National Fuel Says Call Before You Dig

April is Safe Digging Month. In recognition, National Fuel is reminding homeowners and professional contractors to Call Before You Dig. New York state law requires residents to call 811 – a free service – before digging to prevent accidental damage to underground utility lines. Homeowners and contractors should call 811 at least two and no more than 10 business days in advance of the start of their projects. Digging



without knowing the approximate location of underground utilities can result in serious injuries, service disruptions, and costly repairs. Homeowners can also visit call811.com to learn more.

The national 811 phone number connects callers with local One Call Centers. Operators record the excavation locations and notify National Fuel. National Fuel then dispatches professional locators to mark the approximate positioning of lines for free.

It's a fast, easy way to be safe and protect those within the vicinity of the project.

"All excavation projects– even small or shallow digging home-improvement projects like planting trees and shrubs or installing a fence or mailbox require a call," said Emily Ciralo, spokesperson for National Fuel. "Many of the pipeline leaks and emergencies we respond to each year occur when homeowners and businesses dig on their properties without knowing the loca-

100 Season's Baseball

Before the first pitch was thrown on Opening Day last week of the Major League Season, three men teamed up to publish a local baseball book that might take a reader six months to finish. In "The 100 Seasons of Buffalo Baseball: 1857-2020," James H. Overfield, the son of Buffalo Bisons baseball historian, Joseph, continued his father's work and with the help of Michael J. Billoni and Brian M. Frank, produced a complete history of Baseball in Buffalo. It's already a hit with local baseball lovers who have followed the Bisons since the City was awarded a team after an eight year absence.

The book is an update of his father's original work, "The 100 Seasons of Buffalo Baseball" published in 1985. The elder Overfield served as the teams' historian after coming across some important papers on baseball from 1878, before Buffalo even became a City. Former Buffalo Bisons General Manager Michael Billoni recently sat down with Buffalo Rocket to talk about baseball and the making of this book that took nearly three years to complete.

"I got involved in this project because of the man Joe Overfield was to Bison Baseball," said Billoni, proudly to this newspaper. "I received a call from Jim Overfield, telling me he had published articles that his father had written in the late 1980's and 1990's before his passing in 2000. He wanted to follow-up his father's work by publishing another book on Bison Baseball. I immediately said yes."

The younger Overfield

found work, becoming a History Professor at the University of Vermont. But like many expatriates, maintained a strong, emotional attachment to his birthplace. "My dad had many talents. He was an excellent gardener, youth baseball coach and parent," he wrote on page two, A Life Well Lived. "But to call his skills in golf or bowling excellent would be an exaggeration."

Billoni, sometimes referred to as Buffalo's P.T. Barnum of Bison Baseball, served as General Manager for the team from 1983, the year new team Owner Bob Rich purchased the Bisons, until 1992. With attendance dwindling since 1979 in War Memorial Stadium, Bob Rich asked Billoni, a sports-writer for the Courier-Express, "how would you like to join my team?"

Billoni had no experience running a sports team. He recalls talking to Channel 7 Sports Anchor Rick Azar about the offer. Azar quickly asked "What are you crazy? Tell Rich you'll do it." With a new parent team in Cleveland, Billoni worked with

Rich to bring in the crowds. Post-game concerts became legendary. The Beach Boys and a Jerry Lee Lewis-Fats Domino concerts helped bring in more fans. But the highlight of the year was when the Bisons received a call long-distance from Hollywood, wanting to know if the City had a "big ballpark with a lot of seats?" "Yes" came the response. That was the beginning of when THE NATURAL came to Buffalo.

The book covers every season of Buffalo Baseball, except for the years 1971-1978, when the "Rockpile" went vacant after the Bills left for Orchard Park. Luke Easter and Ollie Carnegie are prominently in Chapter two and Billoni also made note of a famous Buffaloe who once lived along East Swan Street, in Mark Twain, who served as editor of the Buffalo Express for 18 months, on the third base line.

With Buffalo Mayor James D. Griffin going to bat for Bob Rich, the Bisons got a new ballpark by 1998 and named it Pilot Field. It was thought to be the beginning of the whole new renaissance that has brought Downtown back to the days when our City was once the Western End of the Erie Canal. The port to Cities like Cleveland, Detroit and Chicago. A time when baseball was the only game in town.

Ask Rusty- Can I Still Suspend My Social Security Benefits?

Dear Rusty: Is it still possible to suspend Social Security benefits for a time? And, if so, how often?
Signed: Curious Senior

Dear Curious Senior:
If you have already reached your full retirement age and are receiving Social Security benefits which you claimed earlier, you can voluntarily suspend your benefits to earn Delayed Retirement Credits (DRCs) and get a higher benefit amount when your payments are resumed. While your benefit payments are suspended, you will earn an additional .67% for each full month of suspension (8% per full year of suspension). If you wish to do so, you can suspend until you are 70 years old, after which you will no longer receive Delayed Retirement Credits, and your benefit will have reached maximum.

At age 70, Social Security will automatically restart your benefit at the higher amount, as appropriate for the number of DRCs you earned while suspended. If you prefer or need the money sooner, you can request that your benefit be restarted earlier than age 70.

You can voluntarily suspend and restart benefits more than once if that is necessary, but the process requires some lead time to stop/restart benefits and there are other important factors to consider. If you suspend your personal SS retirement benefit now to gain a higher payment amount later, while you are suspended no other benefits based on your record (such as a spousal or other dependent benefits) will be paid. And, if you currently have your Medicare premium deducted from your Social Security benefit, suspending your SS benefits will require you to make alternate arrangements for direct payment of your Medicare premium(s). You would need to pay your Medicare premium via mail or by direct withdrawal from your bank account, or by charging a credit/debit card. If you decide to suspend your Social Security payments, you

will need to contact Social Security directly at 1.800.772.1213 (or call your local SS office) to do so. When requesting your benefit suspension, you can also make arrangements through Social Security to pay your Medicare premium separately.

When I Was A Kid Part Five

It snows a lot in Buffalo. That's nothing new as it has happened for as long as anyone can remember. Buffalo to this day is still known for the huge amount of snow we receive from what is called lake effect conditions. We deal with it during the winter months as best we could. Snow plows, sand, salt, parking restrictions, and a hope of a warm day to melt some of the accumulation. We have learned to deal with it. However it is much easier today than it was when I was a kid.

All the North/South streets on the West Side were one way and parking was allowed on both sides. Most homes were doubles with two families living in each house. Garages were almost nonexistent. This meant almost every parking spot on both sides of the street were taken. Fortunately not everyone owned a vehicle and if they did it

was one per family. Still parking on the street near your house was premium. My dad's biggest problem in life was finding a parking spot near our house.

Picture if you would parking on both sides of the street, fully occupied and we have a major snow storm. Rambling down the middle of the street is a garbage truck with a snow plow attached to the front. These drivers are used to stop and go on their regular daily routes of garbage collection. Driving with a plow in front is not their cup of tea. So here they go barreling down these narrow streets clearing a path wide enough down the middle to enable traffic to flow.

What this leaves behind is cars on both sides of the street buried in snow. Next step, go out and say good morning to your neighbors as you shovel out your vehicles together like a

chain gang. Up and down the street were these men and young boys like me and my brothers, making it possible to free our snow covered means of transportation so we can use them that day. It was especially crucial if dad had to get to work. That meant getting up early to accomplish our mission of freeing up our one and only.

Now these were the war years. I remember the day they bombed Pearl Harbor. My dad said that it was serious as we heard it on the radio but we had no idea of the consequences. The United States was engaged in an all out war. My oldest brother enlisted in the Air Force almost immediately. My next oldest went into the navy. For the next four years those who were left, had to fight the war on the home front. Almost everything we did on a daily basis was to contribute to the war effort. Automobile manufacturers stopped making cars and made tanks and jeeps instead. Food and supplies were rationed. You got food stamps but not for free food but to limit what food you received. Meat was precious and scarce. If you complained the response was always "don't you know there is a war going on"?

Everyone was encouraged to have what was called a "Victory garden" to help in the food demand. We had a large yard so we had a nice garden. My dad knew little to nothing about gardening. My Italian grandfather from Sicily did, and helped as best he could. His specialty was a fig tree. We all did what we could as we did not know if we would win the war, so we made a major effort to do what we could. They had scrap drives where us kids would go looking for any scrap metal and toss it in a scrap pile at our School 18 playground. We had a massive pile of scrap that they would come and pick up for recycling.

Many of the factories here in Buffalo became

defense plants producing war materials. Where the Home Depot is now located on Elmwood was a huge airplane manufacturing facility. You would see all these new airplanes lined up outside being readied to ship to the war front. Same thing with Bell Aerosystem in Niagara Falls and Curtiss/Wright

on Kenmore. It was really neat to see all these fighter planes coming off the assembly line and sitting there waiting to do what they were meant to do. Win the war. And that we did. It was hopefully a once in a lifetime experience. Never want to see that again. Too many did not return. Never again.

- Of those homeowners who plan to dig for projects like landscaping, installing a fence, mailbox, or building a deck, pond, or patio, 36% will put themselves and their communities at risk by not calling 811 before digging.
