City Closing NBCC?



North Buffalo is poised to get its new community center, along with 43 new affordable senior apartments.

"Absolutely not!" according to City of Buffalo Council Member Joel P. Feroleto. "It was never in any plan to eliminate the North Buffalo Community Center." What the council member is referring to is the plans underway by McGuire Development to knock down the current, 70 year old, facility and build a new one at the North Buffalo Communi-

ty Center property located at 203 Sanders Road. The center will be closed for approximately two years during construction but the current programs will be diverted to other centers until the new center is completed. Construction will begin in two years. The North Buffalo Community Development Corporation, the organization who currently runs the center,

will benefit with a \$1 annual rental fee in a 99 year lease agreement to run the North Buffalo Community Center according to Council Member Feroleto.

The redevelopment effort will consist of a revamped 11,000 sq. ft. community center and 43 senior apartments above and around it. Silvestri Architects designed the \$11 Continued on page six.

Erie County Department of Health Free Rabies Vaccinations

The Erie County Department of Health (EC-DOH) has opened registration for its free rabies vaccination clinics, scheduled for Saturday, September 19 and Tuesday, September 29.

Saturday, September 19, 9 a.m. - 1 p.m., Erie Community College South Campus, 4041 Southwestern Blvd., Orchard Park

Tuesday, September 29, 3-7 p.m., Erie Commu-nity College North Cam-pus, 6205 Main Street, Williamsville (off Youngs Road or Tech Drive)

Online registration is available at http://www. erie.gov/health/rabies. Individuals who are unable to access this form may call (716) 961-6800 during business hours to schedule an appointment. Pet owners must make

an appointment in order to attend these clinics. No walk-ins will be accepted. Dogs, cats and ferrets three months of age and older are eligible for a vaccination. Up to three pets will be accepted per appointment. Pet owners are asked to bring proof of vaccination with them to the event in order to receive a three-year vaccination certificate; otherwise, a one-year certificate will be given.

Staff are asking pet owners to limit the number of people in the vehicle. Face masks or cloth face coverings will be required at all times, and physical distancing will be strictly enforced by clinic staff.

NY Islanders Present Blueprint For Sabres Future

While the Buffalo Sabres languish near the bottom of the NHL standings, their ninth consecutive season outside the playoffs. While hope springs eternal there is a pessimism surrounding the franchise. But it need not be so. There is a clear path out of theses doldrums and the New York Islanders have shown how to do it.

In the 2017-18 season, the Islanders were the highest scoring team in the NHL at the all star break. But they were not in a playoff spot. At the end of the season they were the leagues eighth highest scoring team but finished out of the playoffs because of their abysmal defense which was the worst in the league surrendering 296 goals. As a result hey finished 11th in the Eastern Conference and 7th in the Metropolitan Division in spite of their high scoring line of John Tavares (84 points), Matthew Barzal (85) and Josh Bailey (71).

And then disaster struck in the off season when superstar Tavares left to sign with the Toronto Maple Leafs as a free agent. He wanted to win a Stanley Cup with a strong talented Leafs and didn't see much of a chance to win the Cup on Long Island.

But the Isles countered

by hiring Lou Lamoriello away from Toronto as
their new GM. Old School
Lou popularized defensive
hokey and the trap with
his New Jersey Devils
team and they won three
Stanley Cup championships. Lou hired defensive
minded coach Barry Trotz
who as the coach of the
Washington Capitals convinced Alex Ovechkin that
the Caps can't be a winning
team if he was a -35 player
even if he scored 50 goals.

Trotz and Lamoriello put their plan to work the next season. While the Isles goals scored fell by 34 without Tavares, the team surrendered a whopping 100 fewer goals by playing a defensive system

that minimized opponents scoring chances. The team made the playoffs with 103 points finishing fourth in the eastern Conference, sweeping the Penguins 4-0 in round one before getting swept by Carolina in round two

The Islanders success this season has been even greater with the team currently one win away from a trip to the Stanley Cup finals tied at three wins apiece in the Eastern Conference finals with the Tampa Bay Lightning. The defensive minded Dallas Stars winners of the western Conference finals await the winner from the east. So the path to success in the NHL is clear, defense first with a lot of unheralded role players committed to playing the grinding style of hockey. With Ralph Kruger as coach, the Sabres have the type of leader with expertise implementing this style of play. Now new GM Kevin Adams needs to start turning over his roster to build a team capable of emulating the Islanders and their approach.

Northwest Buffalo Beat by Joe Borts

"Nawlins" better known as **New Orleans**

How about New Orleans? Ever been there? We have for a Kiwanis convention and it is a city we will always remember. This visit was before hurricane Katrina hit and made a mess of the whole area. But boy it was fun. Much like Las Vegas, you get extraordinarily little sleep. You just flow on into the late night and early morning. I can just image what it is like to be there during Mardi Gras. A simple stroll down famous Bourbon Street is a memorable experience.

Now this is one strange city. It is 6 feet below sea level, so it must be surrounded by dikes and levees to prevent water from drowning the area. That is what happened with hurricane Katrina. The levies broke and the water came rushing in. Many people had to be rescued from their roof tops the water was that high. Residents live in the constant danger

of that happening again each time a hurricane hits. It is probably the only city that I know of where they bury the dead above ground. True! If you see a graveyard in "Nawlins", as the natives call it, the tombs are above ground.

As it was explained to us by a tour guide, they place the remains in the tomb on a slab. With the heat it does not take long for there to be nothing left but bones. When they need room for the next person, they place the bones in a bag and toss them in a corner. Hence the expression "bag of bones". Nothing goes below ground. A walk through the graveyard is a bit different. Like I said the tombs are above ground and are quite elaborate in design. You want to have a good-looking house even after you are gone. The guide said some of the tombs had a good number of occupants as they crowd them in there to save space.

To move to a more pleasant topic we will talk about the entertainment which there is plenty of. Almost every bar on Bourbon Street had entertainment. Plenty of talent on the street outside. I recall one young lad with bottle caps on his shoes tap dancing like you would not believe. With a little baseball cap for donations. Lots of African-American tainment with small bands and individuals doing their thing. Fun to watch. Inside of course is a step up with higher class performances. So many places and such a short time to visit. A standout was the dueling pianos.

Cajun food is the specialty in "Nawlins" as you would expect. We stopped at a restaurant that specialize in Cajun cooking. I ordered Shrimp creole and drooled as I awaited my dinner. I was a bit upset when it came with only two small shrimp. I expressed my disappointment to our waiter. Really nice polite young man. His trip into the kitchen to pass on the complaint met with a tirade by the owner. We were sitting near the door and could overhear the discussion. There was no way this waiter should have to listen to that on my behalf. So, I acted.



Ask Rusty - Can I Help My Friend with His Social Security?

Dear Rusty: I am trying to help a good friend of mine who lives in Indiana and is 80 years old. I am very concerned as he's not now collecting SS for some reason, and I have no idea why. Is there any reason that you know of that would keep him from getting his benefits? Is there maybe something he might have done to keep him from getting his money? He worked his whole life, is a retired electrician and was a long-time member of the Electricians' Union. I'm not sure if he knows how to apply for his benefits, but he's having a hard time making ends meet and could definitely use the extra money. He told me that an organization has offered to help him, but it will cost \$7,500 and there is no guarantee they can get it for him. He can't afford to pay that kind of money only to be told

there is nothing they can do for him. I'm hoping you can give me some insight. Signed: Faithful Friend

Dear Faithful Friend: If your friend has, as you say, worked and contributed to Social Security via FICA payroll taxes all his life, then he should be eligible to collect Social Security benefits. It only takes 40 quarters of credit (about 10 years of earnings) to be eligible for SS, so he should certainly be eligible if he paid SS FICA taxes for enough years.

Are there reasons why he might not be collecting? Sure, but they're not common, and here are a few:

• Indiana is one of 26 states where some state employees don't participate in the Federal Social Security program. If your friend was a state employee for his whole life he may not have contributed to SS, so

he may not have the requisite 40 credits needed to collect Social Security.

• Social Security benefits are generally exempt from garnishing, except for certain types of situations. Any U.S. government agency (such as the IRS if he owes back taxes) can garnish his SS benefit if he owes them money. His SS can also be garnished for unpaid alimony or child support. But usually such garnishment means only reducing his SS benefit, not completely eliminating it.

- If he were collecting Social Security at one time, but SS later found that he had been overpaid for any reason, they could withhold his benefits until they recovered the overpayment. Sometimes, the actions of someone else (e.g., a former spouse) can cause him to be liable for an overpayment, but SS would have sent him a letter informing him of the overpayment and giving him an opportunity to appeal it. In any case, SS would only withhold benefits until the overpayment was fully recovered.
- Social Security benefits are not automatically awarded. If your friend simply neglected to apply for benefits when he was eligible, SS wouldn't sign

him up automatically, regardless of his age. He will simply not get benefits unless he applies for them.

Your friend shouldn't pay anyone to find out if he's eligible for Social Security benefits. The answer is simply a phone call away by contacting the Social Security Administration, either at the national number (1.800.772.1213) or by contacting his local SS office (the local contact information is at www.ssa. gov/locator). Generally, this type of transaction can be accomplished over the phone. He should call Social Security and tell them he wishes to apply for "Social Security Retirement Benefits." Once they have his Social Security Number they can tell immediately if he is eligible for benefits and, if he is, he should ask for 6 months retroactive benefits (SS will pay up to 6 months retroactively).

If your friend cannot, for any reason, contact Social Security himself to discuss his situation, he can appoint someone (such as you) to represent him in these matters. Here is a link to Social Security's rules on having someone represent him: www.ssa. gov/pubs/EN-05-10075.pdf. You are, indeed, a good and faithful friend.


