Riverwork's Ferris Wheel

Buffalo Riverworks is planning a new Ferris Wheel that may be here as soon as early summer. The structures before it was known for holding a large 200 ft. silo. As a result, the inspectors of the project are positive it can withstand the ride's weight. The fast winds from the river's current are also a consideration. That's

why the base of the wheel will be stabilised with over million pounds of solid concrete. Engineers estimate the ferris wheel to be over 100 ft. tall and there will be ziplines on boths sides for added stability.

When Bill Casale, General Manager of all properties of Buffalo Riverworks, was asked why the wheel couldn't have been built larger, he said that the city's building codes would not allow it to be larger than its neighboring structures. The staff at Riverworks hopes it will bring new life to the area after the pandemic's hardships.

Three "Teen Vaccine" Clinics Planned For May 1st

After securing a supply of Pfizer COVID-19 vaccine late last week, the Erie County Department of Health (ECDOH)

schedthree COVID-19 vaccination PODs especially for 16- and 17-year-olds anď their families on May 1.

Pfizer COVID-19 vaccine will be available for teens ages 16 and 17; Moderna COVID-19 doses will be available for anyone age 18 and older. Sites will be SUNY ECC North in Williamsville, SUNY ECC South in Orchard Park, and McKinley High School in Buffalo.

We reached out to local pharmacies and New York State Department of Health after initially hearing that local health departments would not receive more Pfizer vaccine until early May," said Commissioner of Health Dr. Gale Burstein. "Each vaccinated person gets us one step close to

the end of this pandemic, and with 16- and 17-year-olds eligible for Pfizer vaccine, we are very eager to coordinate these special PODs for these teenagers their families."

"This is a crucial service for our department to offer before events like proms, graduations and other celebrations this spring and summer," Dr. Burstein continued. "Vaccination for these high school students also provides another layer of protection against ČOVID-19 in school, sports, work and household settings."


West Side **April 26, 2021**

Will Taking 401K Distributions Affect My Social Security Benefit? - Ask Rusty

Dear Rusty: I'm 63 and retired from work, but not drawing Social Security. I have accumulated just over \$300,000 in my rollover 401K IRA. My wife is still working full time, so we have medical, dental and vision coverage. I have a few questions:

1) When I take IRA distributions throughout the year, do those dollar amounts get reported to Social Security as income?

2) If not, will my SS benefit change (will I be penalized?) for not working and having zero income as I continue to withdraw investments and show no income?

3) If my benefit will drop because of the last few years of no income, would it be advisable to start drawing Social Security now? Signed: Plan-

ning Ahead Dear Planning Ahead: Whenever you decide to claim Social Security, they will compute your benefit amount from your lifetime earnings history. They will adjust your earnings for inflation in all years prior to the year you turned 60, find the 35 years in which you had the highest (inflation-adjusted) earnings, and use that "average indexed monthly earnings" (AIME) amount to determine your Primary Insurance Amount (PIA), which is your benefit entitlement at your full retirement age (FRA). From there, your age when you claim determines your final Social Security payment amount. Born in 1958 your FRA is 66 plus 8 months, and that is the age at which you will get 100% of your PIA. If you claim benefits before your FRA, your payment will be reduced; and if you wait until after your FRA to claim your benefit will be increased. If you wait until you are 70 to claim, your SS payment will reach maximum (about 27% more than your FRA benefit amount). Now, to

your specific questions:
1) Distributions taken from your 401k or IRA are not reported to Social Security as "earnings" and do not count toward your Social Security benefit entitlement.

2) If you have already retired from working, having zero earnings now won't further affect your final SS payment amount because your benefit will be baseď upon your 35 highest-earning years. However, if you have a recent benefit estimate from Social Security, that estimate assumed that you would continue to earn at the same level you most recently reported to the IRS until you reached your FRA. So, if you got the estimate while you were still working (or shortly thereafter), the estimate is higher than your actual benefit will be. If you received the estimate a year or more after you stopped working, the estimate is more accurate. In any case, your 401K withdrawals will not count as SS earnings.

3) Claiming now would result in a permanently reduced SS benefit amount because you haven't yet reached your full retirement age. But claiming now wouldn't be a hedge against your current lack of earnings, because your benefit will be based upon the highest earning 35 years over your lifetime.

If you don't already have a full 35 years of SS-covered earnings they will still use 35 years in the benefit calculation, adding \$0 earnings for enough years to make it 35. If that is the case, you could offset some of those zero years in your lifetime history by returning to work now, thus increasing your benefit when you claim. If you already have at least 35 years of earnings, enjoy your retirement!

One last thing to consider: if you predecease your wife, at her FRA she will be entitled to 100% of the benefit you were receiving at your death (if that is more than her own). In other words, when you claim your benefit will affect the amount your wife can get as your widow. The longer you wait to claim, the higher your wife's survivor benefit from you will be

I thought she went to the store and bought this new sister for me. However by the time she had the third baby after me, I kind of knew what was going on. Even in the movies back then nothing was sexual. In those old movies they kissed sometimes but that was it. I recall seeing the first movie with cleavage. Jane Russell in the movie "The Outlaw". It was a hit and must see among my friends as she had to top of her breast showing. This was considered a "dirty" flick. So we all rushed to see it.

My two oldest brothers were in the service so they could not offer any information, and my older sister just would not talk about it. So sex education back in the forties was to learn on your own, literally. You are on your own and we learned how to hold our own as young boys do. It starts out when you are very young and you shimmy up a pole, you get this good feeling. It was a really nice feeling and no explanation as to why. Then even at a young age that feeling sometimes happened when you were just with a female. Nothing really sexual however even in conversation if the subject went in a certain direction or a word would be said, it would make it happen. Not even talking about kissing or touching, yet. That came later. Even talking we had to get past the suggestive words that would trigger that feeling. That fuzzy warm feeling you get in your belly that usually spikes things to happen to certain parts of your body. It is due in part due to growing up with no direct education on this subject. They certainly did not teach it in my school. So it was learn as you go
