The Blotter **Felonies**

From "D" District

North Buffalo July 23, 2021

Colvin Avenue – The victim reported that the defendant did grab her by the throat and applied pressure. This action caused bruising on her neck. The defendant did also push the victim during the altercation.

July 22, 2021

Delaware Avenue - Complainant reports for Marshall's that defendant did enter store and did take without permission various items (value \$220.11) and did pass all points of purchase without paying for same. Complainant reports that on July 21 defendant did take items from store (\$46.98) and did return them for cash with no permission to do so.

July 21, 2021

Starin Avenue - Complainant did come home to find defendant inside his home without permission drinking a beer in the kitchen. Upon further investigation defendant did break a window to remain unlawfully in the residence.

Riverside July 25, 2021

Belmont Avenue - Defendant did push, shove, kick and punch victim in her face and upper leg area. Victim is fearful and scared of defendant.

July 25, 2021

dant then pulled out a knife and told victim "I'm going to kill you" before fleeing out the back door.

Isabelle Street - Officers were on scene when they witnessed defendant banging on window of mother's apartment where defendant was threatening victim. Officers were able to identify defendant from a previous domestic where defendant did strangle victim. Defendant did make threats to harm victim at which point when officers exited vehicle to talk to defendant, defendant did take off. Officers did catch up to the defendant when defendant did begin to fight with officers. Officers did have to chemical spray defendant to gain compliance. Defendant was told multiple times by officers to stop resisting and place hands behind back and did not comply until chemical spray was deployed. After officers removed defendant from patrol vehicle to place inside AMB officers did discover defendant did damage rear panel of patrol vehicle.

July 24, 2021

Henrietta Street - Victim reports that after hours of the defendant being disorderly outside, numerous 911 calls, she did look outside to investigate. At this time the defendant did begin yelling at the victim and did have a machete in his hands. The defendant did then use said machete to break the victim's living room window attempted to crawl through window but did not fit completely and did then throw machete at victim through the broken window attempting to cause serious physical injury. Active order of protection in place. Active order was violated by the defendant. Damage to victim's window does exceed \$250.00 in damages.

Subject then grabbed a stick and broke a laptop, slammed a PS4 on the ground and broke a window. Subject also assaulted victim by striking her with closed fist and slammed her to the ground causing bruising to face and sore back.

Niagara Street - Officers stopped vehicle travelling northbound on Niagara Street for suspended registration (insurance lapse.) Vehicle also observed to have no front plate and dark tinted windows. Incident to arrest during inventory search of vehicle, patrol officer did record a silver bag containing a gray powdery substance (8.56), a scale with residue and multiple baggies from rear passenger floor.

July 24, 2021

Auchinvole Street - Suspects were found in vacant house on West Ferry Street without permission. Suspect did push up window to enter the house.

July 23, 2021

Pooley Street - Suspect did get drunk and argue with his family and said he would "slit" their throats and kill them. He would not let victim escape the room or house and punched and kicked her in the head and face, as well as her pelvis, ribs and back. He threatened to shoot everyone in the house including four children under 17 years of age. Victim has two black eyes, swollen face and head, and pain on the left side of back.

Disability vs. Survivor Benefit – Ask Rusty

Dear Rusty: I have a question regarding Social Security. I'm 54 and applying for disability. I've had rheumatoid arthritis since I was 19. My son, 16 vears old, receives survivor benefits from my deceased ex-husband. We were married for 20 years. I was told by Social Security that my monthly payments, if they found me eligible for disability, would be \$1418 a month. When would I be eligible to collect my ex-husband's Social Security benefit? He made considerably more income over the years, and his benefit will be a good deal more than my projected \$1418. Signed: Disabled Widow

Dear Disabled Widow: Your Social Security Disability Insurance (SSDI) benefit is based upon your own lifetime work record up to the point you became disabled. If awarded, the \$1418 amount would be equal to the benefit you would have been entitled to on your own at your full retirement age (FRA) of 67. At your FRA, your SSDI benefit will automat-

ically convert to your SS retirement benefit at the same amount. However, if your SSDI is awarded, you will be also eligible to apply for your survivor benefit at any time.

Normally, age 60 is the earliest a survivor benefit can be claimed, but those who are disabled can apply for survivor benefits as early as age 50. Whether to apply for your survivor benefit from your ex-husband this early is a question you should carefully consider because the amount of your survivor benefit will be reduced by 28.5% if you claim it now. And to be clear, if you have remarried and remain married, you are not eligible for a survivor benefit from your deceased ex-husband (even though your minor son is).

Your survivor benefit from your ex-husband will not reach maximum until you have reached your full retirement age. At your FRA you would be entitled to 100% of the benefit your ex-husband was receiving (or entitled to receive) when he died, but taken at any age earlier than your FRA, your survivor benefit will be permanently reduced. The reduction is 4.75% for each full year earlier than your FRA that the survivor benefit is claimed, to a maximum reduction of 28.5%.

So, if your SSDI is awarded you will have a choice - to take your smaller SSDI benefit and allow your survivor benefit to continue to grow, or to take your survivor benefit early and accept the permanent 28.5% reduction to that survivor benefit. You will need to compare those two benefit amounts to decide which course to take. For clarity, you can switch to your higher survivor benefit at any later time, but you shouldn't wait beyond your FRA (when the survivor benefit reaches maximum) to claim it.for 2021), Social Security may withhold your benefits for several months, and your dependents won't receive their benefits while yours are withheld. Note too that your earnings limit will go up by about 2.5 times during the year you attain FRA.

When we lived on 14th and York on the West Side of Buffalo so many years ago, a ride in the country was to go as far as Sheridan Drive to see the cows. That was our Summer Sunday mission, being that we were city folks, we wanted to spend the day as a family in our cozy crowded automobile going for a long ride out to smell the hay. Not joking, Sheridan Drive was out in the country from where we lived back then. Sometimes we would really go all the way to Ellicott Creek Park and have a picnic. As the years went on and the family

car got bigger, our Sundays in the country extended to North Collins and Barker, as we had relatives there. You realize that being outdoors with all that space, with cows, horses, chickens, and a barking dog was a treat. Truly a breath of fresh air for people living in crowded city neighborhoods.

As we drove along, we would pass the traveling time by counting cows. Those on the driver's side took the cows on that side of the road, the passenger side the other. Sometimes it was horses and sometimes flags but we always counted something.

When we reached our destination, it did not matter who won, we were glad to get there and get out of the car. Coming home we were so exhausted from the day's activity we never counted anything as I remember. It was just a day of fun if you visited a relative's farm. You get to pet the horses, stand next to the cows, chase chicken, play in the hay, and feed the pigs.

other wonderful The thing was being able to pick fresh fruit like raspberries, strawberries, and blackberries right off the bush. There is nothing like that in the city. Rows and rows of goodies as far as the eye can see. Ate so many raspberries I got sick and never ate another one my whole life. Such a different life and so welcome, well once a week. We did not have to do any of the hard farm_chores, just enjoy the day. Point here is we did it as a family. Mom and Dad, my brothers, and sisters and sometimes a neighborhood kid. We waited all week to pile into our jalopy and go for our ride in the country. Every Sunday in the Summer. Sunday was family day come hell or high water that was my dad's rule.

As the years passed and we had our own family, we continued the traditional Sunday family ride into the

country. No matter what, like my dad said, Sunday was family day. By now you had to really travel to get out into the farmlands as the nearby farms disappeared into plazas and developments, Sheridan Drive is an example of that progress. You travel a little further and get to count more cows. We did add singing songs to our travel time to wherever the day would take us. Now instead of farms we looked for free beaches and parks, but still a long trip to get there from the city. To add to our repertoire, we added playing mind games as we needed something to keep us occupied in our limited space.

Winters in Buffalo are not adaptable to long rides in the country. Still the need to be together as a family was there on Sunday. So, we would all go to Mom's house for spaghetti and sauce. Without fail we would pile into her upstairs flat with all our children and enjoy our weekly meal together. Even with only the family that had remained in the area, there were as many as twenty-seven of us. Mom would feed us with her big happy Italian smile. It was Sunday and we were together. That was the important thing, we were together as a family on Sunday.

We were able to keep that up till she passed but we loved it till then. What seems to happen after that is the families separate into their own routines on Sundays. She was the glue that held us together. Still the occasional family picnic at a park or one of the homes but not everyone is able to attend. We had our own growing families and did our own things on Sundays. For years it was a known fact, Sunday was family day. That went on until, and most families are seeing this, the siblings move away and settle in other parts of the country. The family dwindles and soon there are few left to spend Sundays with. Hopefully enough remains to still make it a day to spend with each other. It was always my favorite day of the week, as a youngster, as a father, and even now in our twilight years. We look forward to seeing the family on Sundays. Sundays should still be a family day. Try to remember that.




