A wide array of youth and senior service programs are offered to residents out of the Gloria J. Parks Community Center.

What can parents do to help their kids faced with 6 to 7 hours of on-line classes at home during virtual school time? For students in Buffalo district and charter schools, they can enroll in a live, in-person Virtual Learning Service Center, like the Gloria J. Parks Community Center on the corner of Main and Heath Streets in the City's

University District. This Virtual Learning Services Center opens early each morning for the start of the school day and serves students in grades Kindergarten until 4:30 p.m. daily. And it is free. Students bring their school laptops in and receive breakfast and lunch, courtesy of Buffalo Public Schools. If a student has

computer problems, the program has computers that may be used during the program. They attend all their day school classes virtually from the classrooms at the community center. Skilled staff members help students with any technical computer problems, as well as giving tutoring help if they are

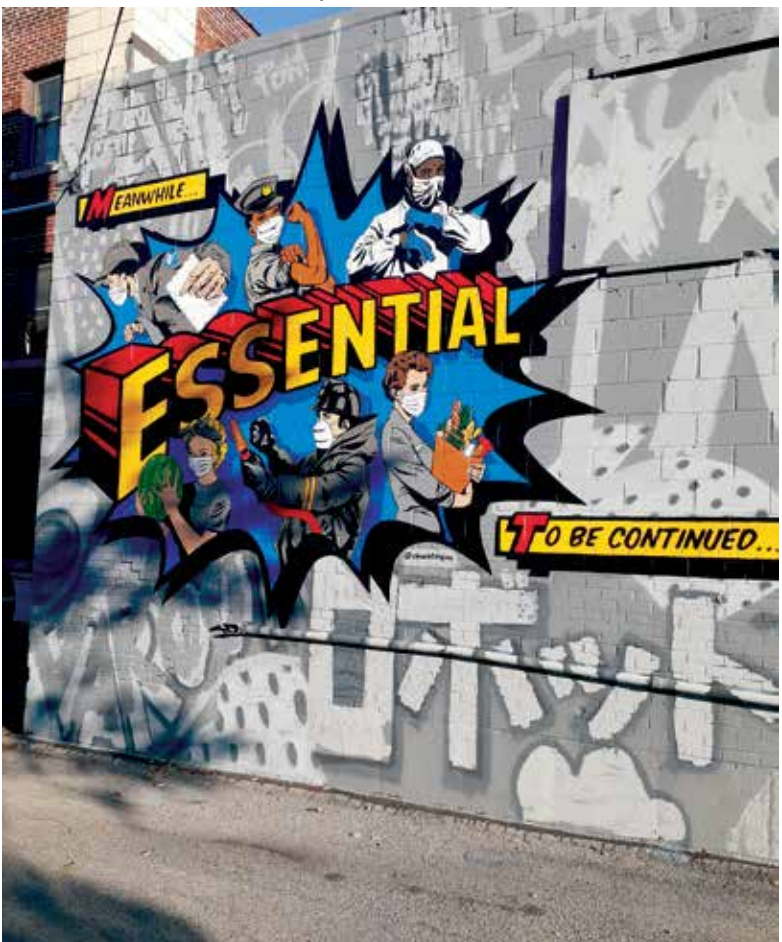

Sabres Shock NHL and Buffalo Signing Free Agent Taylor Hall

He was the premier player available in free agency. He was the former number one overall selection in the 2010 NHL Entry Draft by the Edmonton Oilers. He was the NHL MVP winning the Hart Trophy in the 2015-16 season as a New Jersey Devil scoring 39 goals and 54 assists for 93 points. He is the sort of player who never comes to Buffalo unless his team is on a road trip.

Hall had repeatedly stated that he wanted to play for a winner, that winning was his priority in choosing a new team to play for. So why would he sign with Buffalo, a team which has not made the playoffs for an NHL record nine seasons? Even with Hall in the lineup Buffalo looks like a fringe playoff contender at best.

As an Oiler Hall played for the Sabres current head coach Ralph Kreuger for three seasons, the first two seasons of his career Kreuger was an associate coach and the head coach in Hall's third season. Coach Kreuger commented in a Zoom chat, on Monday "We have that trust level, Taylor and I. We developed it early on and we've held on to it over the last decade." as a new NHL coach He was the first NHL player that I sat with and our relationship grew from there. I thought those first three years we really went through a lot of conversations as he was evolving as a teenage player."

Before the free agency period opened on Friday, Hall and Kreuger spoke on Facetime. On Friday when free agency began Hall spoke with Sabres owners Terry and Kim Pegula and GM Kevyn Adams and liked what he heard. He then spoke again with Kreuger who told him about life in Buffalo and how he would get the very best from Hall as his coach.

That was all he needed to hear and Hall decided to sign with the Sabres and inked a one year deal for \$8 million. Hall explained to the local media on his Zoom chat, "It's been a long time since I had seen Ralph and we just talked and he

told me about Buffalo. I could just see it in his face that he really wanted me to come to Buffalo. It's a good feeling to be wanted like that, it really is."

Kreuger was the head coach of the Oilers in the lockout shortened season when Hall enjoyed his breakout season scoring 50 points in 46 games with 16 goals and 34 assists. "He got the most out of me, I have a lot of respect for him." Kreuger's relationship with Hall is similar to that he established wit Jack Eichel who had his own breakout season under the guidance of Kreuger.

"I don't think it's a coincidence that Ralph was able to get a lot out of him (Eichel). Jack did the work, but there was obviously a good relationship there. He (Kreuger) sees the game the way that an offensive guy would want to play for. I saw that firsthand. You saw how Eichel was able to up his production last year and take the step that a lot of people around the league thought he could."

Just read the Rocket for October 8th and saw the Memories photo of the Stag on Hertel. Never had the pleasure of visiting the place but looked up the address and saw that it is now Del Denby's, next door to Kosta's. Haven't patronized Del's either, but certainly have Kosta's on many occasions.

Wow Joe, you really are an old fart! You worked the Fort Erie ferry in 1950!?? I was 10 years old then and on hot summer evenings we (Mom, Dad and little brother) would ride the ferry to Canada and back just for the breeze to cool off. I definitely remember the yellow pike fish fries at Sergeant's and Roy's. My parents would argue over which was better and where we would go for our Friday ritual and the Schuper House on Niagara Street was also in the mix. I don't remember if the

dining room at the Schuper House was elevated or the kitchen was in the basement but the serving window for the waitresses was at floor level in the back. I didn't care where we went as long as the Birch Beer was cold.

The wall along the river next to the boat dock at the foot of Ferry Street was a fisherman's paradise. There were pike, perch, bass, the despised (at least by my Dad) Sheephead, and when they were run-

ning, smelt for dipping. On any given evening after supper, my Dad would pack up all his gear, including a lantern and a rope and if I was lucky, me and head for the river. The lantern was in case we were out after dark and the rope, tied to my belt, tethered me to the wall in case I fell off, which thankfully I never did. 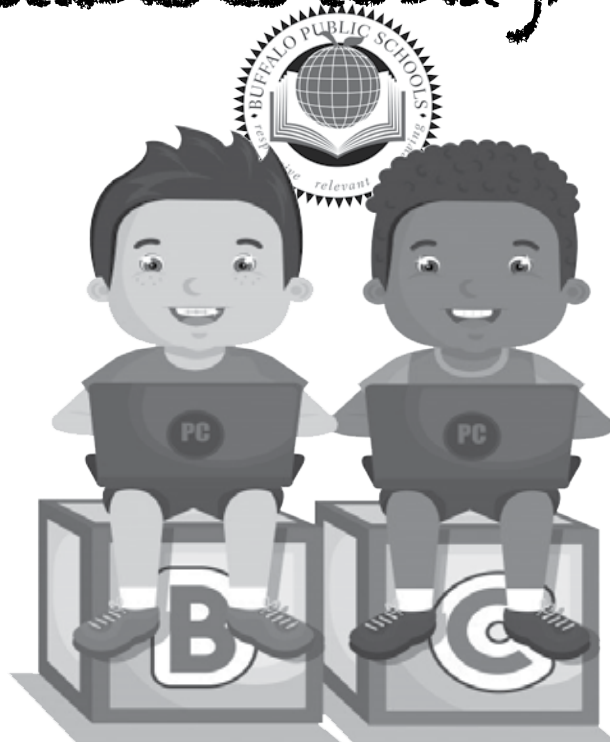

Ask Rusty- I Need Guidance on Social Security and Medicare

Dear Rusty: I am turning 67 in October and as of today am still employed full time. I really do not plan on retiring unless I am forced to. But how do I arrange my Social Security and Medical care stuff. It seems this subject is like a color, and everyone has a different color they like. Is there any way for me to figure this out with help or on my own? I could really use some guidance. Signed: Perplexed

Dear Perplexed: Okay, let's look at your Social Security and your Medicare separately, because they're two totally independent programs.

You do not need to do anything about Social Security until you are ready to start collecting your benefits. Since you have already reached your full retirement age (FRA) of 66, you are now earning Delayed Retirement Credits (DRCs)

at the rate of .667% per month. That means that your benefit in October, if you were to claim it then, would be 8% more than it would have been at age 66. If you continue to delay applying for SS benefits, you will continue to earn those DRCs up to age 70, when your benefit amount would be 32% more than it would have been at your FRA. The choice of when to claim your Social Security is yours to make, considering your need for the money, your health, and your expected longevity. The longer you wait (up to 70) the more your benefit will be, and if you expect at least average longevity (about 84 for a man your current age) then you'll get both a higher benefit amount and more in cumulative lifetime benefits by waiting to claim your Social Security.

As for Medicare, if you are now covered by your

employer's "creditable" healthcare plan, you can delay enrolling in Medicare until your current employer coverage ends (when you stop working). "Creditable" is a group plan with more than 20 participants. If you now have "creditable" employer healthcare coverage (including drug coverage) you won't be liable for a Late Enrollment Penalty for enrolling in Medicare (or a drug plan) later. If you are still working and know your creditable employer coverage will end soon, you can enroll for Medicare benefits to start coincident with the end of your employer coverage. Or, after you stop working, you can enroll in Medicare during a "Special Enrollment Period" (or "SEP" for those transitioning from employer coverage to Medicare coverage). Your SEP for Medicare will last for 8 months after you stop working, but you only have 63 days after the end of your employer drug coverage to enroll in a Part D prescription drug plan.

The bottom line is this – you don't need to enroll in Medicare until your creditable employer healthcare coverage ends. And you don't need to apply for Social Security until you wish to start receiving benefits

(just don't wait beyond 70).

One final point because you were born in 1953: if you are now married and your wife is already collecting her SS, you can file a "restricted application for spouse benefits only" and

collect only a spouse benefit from your wife, while still allowing your own benefit to continue to grow until you are 70. But this option is only available to you because you were born before January 2, 1954.
