Spotlight: Xavier Mann



City Honors Baseball Champion and Hertel North Park Youth Baseball League Star athlete Xavier Mann.

Xavier Mann, a stand-out player in the Hertel North Buffalo Youth Baseball League for many years now, has taken the next step. Even when he makes contact with a baseball at home plate and runs to first base, he takes that next step. Last week, about a dozen other players with him took that step.

The City Honors High School Centaurs won the Class B-1 Sectional Championship in New York State at the Johnnie B. Wiley Sports Stadium over seventh seeded Olean, 5-2 last Friday afternoon, their first title in 35 years and only the third time a City School has won since 1970.

Xavier Mann wasn't even born yet. Neither were about 12 other teammates,

playing with him on this day. But the roster, held in the hands of long-time City Honors Manager John McMahon, a former team catcher, was sprinkled with "little league baseball" experience from inside this City. The place near where The Natural came to town.

Xavier Mann became a Champion last week, along with teammates, Matthew Cambria, Connor Keifer, Liam Meyers, Ivory Parker, Luc Thimot, Quinn Mahoney, Nathaniel Gilbert, Quinn Langdon, Michael Cambria, Eamon Langdon, Adam Slater, Carlos Perales and Charlie Rittling. All these players came of age last week, after first learning how to play the game itself in the Hertel North Park Youth Baseball

League and that tiny Park called Shoshone.

"I'm glad I could help our School win," said Mann recently. "It's a great victory and one I'll possibly remember for the rest of my life." The Sophomore short-stop went two for three at the plate with a big double that tied the game at 1-1 early. Senior Matt Cambria went the distance on the mound, striking out eight Huskies, and worked with catcher Connor Keifer to control the game, even in a cold drizzle midway through the game.

"Mr. McMahon is a good coach," said Xavier. "He's very hands on and can relate to us because he was once a former player. It feels great to win a championship." There's no question a City High School Baseball coach like John McMahon at City Honors benefits of teaching his players the game beyond their little league careers. Congratulations.

At Shoshone Park, the regular season for 53 boys and girls teams are finished in league play and await playoff action. Every team makes the playoffs and all will be decided in a double elimination competition. If you lose once, you're still okay. But lose again to another team and your season is over. Here are your Division Winners.

Major Boys are the Cubs, finishing undefeated at 14-0. Triple AAA are Mariners, Double AA are the Cardinals, Rookie Boys are the Royals, Major Girls could be the Astros or Rockies, Minor Girls are the Giants and Rookie Girls are the Angels. It should be pretty exciting for July in North Buffalo.

Felonies

North Buffalo
June 27, 2021
Jewett Parkway – Victim states that the defendant showed up to the residence unannounced. Victim states she tried to break up with her boyfriend and attempted to leave her home, but the defendant grabbed and held her, preventing her from leaving home. 

Why Can't I Get Survivor Benefits from My Husband? – Ask Rusty

Dear Rusty: My husband and I were only married 5 years before he passed away from cancer. I am 61 and was told by SS that I don't qualify to receive his survivor benefits because we weren't married long enough, and because I made more money than him when he was alive. I still work fulltime and plan to continue until my full retirement age. Am I able to collect any of his benefits? Why can his daughter collect his benefits, but I cannot? **Signed: Frustrated Widow**

Dear Frustrated: You were given partially incorrect information by Social Security because you were married long enough to collect a survivor benefit, but there are also other rules which might affect your eligibility:

- You cannot have remarried before age 60 and be currently married.

- You cannot collect full survivor benefits if you exceed Social Security's annual "earnings limit." That you made more money than your husband (and are presumably entitled to

a higher personal SS benefit) isn't material, but your earnings from work could be.

If you didn't remarry before age 60 and remain married, and if you don't earn too much money, you are eligible to collect a survivor benefit as your husband's widow. You can even claim your survivor benefit (only) while allowing your personal SS benefit to grow (if desired, up to age 70 when it reaches maximum). So, you may be eligible to collect a survivor benefit from your husband now, but if you're working full time, you may make too much money to be able to collect it at this time.

Social Security has an "earnings test" which applies to those collecting early benefits and which limits how much you can earn before they take benefits away. For 2021, the annual earnings limit is \$18,960 and if you earn more than that they will take away benefits equal to \$1 for every \$2 you are over the limit. That could mean you'll owe them more than you're entitled

to in benefits, which would mean no benefits would be paid. Here's an example: Say you make \$60,000 per year working full time. If you collect the survivor benefit and because you haven't yet reached your full retirement age (FRA), you'll be subject to the earnings limit of \$18,960. At this earnings level you would exceed the limit by about \$41,000. Half of that amount would be about \$20,500, and SS would require you to repay them that amount from your SS benefits. Depending upon your survivor benefit amount, that could disqualify you from receiving monthly benefits.

As you can see from this example, if you work full time but do not significantly exceed the annual earnings limit, you may be able to collect at least some of your survivor benefits, but I cannot answer that without knowing your annual earnings and approximately what your survivor benefit would be. For clarity, the earnings test no longer applies once you reach your full retirement age.

Regarding your husband's daughter collecting a survivor benefit from him: a surviving minor child of the deceased can collect a survivor benefit until they are 18 (or 19 if still in high school). An adult disabled child who was disabled before age 22, is also eligible to collect a survivor benefit from a deceased parent.

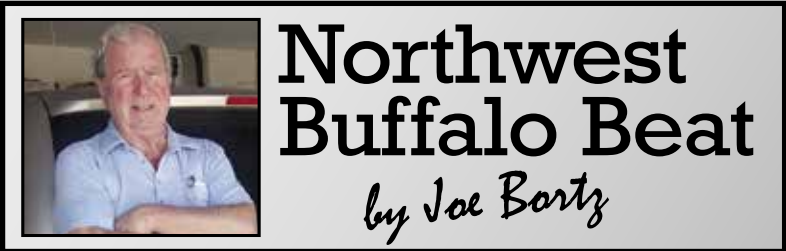

End the day with a Bang.



America's Bicentennial — July 4, 1976.

Seems like every year there is a fourth of July. Just the way it is and there is no way to change it. Fortunately, here in America it is a date to remember as it is the day we gained our Independence from England. As the late Billy Fuccillo would have said, "it was huge". So every year we celebrate this date with parades and most of all, fireworks. There are more fireworks displayed on this day than any other day of the year. Fourth of July has become synonymous with the night light being lit with bright colors and loud bangs. It is a tradition and done both publicly on a large scale and residential-

ly in backyards across this great nation. Personally, I have lived through many of these special events on this day and of course they include fireworks and how dangerous they can be. The furthest back I could recall when as a kid, the house three doors down from us burned down as somehow or another the roof was ignited by an errant spark from a domestic firework. Talk about a firework display. This was a two-family wooden structure, and it went fast. Second fourth of July that I vividly remember was when one of those explosions that you see in the sky,

came down and exploded on the ground amid the admiring crowd. Do not recall the year but my children were young. Think we had about six at the time. Every year Riverside Park had a huge fireworks display. Large crowds would gather and lay on blankets, they had concessions and it was an all-day event. Back then, the fireworks were fired so they would go off over your head. I think since then they have stopped that practice. On this day, one of these many incendiaries displays you see in the sky, went up and then came down and exploded in the crowd. Like a bomb going off. The immediate human response for that is to run and get as far away from the danger as possible, which people did. My responsibility was to see that my family was safe. My kids, as most around us, ran off in different directions. In the ensuing chaos I had to round them up one by one and tell them to remain by a large tree located nearby. We did that till we were all together again. Not so for many who suffered burns and were trampled by the crowd. The rest of the night was filled with sirens and rescue personnel attending to the victims. A night to remember. Then there was the fourth of July in 1976, the big one,

the 200-year anniversary of the birth of our nation. This one had to outdo every other fourth. How better to spend it than in New York city? It was supposed to be bigger than New Year's Eve and the ball drop. The whole town was going to be lit up with tons of visual delights and the loud noises that accompany them. This was going to be a momentous occasion. My daughter, who lives in Manhattan, had planned for us, my wife and I and two of our youngest children, to watch from a boat. We were going to be out in New York harbor along with thousands of other floating crafts. This way we could see the ring of fireworks from all over the big apple. We were supposed to be fed and entertained as we understood it. Turned out to be a disaster. They forgot to load the food. Since the harbor was loaded with so many boats, it was impossible to return. The only food on this boat, with hundreds of passengers, was hot dogs and candy bars. Due to the large crowd, they had to be rationed and some got nothing. We boarded at five and returned after midnight, hungry. The highlight of that night was when the fireworks began. The captain turned the ship sideways

to get a better view of the city. The people of the boat all ran to the viewing side causing the ship to lean way over that side. It was in danger of capsizing until those with leveler heads ran to the opposite side to even out the load. That would have really been a night to remember, swimming in the Hudson River on the fourth of July. It would not be the fourth without fireworks and as dangerous as they are, and can be, we love them. As we sit there watching them go off one by one and sigh in awe, waiting with bated breath for the grand finale. That is when the whole sky lights up with color and brightness. Louder and louder booms tell you it is reaching its climax. Then the stillness and silence, the smell of sulfur tells you the fourth is over for another year and the crowd slowly disperses. But I guarantee you, without fail, the fourth of July will again return next year. Do you have a birthday greeting you would like to see here?
