protesters who want to express their justified concerns and outrage over the murder of George Floyd and other instances of police brutality across the

nation, residents who are concerned for their safety, the health and safety of our law enforcement community, and public and private property. I encourage everyone to abide by the curfew and remain off the streets during the designated times.”

Sabres Finished Season with Fewest Fighting Majors Since 1925

Fighting has been on the decline in the National Hockey League for years. The Buffalo Sabres finished the season with only three fighting majors, the lowest total in the NHL since 1925. This is the lowest total ever for a team playing more than 60 regular season games. The Sabres are one of just 23 teams in league history to finish a season with fewer than four fights. Buffalo finished 27th in the league with 479 pen-

alty minutes. Ironically the 1991-92 Sabres hold the record for most penalty minutes in a single NHL season, 2,713. Fighting in the NHL rose substantially after WW2 and has only dropped back to those pre-war levels in the last few years. For some perspective, the 1974-75 Philadelphia Flyers Broad Street Bullis team had 72 fighting majors and 47 misconducts. Fighting rose dramatically in the 1980's; the Boston Bruins

1987-1988 team had 200 fights, the Philadelphia Flyers 1986-1987 team had 183 and the Detroit Red Wings 1987-1988 had 174. In the strike-shortened 1995 season, the Chicago Blackhawks had 63 fighting majors in only 48 games. The 2007 Anaheim Ducks led the NHL with 53 fighting majors, 22 more than second place Nashville. George Parros had 13 fighting penalties himself. This season the Ducks led the league with only 25 majors in 71 games. It's interesting to note that the Arizona Coyotes, Philadelphia Flyers and Los Angeles Kings finished the season without a misconduct penalty. There have been only 21 teams in league history to finish a season without a misconduct penalty, 17 of those have come during the salary cap era.

of people moving around the City during the curfew hours will be asked to disperse and go home. The goal of the curfew is to protect the lives and property of residents and the Buffalo Police Department has been instructed not to unnecessarily detain any person who is out for a legitimate reason. Throughout the day,

Mayor Brown and other members of the Administration spoke to block club leaders and community activists to reassure them about how the curfew will be enforced and answer any questions they may have. The City is also urging residents to keep their totes off the street during the night and put them at the curb on the morning of their scheduled garbage pick-up while the curfew is in effect. Residents' garbage totes have been used to light fires or damaged in other ways by vandals during the past several nights' unrest. People should sign up for Buffalerts on the City's webpage to receive up to date information via text message and/or emails regarding the curfew or any other public safety information.

rental depression and family conflict, increases positive family interactions and reduces youth risky behaviors. While it is almost universally successful in improving behavioral problems, more than half of Triple P's 17 parenting strategies focus on developing positive relationships, attitudes and conduct. "Our goal is to equip parents with the skills and confidence they need to be self-sufficient and to be able to manage family issues without ongoing support," says Banks. "Because Triple P draws on social learning, we are taking care to implement it in a virtual model so it is still effective for our families."

The Triple P content will tackle four main points: dealing with disobedience, managing fighting and aggression, developing good bedtime routines and hassle-free shopping with children. Within those discussion groups, parents will view examples and success stories, receive tips and tricks to handle each issue and receive an at-home workbook. The partnership was funded through OASAS. Their goals are to build a collaborative infrastructure between prevention providers and nontraditional community partners, as well as to provide effective parent-centered prevention services through training and implementation oversight.

"OASAS prevention programs play a significant role in providing the tools for youth, families and communities to make healthy choices when it comes to underage alcohol and substance use" OASAS Commissioner Arlene González-Sánchez said. "Under the leadership of Governor Cuomo, the expansion of this important and effective program will enable more young people and families to receive prevention resources that can help lead them towards a healthy life, free from addiction." Ask Rusty - How Do I Apply with Social Security Offices Closed?

Dear Rusty: I am 64 years old and would like advice on how to move forward to apply for Social Security now instead of waiting until I am the "magic" age of 66.5 years. Signed: Ready for Retirement

Dear Ready for Retirement: All Social Security offices are currently closed to public visits, but they are still providing telephone services (although telephone wait times are usually longer these days). You can apply over the phone if you wish. However, the most efficient way to apply for your Social Security benefit, especially during the COVID-19 pandemic, is to apply online. You will need to create your personal "My Social Security" account prior to applying online, but that is easy to do at www.ssa.gov.

[gov/myaccount](http://www.ssa.gov/myaccount). For information, Social Security uses a "two-factor" identification process for security purposes, usually by asking you to enter, in addition to your password, a special ID code sent to your cell phone (or email). Once you have set up your personal account, you can use the online application process at www.ssa.gov/retire.

Here is a link to a short video from Social Security which explains the online application process: www.ssa.gov/hlp/video/iclaim_r01.htm. When you start the online process, be sure to write down the reentry code, which will allow you to save and re-enter your online application as many times as needed before you finally submit it. Once it is submitted, Social Security will call

you or write you to get any additional information they need. A couple of things I want to be sure you are aware of:

By claiming before your full retirement age (FRA) your benefit amount will be permanently reduced. The reduction is about 0.556% per month prior to your FRA that you claim (at 64, a reduction of about 15%).

Finally, if you are still working, you'll be subject to Social Security's earnings test until you reach your full retirement age. If you start benefits mid-year 2020, you'll be subject to a monthly earnings limit of \$1520, and if you exceed that limit you won't be eligible for benefits for that month. The following years you'll be subject to an annual limit, until you reach your FRA when there is no longer a limit to how much you can earn.




