## Delta District Community Day Scheduled

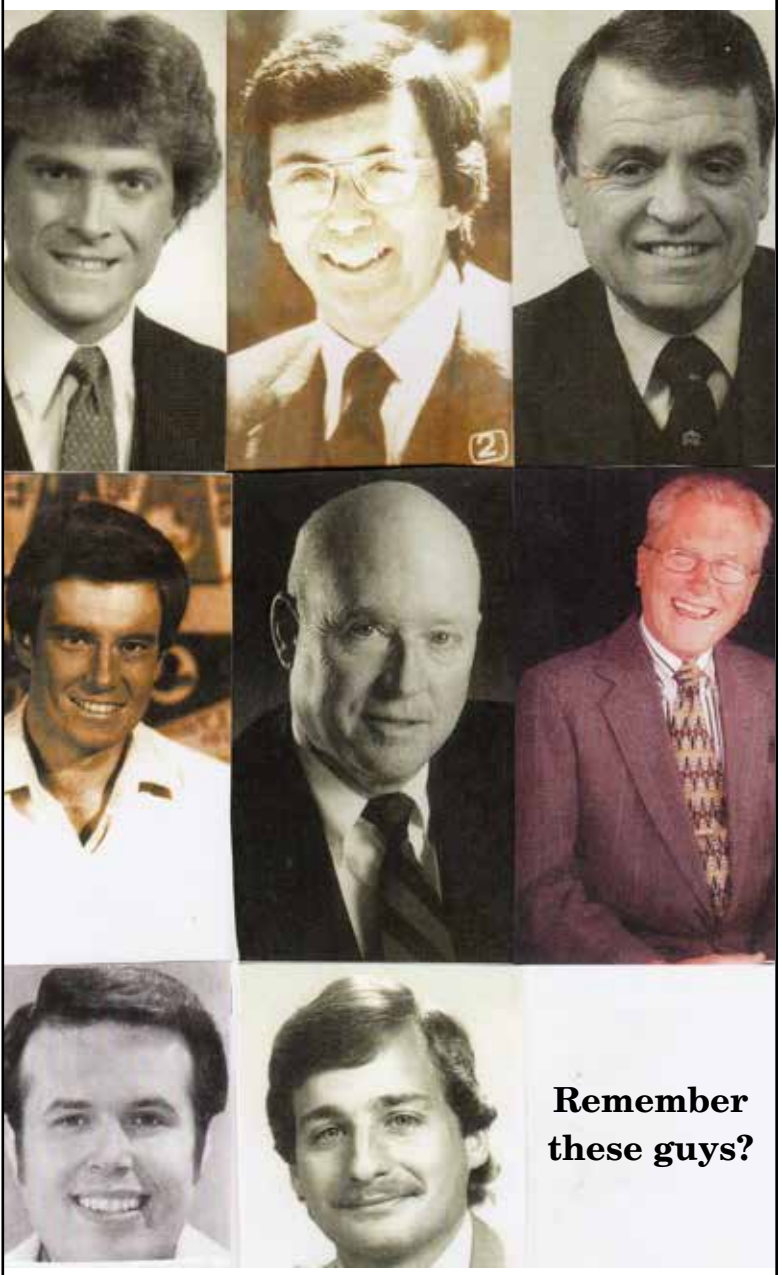

## Kearns Honors Paratransit Advocate With Erie County Clerk's Community Service Award

Erie County Clerk Michael P. Kearns recently presented the first-ever Erie County Clerk's Community Service Award to Stephanie Speaker, in honor of her years of service as a community volunteer as well as her advocacy for persons with disabilities.

"By loving our neighbors as ourselves, the better off we're going to be," Kearns stated. "Not only as a community but as a country. And now with COVID-19 and everything that's going on, I'm hoping people soften up a little bit and we really look out for each other."

Ms. Speaker's work to

increase the distance that paratransit can travel beyond a bus stop so that persons with disabilities would have improved access. She has worked tirelessly the last six years for state legislation and it is rightly named, "Stephanie's Bill".


It is currently waiting on a sponsor in the New York State Assembly's majority caucus in order to be put forward. The presentation ceremony was held in the County Clerk's Ceremonial Conference Room at Old County Hall in front of Stephanie's friends, colleagues and family members including her parents, Kenneth and Patricia

Speaker and her brother, Jeffrey Speaker.

Her volunteerism includes Feed More WNY (14 years), Lancaster Food Pantry, St. Andrews Consignment Shop and the Red Cross, to her active membership in the Auxiliary Unit 187 of the Military Order of the Purple Heart, along with her tireless activism on behalf of the disabled community as a member of Voice Buffalo and the Self Advocacy Association of New York State as well as being appointed by the Governor to the Developmental Disabilities Advisory Council.

## Felonies

From "D" District

**North Buffalo**  
**August 2, 2021**  
Homer at Hertel Avenues – Officer observed vehicle parked next to a fire hydrant located at the corner of Homer and Hertel and blocking the crosswalk. The vehicle was running with defendant sitting in the front passenger seat. The owner and driver defendant did walk up to his vehicle and told officers he would move it. Officers discovered the driver's license is suspended and while doing inventory of said vehicle for impound officers did recover from the glove box a black Glock 36 .45 ACP with seven rounds in the magazine.

Hertel Avenue – While outside on LaForce Avenue the defendant did produce a knife and stabbed the complainant in the right side of the complainant's torso with said knife causing a large puncture wound to Complainant's torso. Chaddock Street- Defendant operating a vehicle on Chaddock striking two vehicles parked on Chaddock. Defendant continued to drive westbound on Chaddock with heavy damage to front passenger tire. Officers located defendant inside vehicle behind wheel with engine running and keys in the ignition in street. Defendant failed SFST conducted by patrol officer. Defendant's strong alcoholic beverage on breath, poor coordination, and glassy bloodshot eyes. Defendant did have in his possession and under his control a clear plastic container with KHAT containing cathinone, which was recovered from the center console in which the defendant was seated in the driver's seat.

Vehicle continued to turn left onto Janice Street where all occupants did flee from the car. ### I'm Terminal; What Are My Wife's Options as My Survivor? – Ask Rusty

**Dear Rusty:** I'm 60, and my wife is 62. I have terminal Stage IV prostate cancer, but my wife is in pretty good health. If I draw at 62, would that affect my wife's survivor benefits? When should she start to withdraw? Also, when I die, what would she get? Would she get her SS and then something of mine? Or must she choose between

keeping hers and taking my survivor benefit? Please assist – I don't have much energy anymore. **Signed: Running on Empty**

**Dear Running on Empty:** Sorry to hear of your illness, and I commend you for planning ahead for your wife. As your surviving widow, your wife's survivor benefit will be based upon the amount you were receiving at your death, but it will also be affected by her age when she claims it. So, yes, if you claim at age 62, it will mean a smaller widow's benefit than your wife might otherwise get if you waited longer. But there is also a special rule, known as the "widows limit," which will affect your wife's survivor benefit. The widow's limit stipulates that the minimum benefit your wife will receive as your survivor is 82.5% of the amount you would have been due at your full retirement age (67). So even if you claim at age 62 and take a 30% cut in your own benefit, your wife will still get 82.5% of what you were entitled to at your full retirement age (FRA). However, as I said, your wife's survivor benefit amount will also be based upon her

age when she claims it, and she isn't required to claim it immediately upon your death.

Your wife's survivor benefit as your widow will reach maximum when she reaches her own full retirement age, and if she claims it prior to her FRA, it will be reduced 4.75% for each full year earlier than her FRA. But if her benefit as your widow will be more than her own SS retirement benefit, she can take (or continue to receive) her own SS benefit and wait until her survivor benefit reaches maximum at her FRA. Or alternatively, if your wife is not yet collecting her own SS benefit, she could choose to let her own benefit grow and reach maximum at age 70 and take her smaller survivor benefit first. She will get whichever benefit is more – her survivor benefit or her own, and she will have a choice of which one to take and when to choose it.

Finally, depending upon the extent of your disability, you may wish to consider applying for Social Security Disability Insurance (SSDI) benefits earlier than age 62. Advanced prostate cancer is on Social Security's Compassionate Allowance List, and this would expedite processing of your SSDI application, resulting in a decision within a few weeks instead of a few months. Doing so would not affect your wife's claiming options upon your death, and it may make her survivor benefit higher because your SSDI benefit would be based on your FRA benefit entitlement.

### Out On The Farm



#### Farmlands in Barker, NY.

Last week I wrote about going on Sunday rides in the country with my family. Rides into the "country" as it was known then. As I mentioned, the "country" way back then was Sheridan Drive. Tonawanda was the beginning of the "country"! Of course, when I was a kid, who knew the difference? There were acres and acres of corn fields, chickens and cows, things you do not see in the city, usually. A horse pulling a wagon on occasion but not really farm animals.

In any case, the column got me thinking about those Sunday rides and what

we used to see. Stirred my memory of things long ago. Is it possible to visit some of those places we used to go to decades ago? One of my recollections was a visit to a large family of eleven children who were relatives on my dad's side. The Riders. I vividly remember one of them had red hair, so he was known as Red Rider. Spelled a little differently but if you seen the movie "Christmas Story" he wanted a Red Ryder BB gun. So did I, so to meet a real Red Rider was exciting as a young lad.

Did the 23&me DNA test last year and did find many interesting facts. It did pro-

duce some of these now distant relatives. Wrote to a couple of the "Riders" who are now third generation cousins. Able to find some information on this family we used to visit. It suddenly became an obsession with me to try to find the farm we used to ride out to in my childhood. So, I started to do a little research to see if any of that original family was still around. Unfortunately, all the eleven have passed and are gone. That was the result of my findings. Still, I wanted to find that farm we used to visit. The memories are so great of those days.

There was a mention of Barker and Lyndonville in the correspondence with the descendants with matching DNA. Heard the town of Barker, New York mentioned before so I began my quest there. After some digging on the internet, I did find an address of a Rider in Barker. Assuming things are up to date on the almighty computer I went on the premise that it was recent. That is far from the truth I found out later. Still the excitement of having found a link with the distant past was overwhelming. As soon as I had this address, I immediately requested my wife and dog to get in the car as we are going for a ride in the country. It just

happened to be a Sunday.

Barker, New York is a small town to the North not as far as Lake Ontario. One of those towns if you close your eyes for a minute, you have missed it. Still the adrenaline rose as I had an address. Could this be the farm? As we got closer to the destination, we realized we were out in the country. This was farmland at its best. Fields and fields of different crops waiting for harvesting to feed the hungry people of the cities. You can not only smell the fresh air but feel it. It was so exciting.

Finally, we came to a house that had belonged to one of the relatives. The disappointment was overwhelming. It was run down and even though someone was living in it, the windows were boarded up. As I approached, I heard a big dog bark. Slowly I backed up and a voice came out asking what I wanted. Mentioned the name and she said they have not lived there in years. Sure glad of that. Further research later told me it was at least 20 years ago. I did not recognize anything about this location and was sure it was not the place we visited so many years ago. Wife stated that with so many years passing, things change. True,

but not the location of the house. Recollection places the house on the right side of the driveway, this was on the left. Bummer, this was not it.

However, I will still seek that elusive farm wherever it is. Hope it was Barker rather than Tonawanda. No farms left in the Tonawandas. There are in Barker.

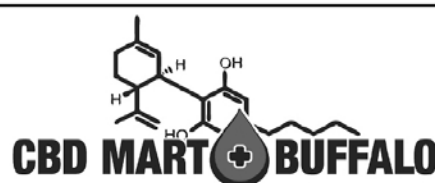
