The Ride For Roswell starts this weekend, August 1st and continues through August 21st. Riders can either do their bike treks on their own or at the smaller weekend rides with Roswell.

Here are some cycling tips for you from our friends at bicycling.com.

Pedal Smart

If you want to last long on a ride, you can't go all

out right from the start. That includes pedaling in an efficient gear—one that isn't too hard and won't fry your legs. Opt for a slightly easier gear with a higher cadence versus one that's lower because the pedals are harder to turn over.

Eat and Drink Lots

When you're out on a long bike ride, nutrition and hydration are key for sustaining your effort.

Aim to drink about one bottle per hour, depending on heat and exertion level.

Use the Rule of Thirds If a long ride still seems overwhelming, divide it into three more or less equal distances and have a plan for each of those segments: The first segment should feel easy, just spinning along. During the second, you should start to

NHL Playoff Schedule

The NHL playoffs begin Saturday August first. Before the playoffs officially start, there will be a "qualifying round" in each conference. The top four seeds in each conference will receive a bye from this round., seeds five through twelve in each conference will play a best of five series with playoff OT rules. These series begin on Saturday August first featuring five games; Calgary vs. Winnipeg, Chicago vs. Edmonton, Florida vs. the Islanders, the Rangers vs. Carolina and Montreal vs. Pittsburgh. The winners will move on to face the top four seeds in the next round. Other series will feature Toronto vs. Columbus, Arizona vs. Nashville and Minnesota vs. Vancouver..

While these teams battle, the top four teams in each conference will play a round robin tournament to determine their seeding for the first round of the playoffs. Regular season OT rules will be in effect since these are not elimination games.. If there is a tie in points after the round robin, then points percentages from the regular season will be used as the tiebreaker. The round robin will begin Sunday August second with a game between Philadelphia and Boston. After the playoff bracket is set, each series will be the traditional best of seven, from the first round through the Stanley Cup Final.

Games will be played in two Canadian "hub cities": Toronto for Eastern Conference games and Edmonton for Western Conference games. The conference finals and Stanley Cup Final will be held in Edmonton.

North Buffalo July 26, 2020

Colvin Avenue - The offender did enter and remain unlawfully inside of the Colvin Market by forcible entry. In the good old summertime. We are about half way pool opened until

through one of the best summers we have had in a long time, weather-wise. Perhaps a little too warm for some but for those who enjoy the heat, it has been heavenly. More sunshine than we have seen in many years, less rain than we need, but I guess enough to keep the crops and the grass growing. Longer days mean more daylight to do all the activities that the season brings. Summer usually means great outdoor living. I say usually. We used to rent a cottage for a week years back. Look forward to that all winter only to have a cold and rainy week... Ever happen to you?

It has been a different year for those who love being in or near the water. Unless you have your own backyard pool, swimming has been limited by the pandemic. All the public pools have remained closed this year and never opened. These are pools that have always been filled with happy kids who would spend most of the day splashing, swimming, jumping, and diving into the cool clear chlorinated water. From the day the

pool opened until the day it closed. Not this year, a pool with no water is just a big silent hole.

The alternative would be going to the beach, one would think. Nope, they closed them also. First you are not allowed to go into Canada, site of many of the areas favorite sandy beaches. When we moved off the West Side we eventually had our own in ground pool. Problem solved no need to go to any public pools or beaches any more. That is until we moved to a home without a pool.

That meant again having to find comfortable public pools or beaches but now suitable for older people. That has not been too much of a problem till this year and the pandemic. 



Ask Rusty - Can I Get a Widow's Benefit if I'm on Disability?

Dear Rusty: I was recently approved for my Social Security disability benefits. Will I still be able to get my widow's benefits when I turn 60, which is right around the corner? Or do I lose those because I am disabled? Signed: An Uncertain Widow

Dear Uncertain Widow: You will not lose your survivor (widow's) benefits because you are now collecting Social Security Disability Insurance (SSDI) benefits. You can get the survivor benefit if it is more than your SSDI benefit and provided that you did not remarry before age 60 (and remain married). If you are enti-tled to and claim a survivor benefit while on SSDI, it will come as a separate payment supplemental which, along with your SSDI benefit, equals the amount you are due as a widow.

If you are now on SSDI you can actually take your survivor benefit before age 60 because survivor benefits can be taken as early as age 50 if you are disabled. But claimed at age 60 or earlier, the survivor benefit will be reduced by 28.5% from what it would be if you wait until your full retirement age (FRA) of 67 to claim it. If you are collecting both SSDI and the survivor supplement when you reach your full retirement age, it will automatically convert to one payment equal to what you're entitled to as a survivor (SSDI benefits stop at full retirement age).

It would be prudent for you to evaluate whether you should continue with your SSDI benefits only for a while and allow your survivor benefit to grow to a higher amount. At age 67, your survivor benefit as a widow will be 100% of

the amount your deceased husband was receiving, or entitled to receive, at his death. But claiming it before your full retirement age will mean it will be cut by 4.75% for each year earlier than your FRA that you claim it. You can find out your full survivor benefit amount by contacting Social Security.

Your survivor benefit will reach maximum at your full retirement age, and it does not expire so you can delay up to age 67 to claim if you wish (to get the maximum amount as a widow). But if your financial situation is such that you need the reduced survivor benefit earlier, and your benefit as a widow is more than your SSDI benefit, you can claim it at any time. Survivor benefits must be applied for directly with the Social Security Administration, which you can reach by phone at 1.800.772.1213, or at your local office (find the phone number for your local office at www. ssa.gov/locator). Note that all Social Security offices are temporarily closed to in-person visits by the public, so telephone is your only current option to apply for your survivor benefit, until after the pandemic closure is lifted.


