Taste of Buffalo This Weekend



Taste of Buffalo 2021 will be this weekend, July 10th and July 11th.

After receiving updated guidance from New York State following the lifting of pandemic-related restrictions on capacity for public gatherings that was announced by Gov. Andrew Cuomo on Tuesday, admission to The Taste of Buffalo presented by Tops will again be free and open to everyone for this year's festival.

The Taste will no longer be divided into sessions and will be open for its usual festival hours, 11 a.m. to 9 p.m. Saturday, July 10, and 11 a.m. to 7 p.m. Sunday,

July 11. As in years past, food and beverage tickets will be available to purchase using cash, Master-Card, or Visa, upon arrival at one of two ticket tents at the festival.

Those individuals who have already purchased admission tickets via Tasteof-Buffalo.com will automatically receive a full refund. Anyone who purchased an admission ticket to the Tops Markets Session at a Tops store will receive a full \$20 refund at any Tops area location. Refunds will be issued at the customer

service desk through July 11, 2021. Anyone wishing to take their Tops voucher to the Taste of Buffalo itself may do so and will receive \$25 in food tickets at the ticket tents at any point during the festival.

This year's Taste will include 26 restaurants, food trucks, and wineries, in addition to a host of participating sponsors situated throughout Niagara Square and along Delaware Avenue north to Huron Street. For further information on this year's festival, including Continued on page six.

It is exciting for North Buffalo to have this addition to our community as I welcome everyone to experience all that they will have to offer!





When Should I Claim My Survivor Benefit? – Ask Rusty

Dear Rusty: My wife passed away in 2014. I'm 60 years old and have been retired since August 2020. I know I'm entitled to survivor benefits, but my question relates to when to file for them. To say the information online is confusing is an understatement. Some background. My wife was born in 1960 and would have turned 62 next year. I was born in 1960 and turned 60 this past April. I do not plan on taking my SS until age 67 (I could wait until age 70 if it is more beneficial). I have not remarried. When should I file for survivor benefits to maximize the benefit? Signed: Surviving Husband

Dear Surviving Husband: Survivor benefits reach maximum when you reach your full retirement age (67), but you can claim a reduced survivor benefit as early as age 60. The amount of your survivor benefit will be determined by a) the benefit your wife had earned up to the month she passed, and b) your age when you claim the survivor benefit. At age 67 you would get 100% of the amount your wife was entitled to when she passed; if you claim at age 60 you would only get 71.5% of the benefit amount your wife had earned up to her death. The reduction may, or may not be, acceptable to you depending on your personal circumstances.

First, you should be aware that if you claim your survivor benefit before your full retirement age (FRA) and return to work, you'll be subject to Social Security's earnings test which limits how much you can earn before SS takes away some of your benefits. The earnings limit for 2021 is \$18,960 (changes annually) and if that is exceeded SS will take back benefits equal to \$1 for every \$2 you are over the limit. The earnings limit applies until you reach your full retirement age, although the limit is much higher and the penalty less severe in the year you attain FRA. If your earnings prior to your FRA are high enough, it could disqualify you from receiving a survivor benefit. Of course, if you are not working and do not plan to return to work, the earnings test is not a concern.

are some things to consider: • Claiming your survivor

benefit now at age 60 would permit you to receive 71.5% of the survivor benefit for at least 7 years (until you reach your FRA), or perhaps longer until you are 70. Although the survivor benefit would be reduced, claiming it at age 60 would also permit you to delay taking your own Social Security benefit until age 70 when your personal benefit would be 24%more than it will be at your FRA. The above would be prudent if your age 70 (or 67) benefit amount will be higher than the survivor benefit you would be entitled to at vour full retirement age.

• If your survivor benefit at your FRA would be more than your own benefit will be at age 70, then it would be wisest to maximize your survivor benefit. To maximize your survivor benefit you must wait until age 67 (your FRA) to claim it. If your full survivor benefit will be the highest you can get, then maximizing it by waiting until your FRA to claim it is your smartest move.

So, as you can see, you have a choice of when to claim your survivor benefit. If your personal benefit at age 70 would be higher, it would be wise to claim your survivor benefit first (at age 60) and collect the reduced survivor benefit until you later switch to your own higher benefit. But if your survivor benefit at maximum would be more than your age 70 benefit, then waiting until your full retirement age of 67 to claim your survivor benefit would be your best choice.



Although we all love and enjoy our fireworks, they are dangerous. Our delight in watching them is obvious as we will travel anywhere, wait in long traffic lines, and do whatever it takes to see them. It is a must do on the fourth of July. We just must see fireworks. Even if you stay home, it has become a neighborhood thing as neighbors try to outdo each other in their backyards. Again, you are playing with fire, and we know that can provide injuries.

That point was proven this week when a 24-yearold goalie for the NHL Blue Jackets was killed by a domestic display of fireworks. Freak accident, yes, but it does happen. The firework season is from June 21st to July 21st every year. We are still in this year's season as of this writing, but we can take facts from other years.

In the year 2020, 18 people died from firework related incidents. That was up a little from 2019 as that year 15 died. In 2020, 15,600 Americans were admitted to Emergency rooms for injuries sustained by mostly domestic fireworks. Point is they can be dangerous, and people should proceed with caution when lighting that fuse. Personally, as a kid I burnt my hand when a roman candle went off in the wrong direction. Carelessly I was holding it when it shot out the back end. Like any dumb kid you think it could not happen to you, but it does.

Last week one of the things I mentioned was a display going up and fell into a crowd with many children. Sorry, but it did happen and probably more than just that specific day. I just happened to be there. We need our fix on incendiary displays and loud bangs, it just must be. Now that most domestic fireworks are legal in New York State as they were banned for years, we will see the comparison in injuries to other years. Maybe it will be down as perhaps we are learning to be aware. Let us hope so as a rise would only lead to another ban, and we do want our fireworks. Happy belated fourth of July.




