Ride For Roswell 2021



The annual Ride For Roswell will be set for Saturday, August 7th, 2021.

The Ride For Roswell is back for 2021 after it was cancelled 2020 due to COVID-19 regulations.

As one of the largest national cycling events, thousands of riders have taken up to the task of raising funds to end cancer. As of 2021, more than 3 million dollars has been raised through the event and this year riders are now able to participate in two ways: at the event, in-person or throughout the month of August at

their own pace.

The much beloved torch lighting will also be resumed this year. "The lighting of the torch represents a symbol of hope. It represents the hope of cancer patients and survivors, the compassion of Roswell Park nurses, doctors and caregivers; and the brilliance of Roswell Park researchers and scientists," says Chris Eberle, cancer survivor, volunteer and originator of the Ride Torch. "The Celebration of

Hope brings together the Ride community to honor and commemorate all who are affected by cancer, and to support and recognize the groundbreaking research at Roswell Park that saves people like me."

This year's Ride for Roswell will be on Saturday, August 7 and registration is still currently open across five locations across Western New York.

North Buffalo 8-Year-Old 2021 State Champions



North Buffalo 8 year old Blaze team won the Championship in Babe Ruth Tournament held this past weekend in Shoshone Park against teams from Elmira and Jamestown. This was the league's second Divisional win in three years. The team advances to the Mid-Atlantic Regional later this month in New Jersey.

For the second time in three years, the eight and under North Buffalo Blaze won the Cal Ripken Western New York State Championship this past Sunday in Shoshone Park by sweeping West Elmira 19-2 and 17-0. But it wasn't easy.

The Blaze got off to a slow start in the three team tournament after losing their first game, 6-4 Saturday morning. Suddenly in the losers bracket, the team battled back to win three straight games against Jamestown and West Elmira twice the next day to hoist a trophy

into the air in the North Buffalo Park. They were led by the outstanding pitching of Connor Gunnerson, Brayden Westfield, George Rhoney, Bennett Armstrong and Cole Shatzel. All five hurlers did what they needed to do to limit the visiting teams' offense on the mound while teammates played excellent defense.

Lucas Adamczyk-Turkovich was stellar behind the plate as the Blaze catcher, handling the ball from the mound. Seven year old Second baseman Leo Scott patrolled the middle of the infield, plug-

ging any gaps nearby.

Facing elimination Saturday afternoon, the Blaze bull dozed Jamestown, 23-2 led by the suddenly hot bats of Armstrong, Jack Kleeh and Westfield. Westfield had three hits, including a double while teammates Gunnerson and Brady Roberts had two each.

"Just a great weekend for our team," said manager Jim Daley after the games. "Our defense and pitching was outstanding. We controlled the game on the mound and took care of the bases. All 13 players contributed. They played hard and fast and had fun."

Sunday, the Blaze jumped out to a 12-1 lead after two innings against West Elmira as three pitchers combined for the victory. Gunnerson, Rhoney and Armstrong helped put the team in the Championship game.

Other players on the team included Dominic Sabia, Christian Cipolla, Hunter Gallagher, Connor Smith and Maddox Beal. The team is headed to the Babe Ruth/Cal Ripken Mid-Atlantic Regionals at the end of July in Mountainside, New Jersey against teams from Pennsylvania, New Jersey, New York, Maryland and Delaware.

"North Buffalo always has good teams for our tournaments in Babe Ruth," said State Commissioner Dave Franknecht of Babe Ruth Baseball. "Your facilities here are excellent, your people work hard, volunteering their time for North Buffalo and we just enjoy coming here and using Shoshone Park as a host for our Babe Ruth games."



Should I Claim Social Security at 62, or Wait Longer? -Ask Rusty

Dear Rusty: I turn 62 next year, and I am getting different answers to my questions, so I hope you can help me. The amount I would collect is different at 67 and 72. If I start to collect Social Security at 62 when I turn 67, will it go up to that amount? And go up again when I turn 72? One person I spoke to said yes, it does. The next person I spoke to said no – you get the amount for the age that you start to collect, and that's all you get for the rest of your life. Please help me to understand if I should start to collect at 62 or should I wait? Signed: Confused About When to Claim

Dear Confused: Survivor benefits reach maximum when you reach your full retirement age (67), but you can claim a reduced survivor benefit as early as age 60. The amount of your survivor benefit will be determined by a) the benefit your wife had earned up to the month she passed, and b) your age when you claim the survivor benefit. At age 67 you would get 100% of the amount your wife was entitled to when she passed;

if you claim at age 60 you would only get 71.5% of the benefit amount your wife had earned up to her death. The reduction may, or may not be, acceptable to you depending on your personal circumstances.

First, you should be aware that if you claim your survivor benefit before your full retirement age (FRA) and return to work, you'll be subject to Social Security's earnings test which limits how much you can earn before SS takes away some of your benefits. The earnings limit for 2021 is \$18,960 (changes annually) and if that is exceeded SS will take back benefits equal to \$1 for every \$2 you are over the limit. The earnings limit applies until you reach your full retirement age, although the limit is much higher and the penalty less severe in the year you attain FRA. If your earnings prior to your FRA are high enough, it could disqualify you from receiving a survivor benefit. Of course, if you are not working and do not plan to return to work, the earnings test is not a concern.

Assuming you are fully retired from working, here are some things to consider:

- Claiming your survivor benefit now at age 60 would permit you to receive 71.5% of the survivor benefit for at least 7 years (until you reach your FRA), or perhaps longer until you are 70. Although the survivor benefit would be reduced, claiming it at age 60 would also permit you to delay taking your own Social Security benefit until age 70 when your personal benefit would be 24% more than it will be at your FRA. The above would be prudent if your age 70 (or 67) benefit amount will be higher than the survivor benefit you would be entitled to at your full retirement age.

- If your survivor benefit at your FRA would be more than your own benefit will be at age 70, then it would be wisest to maximize your survivor benefit. To maximize your survivor benefit you must wait until age 67 (your FRA) to claim it. If your full survivor benefit will be the highest you can get, then maximizing it by waiting until your FRA to claim it is your smartest move.

So, as you can see, you have a choice of when to claim your survivor benefit. If your personal benefit at age 70 would be higher, it would be wise to claim your survivor benefit first (at age 60) and collect the reduced survivor benefit until you later switch to your own higher benefit. But if your survivor benefit at maximum would be more than your age 70 benefit, then waiting until your full retirement age of 67 to claim your survivor benefit would be your best choice.

Angola Summer Cottage



The summer cottage in Angola.

As a kid growing up on the West Side in the city, in a home without air conditioning, you looked for water on sizzling summer days. Your choices were public swimming pools or a trip to a Lake Erie beach. The closest beaches to the West Side were across the bridge in Canada. One option was to walk over to the "Baby Hole," as it was named, right as you get off the peace bridge on the other side. Or bike to one of the many nice sandy Canadian beaches. Not so on this side of the shores of Lake Erie.

There was a beach in Lackawanna, Woodlawn, but in

those days the steel plant polluted that whole area, and the air and water were not that pleasant there. Heading out route five after the village of Hamburg the shoreline along the lake was lined with huge estates. Kellogg, Larkin, Wendt, to name a few of the local wealthy land barons. The next nearest public beach on this side was Bennet beach, now called Buffalo Beach. To get there you needed to drive as it was too far to bike ride.

After Buffalo beach there was another development that sprung up with a fairly nice sandy rocky beach in Angola called Point Breeze.

Streets were added and as there were no building codes there at the time, Buffalo residents bought property and built small "cottages" as they were called. Built to be able to flee the city in the summer months. Nothing really fancy and just enough to be able to sleep and eat in relaxing comfort. The cool breezes from the lake and a walk to the fresh breaking waters made it very pleasant in the heat.

It happened that we had a friend, Charlie DiPasquale, who owned one of these cottages in Angola and invited the whole gang out for a day. I do not think it had running water or even electricity, but we had a grand time. Cookout, plenty of beer and soft drinks. Sausage and hot dogs, macaroni in all forms and snacks. We had such an enjoyable time my dad decided to rent one of these get-a-ways for a week, which he did. We would all go out there for the 7 days and sleep everywhere we fit as it was such a fun time. Would spend the day at the beach, get all sunburned, and then spend the rest just lounging. We got good at doing nothing.

Even after my parents passed, we rented the same cottage for a number of years, till it no longer existed. Still the urge to spend some time in Angola in the

summer was overwhelming. We rented a bigger cottage a bit closer to the beach. We invited my Wife's brother from Ohio to spend time with us. He had six kids and we had eight. Doing the math that is eighteen people in that one house. Needless to stress we had our hands full. Breakfast, lunch, and dinner were enormous events. We all got along, and those memories are precious.

Eventually we bought our own cottage and spent the whole summer in our paradise by the lake. Perpetual company of family and friends. One weekend we had twenty-seven people show up. We had a boat and did a lot of fishing. Every meal was a cookout, sometimes even fresh grilled fish. Darkness was the time to have an outdoor fire and a sing-along and play foolish games. There is nothing like it, just fun and laughs. It turned out we had to move into our unheated uninsulated cottage for a couple of years. These structures were not built for the winter. They are nice in the warm months but bitter cold when the snow flies.

As the kids got older and moved out, the summer cottage became an afterthought. Fewer and fewer visitors made the maintenance harder and harder as all the help was gone. It was

time to move on and we sold it. We had made many improvements. It was sad to let it go as it had so many wonderful things to remember. The neighbors, the beach, fishing, the nightly bon fires, and even golfing. Having to spend a few winters there and the long drive into the city every day, put a damper on the charm it had.

Things have a way of coming around again. We go to Florida for the winter and return home for the summer. Would like to have had one of these cottages to again spend the hot days of summer near the lake. Things have changed. Lakefront property is in such demand the prices are untouchable. Many of the "cottages" are now mansions with a lakefront view. Even those inland have since been changed into year-round residencies and homes. Having one of these as a two month get-away is not realistic anymore. At least we can be thankful that we had our day at the "cottage."

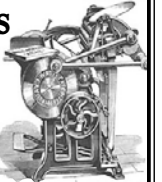
