The NHL has stated that they are planning on a January first start date because the league wants to award the Stanley Cup by mid July. This would allow for the NHL to begin the 2021-22 season at the traditional time and be prepared for the break in their schedule for the 2022 Winter Olympics. Also the leagues rights holder NBC is also the rights holder for the 2021 Summer Olympics and the NHL's TV coverage cannot overlap into the prime time Olympic coverage next summer..

NHL Commissioner Gary

Bettman said realignment such as an all Canadian division due to border crossing restrictions and mandated quarantines for visiting certain states in the United States.

"As it relates to the travel issue, which is obviously the great unknown, we may have to temporarily realign to deal with geography, because having some of our teams travel from Florida to California may not make sense. It may be that we're better off — particularly if we're playing a reduced schedule, which we're con-

templating — keeping it geographically centric and more divisional-based; and realigning, again on a temporary basis, to deal with the travel issues," Bettman said recently.

The NHL is also considering temporary hubs where teams would play in one city for multiple games. A team would stay in a hub city for 10-12 days and then going back home for a week to be with their your family.

Teams would be allowed to have some fans in their arenas in limited capacities as allowed by local and regional health authorities. That would allow teams to generate marginal gate revenue, with the hope that capacities could expand as the season moves along and a vaccine becomes prevalent, along with in-arena signage and advertising revenue from regional TV broadcasts.



An all Canadian division will prevent Jack Eichel and the Buffalo Sabres from renewing their rivalry with Auston Matthews and the Toronto Maple Leafs during the regular season. But the playoffs could be another story if the Sabres can get to the postseason.

Ask Rusty - Claim Now and Invest it, or Wait to Claim?

Dear Rusty: I'm 66 now and will be 67 in December and my question is this: Should I take Social Security now or wait? I'm still working full time and plan to work for a few more years, at least until I'm 70 but maybe longer. I was told by a friend that I should take my Social Security now and put the money into savings, invest it or use it. And, since I'm still working, I'm still contributing to Social Security, so that when I reach 70 I should get the full amount. I'm not sure if this is accurate so would like to hear your advice. Signed: Uncertain Lady

Dear Uncertain Lady: By taking your Social Security benefit now you will be locking into a benefit amount that is smaller than it would otherwise be if you wait longer to claim. You've already reached your Social Security full retirement age (FRA) of 66 and, since then, have been earning delayed retirement credits (DRCs) at the rate of .667% per month of delay past your FRA. You will continue to earn those DRCs - an 8% higher benefit for each

year you delay - until age 70 when your benefit will be 32% more than it would have been at 66 and 24% more than at age 67. Can you do better than that by taking a smaller benefit now and investing it? That depends upon what type of investing you intend to do. I cannot answer that for you, but a guaranteed 8% increase in your benefit amount for each year you delay, resulting in a much higher benefit for the rest of your life, is pretty hard to beat.

It is true that continuing to work now may help increase your Social Security benefit, but that's true regardless of when you claim. Your benefit will be based upon the 35 highest earning years over your lifetime (adjusted for inflation) at the time you claim. If, after your benefits start, your current earnings are higher than any of those used to originally compute your benefit, you will get credit for those higher earnings and your benefit will increase. Even after you claim benefits, Social Security examines your new earnings every year to see if you're entitled to

a higher benefit. And you will get credit for your current earnings even if you wait and continue to earn those DRCs for a much higher benefit later.

In the end, when to claim Social Security is a decision that should consider your current and future financial needs, and your health and estimated longevity. If you are working and don't need the extra money right now, and like the idea of a higher benefit later, after you are done working, then waiting to claim makes sense, especially if you're in good health and expect at least average longevity. Average life expectancy today for a woman your age is about 87, and if you attain at least the average, you'll collect much more in cumulative lifetime benefits by waiting longer to claim. Conversely, if your longevity outlook is less than average and you need the money now, claiming earlier is a perfectly good strategy.

One last thing to consider: if you are married and your husband is collecting benefits, you are eligible to file a "restricted application for spousal benefits only" which would let you collect a spouse benefit equal to half of your husband's FRA benefit amount, while allowing your own benefit to continue to grow until age 70. You can do this because you were born in 1953, before the cutoff date of January 2, 1954. The option was eliminated for anyone born after that date.

Over the course of the 51 years I have been in business, I have hired hundreds of people. Both men and women without discrimination and based on the ability to perform the position needing to be filled. Let us face the facts. Men and women are made different. Not that they are not equal, just physically built, structure wise, not the same. I had nothing to do with it, blame nature.

As far as brain power, who is to say one is smarter than the other. I am so impressed with the female anchors I see on television

and the vast knowledge they possess. You have to remember I lived way back

vinist remark. In spite of all my years as an employer, I personally have never been accused of that, as far as I know.

Looking back and recalling those years when being called a "male chauvinist pig" was a badge of honor for some men. I could see the anger that was being fueled by these males who did look down on women as inferior. I heard the language used by some in describing female employees. I did not like it then and do not like it now. There are still some MCP's around but they are slowly going away.

We have to realize and accept the fact that women are becoming the power. Not that they were not before as men have always been PW's. I never minded before and I do not now. God bless all women.

The Blotter Felonies

Friends Animal Society hopes to help make this a happy, healthy holiday for all family members by offering a few special precautions to protect our pets:

Those soulful eyes may tempt pet owners to give in to their begging critters, but sharing the fabulous feast can lead to trouble for pets.

Too much rich, fatty food, or simply new, unfamiliar foods can upset a pet's stomach--and even cause pancreatitis, which can be life-threatening--so owners should go easy on the tidbits. Poultry or ham bones can break up or splinter in a pet's stomach and be deadly, so dogs and cats should never be allowed to gnaw on them, and bones should go outside to the trash immediately. Other food-flavored items like plastic wrap, string, mesh or the pop-up timer can smell tempting

to curious pets, but can injure their stomachs if stolen and ingested.

Chocolate, especially that used for baking, is toxic for dogs, so it should be kept out of reach. Other common food items that can be poisonous to dogs include onions, raisins and grapes, so avoid sharing these.

It's a good idea to review these rules with any guests as well, since well-meaning holiday visitors might not know the potential harm caused by slipping treats to the pets under the table. If pet owners want to make the holiday special for their four-footed family members, they should plan ahead and have safe, delicious dog and cat treats on hand, like canned pet food or a tasty pet treats or fun toy. There are also many great recipes online for homemade dog and cat treats that are fun to make and extra special for our

pets.

A final note to consider is that many common decorative plants and flowers can be toxic for curious cats and dogs, so before buying plants or creating the centerpiece, it's wise to check to ensure that you're not using anything that could poison your pets. According to the American Veterinary Medical Association, some plant hazards include amaryllis, baby's breath, sweet William, some ferns, hydrangeas and others.
