

Bills Tune Up for Playoffs with 56 points against the Dolphins

The thinking going into last week final regular season game against the Miami Dolphins was get out of the game with no injuries. The expectation was that Josh Allen and the starters would play only a series or two before yielding to the backups. A win for Buffalo or a loss by the Pittsburgh Steeles who were playing the Cleveland Browns at the same time as the Bills game, would assure them of the second seed in the AFC playoffs. The team was chasing some significant statistical milestones; Josh Allen was also yards away from setting a new franchise record for passing yards and Stefon Diggs was leading the NFL in passing yards and completions. But these statistics were secondary to the health of the team going into the post season.

So it was surprising to see the starters play the entire first half against the Dolphins.. Apparently the Bills really wanted that #2 seed and didn't trust the Browns to help them get there. Allen completed 18 of 25 passes for 254 yards and three touchdowns in only 30 minutes. Diggs finished with 7 catches for 19 yards and the league lead in catches with 120.XXX

In the second half Matt Barkley completed 6 of 13 passes for 164 yards as the Bills scored another 28 points to 20 for Miami. The surprise star of the game was running back Antonio Williams who was promoted from the practice squad. He entered the game in the second half and literally bulldozed his way through the Dolphins defense for 63 yards and two touchdowns on 12 carries against the leagues number one defense.

But the brightest stars for the Bills were fifth string wide receiver Isaiah McKenzie with 65 yards on seven receptions for two touchdowns along with a spectacular 84 yard punt return for another TD and fourth string wide receiver Spencer Davis with 107 yards and a touchdown on a pair of receptions.

The Bills passing game has been strengthened by an improved offensive line which on many plays has given Josh Allen all the time needed to find an open receiver and fire a strike. The return of John Feliciano was key to the O line's resurgence. Allen's 224 passing yards Sunday gave him a new single season franchise record of 4,544 yards. He now holds the franchise records for passing touchdowns in a season (37), total touchdowns (45), completion percentage (69.2) and quarterback rating (107.2).

The improvement in the Bills passing game this season has been astounding. Stefon Diggs with 1,535 yard, Cole Beasley with 967, Gabrielle davis with 599 and John Brown (458) all had more receiving yards that the Bills 2017 team leader Dionte Thompson who had 430 yards which was Coach McDermott's first season with the team. Only one receiver that season had as many as three TD catches while this years team had seven

Ask Rusty - Did My Wife Get A "Notch Baby" Benefit Increase?

Dear Rusty: I was born in May of 1930, and my wife was born in April 1931. My wife claims she received an increase in her Social Security benefit due to the "Notch Baby" provision. Is she correct about this? Signed: Inquisitive Husband

Dear Inquisitive: Allow me to clarify for you what your wife is referring to, and you can use your own judgement on how to present the information to her. So-called "notch babies" are those Social Security recipients who were born between the years 1917 and 1921. Folks born in those years were affected by a Social Security issue which had to do with how Cost of Living Adjustments (COLAs) were computed. Here's what happened:

In 1972, when the Social Security Administration switched to automatic COLA increases based on the Consumer Price Index, they made an error in the automatic COLA computation formula which wasn't discovered for several years. During those sev-


eral years they awarded COLA increases using the incorrect formula which paid COLA at a higher level than appropriate. After discovering the error, and in an attempt to fix the issue, in the mid-1970s, Congress decided that those born before 1917 would be allowed to stay on the incorrect (more generous) formula, but COLA for those born after 1917 would use a corrected formula. However, that didn't sit well with SS beneficiaries born after 1917 because they were receiving less COLA than their counterparts born before 1917. So, in an attempt to mollify those Social Security beneficiaries born after 1917, Congress created a special "notch" formula for those born between 1917 and 1921. And those who were born between those dates were called "notch babies."

The new "notch baby" formula was not quite as generous as the incorrect formula being enjoyed by those born before 1917, but yet a bit more generous than the corrected COLA

formula which applied to anyone born after 1921 (and still exists today). Thus, "notch babies" do enjoy a slightly better COLA formula than other Social Security beneficiaries born after 1921.

Over the years, various attempts have been made to extend the notch baby end-year definition from 1921 to, for example, those born before 1927. And even as recently as 2019, a Congressional bill called the "Notch Fairness Act" attempted to provide restitution by extending the end date of the "notch" to 1926. But none of those attempts in Congress have ever succeeded in changing the definition of "notch babies" beyond the original 1970s Congressional definition to apply only to those born between 1917 and 1921. So, anyone born after 1921, including your wife, has COLA computed using the corrected formula, not the "notch baby" formula.

Eddie worked his way through college as a sanitary worker. Garbage man as we used to call them. In the years of doing that he found many valuable treasures in people's trash. With that he became knowledgeable of antiques, collectables and their value. When Eddie finished college and ready to embark on a new career he came over to my house. He had been offered a job as a locomotive fireman for the Railroad. It was on a diesel engine. That meant it was a job that was not a job. There are no fires on a diesel engine. It was a do nothing job that the Union insisted had to be filled. He was excited about it but I was not. I told him he was better than that. It sounds good but what a waste. He agreed to talk to a guidance counselor about other openings which he did. He came back the next day and said they are looking for school teachers and he wanted to try that. This was a life changing moment.

Ed became an eighth

grade Science teacher at school 88 on the east side. which later became Campus West. He did that till he retired. I mention this as I know how many lives he affected with his teaching. He was beloved by his students who to this day remember him as being one of the best teachers they ever had. Many of those students have sent condolences to his family with the kindest of remarks about what a great man he was and how he meant so much to them in their growing up years. It helps to know he was instrumental in forming good things in the lives of so many kids.

It is now time to say goodbye to my kid brother. He is at peace now. Those left behind must grieve. If

on snow and ice, especially if snow is falling at a fast rate, and your pet can easily lose his sense of direction. Pets may also panic during a snowstorm and run away; many pets are lost during the winter months. Remember to keep current identification on your pet at all times!

*Keep Pets At Home: Never leave your pet alone in a car during cold weather. A car can act as a refrigerator in the winter, holding in the cold. Your pet could literally freeze to

*Always Dry Pet's Wet Feet: Thoroughly wipe off your pet's legs and stomach when she comes in and out of the rain, snow or ice. Check her sensitive foot pads, which may be bleeding from snow or ice encrusted in them. Your pet may also pick up salt and other chemicals on her feet accidentally. These chemicals could hurt her if she swallows them while licking her feet.

*Lay Straw for Dogs' Visits Outdoors: Can't get your dog to wear booties? Lay straw on top of snow for trips outdoors by dogs reluctant to step out onto a freezing surface to relieve

themselves.

*Check Cars for Cats: During the winter, stray or neglected cats outdoors sometimes sleep under the hood of the car where it's warm and comfortable. If you start the motor, cats could get caught in or flung about by the fan belt, causing serious injury or death. To prevent this, bang loudly on the hood and sides of your car before turning on the ignition to give the cat a chance to escape.

*Keep Outdoor 'Sessions' Short: Take your dog outside only for as long as it takes for him to relieve himself. Dogs, particularly

small, short-haired breeds like Chihuahuas and terriers, suffer from the cold despite their seemingly warm fur coats. Live within Buffalo city limits? Don't forget Buffalo's new laws pertaining to tethering dogs in inclement weather..

*Bathe Pets Only When Necessary: Your pet runs the chance of catching a cold when wet, especially in cold weather. If you absolutely must bathe your pet, consult a professional groomer or veterinarian.

*Keep Pets Warm: Limit the clipping of your pet's hair in the cold winter months, keeping your pet as warm as possible. Brush your pet daily in lieu of clipping to keep your pet's coat healthy, shiny, clean and mat-free. Make sure your pet has a warm place to sleep far away from outside drafts.


*Hungry Pets: Speak to your veterinarian about increasing your pet's supply of food, particularly protein, to keep his fur thick and healthy through the winter months. Inquire about vitamin and oil supplements.

*ANTIFREEZE IS POISON TO PETS: ANTIFREEZE, EVEN IN SMALL DOSES, IS A LETHALPOISON FOR DOGS AND CATS! Because of its sweet taste, animals are attracted to it. Be sure to clean up spills thoroughly, and consider switching to an animal-friendly antifreeze. Ensure that, if you store Antifreeze in a garage, shed, or other places accessible to your pets, it is well out of pets' reach.


