

Blue Collar Working Cats Protect Barns, Warehouses, Nurseries, Wineries, Garages, and More

They're a little too temperamental to be considered perfect, in-home, companion cats. Some are even feral. What's to be done about these categories of cats when agencies like the SPCA Serving Erie County receive them as surrendered animals, or as part of an animal hoarding situation or other type of animal rescue or cruelty case?

For more than a decade, East Aurora-based Feral Cat FOCUS, Inc. (FCF) has provided an answer for this agency and other cat welfare organizations in the state. Historically called various names such as Adopt-A-Barn-Cat program, Adopt-A-Working-Cat program, and more, the FCF Blue Collar Working Cats program encompasses more of the establishments that have taken advantage of the loyal presence of these hard-working cats!

One of the founders of FCF, Edie Offhaus, says, "These are cats of various temperaments. In some

cases, they are not exactly feral, but they're unsocial. This program is a beautiful adoption alternative for these types of cats who have nowhere else to go."

According to Offhaus,

Blue Collar Working Cats 🕻 been have placed vari n New ious York State establishments including wineries, warehouses, nurseries and greenhouses, barns and stables, garages, and more. "We place cats in all parts of Western New York, and assist agencies all over New York State, even some in the New York City area," Offhaus states, adding that they do not accept privately-owned cat surrenders but are willing to help pet owners set up a Blue Collar Working Cats environment outside of their residences.

To date, more than 600 establishments house a minimum of two Blue Collar Working Cats. The purpose? "Rodent control, plain and simple," Offhaus says. "Sometimes the mere presence of Blue Collar Working Cats is enough to keep rodents away from perceived food sources or food and beverage storage areas."

The SPCA Serving Erie County is honored to be one of the organizations with which FCF works in its Blue Collar Working Cats program. Several hundred cats who were not viable adoption candidates found new lives through FCF and this program, and the SPCA is indebted and eternally grateful to the team at FCF for dedicating so many of their resources to these special cats with high work ethics.



Can I Get a Higher Benefit Now Because I'm Older? - Ask Rusty

Dear Rusty: I started getting Social Security at age 62 and I am now 77. Can I get a higher benefit now that I'm older? Signed: Needy Senior

Dear Needy Senior: Probably not. When you first start collecting your Social Security retirement benefits (e.g., at age 62 or any other age) your SS benefit amount is permanently established and will change thereafter only if:

- A Cost of Living Adiustment (COLA) is granted (which is usually done annually, starting with your payment in Janu-ary of each year). There have only been 3 years in the last four decades that a COLA increase didn't automatically occur. This year's COLA increase was
- You later became eligible for a higher spousal benefit because your husband started collecting benefits after you first claimed, and your benefit amount at your full retirement age (FRA) was less than 50% of your husband's FRA benefit amount.
 - You later became eli-

gible for a higher survivor benefit because your husband passed away and his Social Security benefit was more than you were receiving (you would need to apply separately for your survivor benefit).

 You had later earnings which were higher than any of the 35 years over your lifetime used to originally compute your benefit when you first applied. Past years earnings are adjusted for inflation, so original earnings amounts in prior years are increased to today's dollar value to see if your recent earnings are higher.

If you are working, Social Security monitors your earnings (and your contributions through payroll taxes) every year to see if

you are due a benefit increase and, if appropriate, it is automatically given. COLA increases are also automatically given effective with each December's benefit (paid in January) if such an increase is appropriate due to inflation as measured by the national Consumer Price Index. So, the only other possible way your current benefit could be increased now is if 1) you didn't claim a spousal benefit when you were eligible and you are still eligible because your husband is still living, or, 2) your husband is now deceased, and you didn't apply for a higher survivor benefit you were entitled to when he died. If either of those are true, then you should contact Social Security to request your higher bene-

You do not, however, get a benefit increase simply because you are now older than you were when you first claimed Social Security. COLA will slightly increase your benefit automatically most years, but unless one or more of the other conditions above apply, your benefits won't change further as you age.

In the good old Summertime.

Last Sunday we experienced the Summer Solstice, the first day of summer. My late brother Eddie, who was an eight-grade science teacher before he retired, used to treat his friends on social media with an explanation of why the seasons change. 




