2020 YMCA Turkey Trot

Since 1896 runners have competed in the cross-country race that has become today's Turkey Trot. The race is an 8k footrace which traditionally begins on Delaware Avenue, and continues into downtown Buffalo.

In light of today's pandemic, YMCA Buffalo Niagara realizes this year's event has to be different, but we still encourage you to join us for our milestone celebration of this amazing WNY holiday tradition! All registered participants will receive a 125th YMCA Turkey Trot t-shirt and face mask.

Curbside Packet pick-up will be available for virtual race participants 12:00-7:00 pm on Tuesday, November 24 and Wednesday, November 25 at the Independent Health YMCA, Southtowns YMCA, Lockport YMCA, and YMCA Buffalo Niagara Association Office.

The Turkey Trot will be ebrated in two ways! The first is a virtual race to give our 14,000+ loyal past participants and friends the opportunity to stay safely apart while still running this annual Thanksgiving

tradition together.

The second is a live event featuring a field of 125 randomly selected participants to uphold the YMCA Turkey Trot's reign as the oldest continually run footrace on North America.

Online registration for both the virtual and live events opens at 7:00 pm on Tuesday, September 8, 2020. Those wanting to be included in the Live Race random selection process must register_by Friday, September 25. Live race participants will be selected Monday, September 28.

Those who register for the virtual race only have the option to run, jog, or walk an 8k (4.97 miles) anytime between Thanksgiving Day, Thursday, November 26 through Sunday, November 29. The entry fee for the Virtual YMCA Turkey Trot is \$35. This non-refundable registration fee includes all online processing fees, commemorative t-shirt and face mask. Anyone who registers by October 8, 2020 will also receive a 125th Turkey Trot Commemorative medal.

Live race participants

will run a modified 8K (4.97 mile) looped course that begins and ends at the Delaware Family YMCA in North Buffalo on Thanksgiving Morning, Thursday, November 26.

Virtual Race: Curbside Packet pick-up will be available 12:00-7:00 pm on Tuesday, November 24 and Wednesday, November 25 at the Independent Health YMCA, Southtowns YMCA, Lockport YMCA, and YMCA Buffalo Niagara Association Office. You also have the option to have your packet shipped to you for an additional fee.

Live Race: Packet pick-up for the live race is available 6:00 am - 8:00 am, Thanks-giving morning ONLY at the Delaware YMCA -2564 Delaware Ave, Buffalo, NY 14216. All entrants must complete and sign a COVID-19 health survey confirming no recent travel outside of NYS, no recent contact with anyone testing positive for COVID-19, etc. Temperature checks will be taken at check-in.

The Hertel North Park Youth Baseball League is mourning the loss suddenly of a longtime coach and board member Kevin Reinhardt, who passed away at home Wednesday, October 28, 2020. He was 51. A volunteer in the true sense of the word, Reinhardt spent hours in Shoshone Park, helping the North Buffalo League give countless boys and girls the chance to play baseball or softball during the Summer months for the 63 year old league.

For the past 10 years, Reinhardt became a fixture in the Park for the league, helping to prepare diamonds for play, riding a tractor or league golf cart to various parts of the tiny park, located near the corner of Hertel Avenue and Main Street. Besides coaching both a boys and girls team over the years, Reinhardt took an active role in the registration of area children for play, helped to write the league's rules and code of conduct policies and helped serve refreshments and snacks in the Park's clubhouse. Kevin was also responsible for making sure there would be a volunteer umpire at every game scheduled for the season, either at night during the week and on Saturdays, when as many as 30 games could be played.

Hundreds of friends and families of the League, gathered this past Saturday afternoon in Sho-shone Park for a Celebration of Life for Kevin that adhered to the Covid-19 restrictions. With the cancellation of the 2020 season this year, Hertel North Park looks to continue offering baseball and softball games again next summer in both its house and travel teams. 

Ask Rusty - About "Registering" for Social Security & Medicare

Dear Rusty: I have a big 65th birthday coming up mid-March and would like your advice on registering for Social Security and Medicare. I am now unemployed, but I am seeking another gig to get me to age 67 before taking Social Security. Signed: Wondering Senior

Dear Wondering: You do not need to "register" with Social Security in ad-

vance. You don't need to do anything with Social Security until you are ready to claim your benefits. Since you were born in 1956, your full retirement age (FRA) for Social Security purposes is 66 plus 4 months, and that is when you will be entitled to 100% of the benefit you've earned from a lifetime of working. But you can, if you wish, also wait beyond your FRA to get an even bigger benefit. For each month you delay after your FRA you'll earn Delayed Retirement Credits of .667%, which is 8% additional benefit for each year you wait. That can continue up to age 70 when your maximum benefit will be reached. In your case that would mean an age 70 benefit 29% more than your FRA benefit amount. But whenever you're ready, you can apply for Social Security online at www.ssa.gov/ retire (you must first create your "My Social Security" account to apply online).

Medicare is an entirely separate program and, unless you have "creditable" employer healthcare coverage from a new job, you should enroll in Medicare a

day ("creditable" coverage is a group plan with at least 20 participants). This would be during your Medicare Initial Enrollment Period (IEP), which is a 7-month window starting 3 months before the month you turn 65 and ending 3 months after the month you turn 65. If you don't enroll in Medicare during your IEP and enroll later, and if you didn't have creditable employer healthcare coverage after age 65, you will be subject to a late enrollment penalty, which will permanently increase your Medicare Part B (and Part D) premiums.

Medicare Part B is coverage for doctors & outpatient services, and Part D is prescription drug coverage, both of which require a premium; Medicare Part A is hospitalization coverage which is free if you're eligible for Social Security. If you have "creditable" employer coverage when you turn 65, you can simply delay enrolling in Medicare Part B until your employer coverage is about to end, or until after it ends during an 8 month Special Enrollment Period during which you can enroll in Medicare Part B without penalty. But for Part D prescription drug coverage, you must enroll in a private plan within 63 days of your 65th birthday, or the end of your employer drug coverage, or you will incur a Part D late enrollment penalty for enrolling later. And remember that Medicare late enrollment penalties never go away they are recurring for the



How long is Forever?

Way back when I was a young lad, things were quite different. Public places were free, like the Zoo, Historical Building and most important to me, the Science Museum. Made it easy to visit these educational institutions for us less affluent youngsters and I took advantage of it. Every Saturday I boarded the Porter/Best bus and went to a special program held at the Science Museum in what was then Humboldt Park. It was fun as well as extremely educational.

As you entered the front door there were trays of questions related to almost ever science topic. You were able to find the answers somewhere in this massive building. Clues were offered as to where to look. I think there were ten different halls designed to specific subjects. I do not recall the names of all the halls but I do recall the "Hall of Man" I remember that one as we

were not allowed into it as children. Cannot tell you why as I was denied entry. The other Hall I remember vividly was the "Hall of Astronomy". I took particular interest in this exhibition as there are so many unanswered questions about the Universe. No beginning and no end. How could that be? If you traveled forever you would not reach the end. How long is forever. Mind boggling and I loved it as it was and still is the unknown heavens.

In this hall was a display of a moving solar system with the sun in the middle and the planets revolving around it. It brought out the enormity of the space in which we exist. Compared the size of larger stars to our sun, making it look like nothing but a tiny speck. Point is it increased my interest in astronomy that lasted for years. Later on in life I joined the Buffalo Astronomical Society. I wanted to be able to look through

the huge telescope located on the roof of the Science Museum. The curator of Astronomy at the museum happened to be a friend of ours, so we received special treatment. The telescope was located up in the Kellogg Observatory. If you have driven the 33 going downtown you can see the observatory from the road. It looks like a dome on the top of the building and last time I saw it, it was green. Inside that dome is a

large refracting telescope with a clock like movement that gives it the ability to move with the rotation of the earth. This is needed so the image does not move out of view. I was able to see Saturn with its rings through this magnificent device. It was breathtaking, beautiful and inspiring. I wanted to see more so I decided I wanted my own telescope. Could not afford to buy one at the time so I sent away for a do it yourself kit. I was going to make my own. Had to hand grind the mirror which was a lot of work, so I never did finish it. I worked on it for many days, weeks and months. After so many years I gave up and by this time I was able to buy my own. Actually had a six inch, the size I was working on, and even bought a ten inch in my travels. The

ten inch was nice but could never use it as you had to have a rotating stand needed to move with the system. That would be a little too much to hope for. Sold them both and by this time, with so many ways to do your observations on the computer it is not a necessity.

Still makes you wonder

and no matter what we do we will never be able to answer the really basic questions. How did it begin with nothing and how will it end with nothing? Where did those trillions of stars come from and will there be more or is this it? Who knows, I sure don't.

 - iii. repeated phone calls made with the intent to annoy, abuse, or harass.
- (2) If a creditor or debt collector receives a money judgment against you in court, state and federal laws may prevent the following types of income from being taken to pay the debt:


