North Buffalo August 17, 2021

If I Apply Now, When Will I Get My First Social Security Payment? – Ask Rusty

Dear Rusty: If I were to apply for my Social Security retirement (I'm 68 on August 1, 2021), when could I realistically expect to receive my first check? Signed: Ready to Claim

Dear Ready: Social Security suggests applying for benefits 2-3 months before you wish them to begin to allow time for processing your application.

When you apply, you will specify the month you wish your benefits to start, and that is when your benefits will officially begin. But Social Security pays benefits in the month following the month they are earned. So, if, for example, you applied and specified September as your benefit start month, your benefit for that month wouldn't be received until October. The payment date for you will be on the 2nd Wednesday (because you were born between the 1st and 10th of the month), and your payment won't be by check but rather by direct deposit into your bank account. Here are a few other things you should be aware

- Since you were born on the 1st of the month, your benefit is computed using the previous month as your eligibility date. If your year of birth was 1953, your full retirement age (FRA) was 66, which means that you actually reached your FRA in July 2019.
- Since you reached your FRA of 66, you have been

earning Delayed Retirement Credits (DRCs) at the rate of .67% per month (8% additional benefit per year). You can earn DRCs up to age 70, at which point your SS benefit would be 32% more than it would have been at your FRA.

• If you will be 68 on August 1st, you have already earned 16% additional benefit through DRCs. That means your benefit, if claimed to start in July, will be 16% more than it would have been at age 66. You will specify the month you wish your benefit to start when you apply.

• Social Security applies DRCs in January of each year, so if you apply mid-year 2021, your DRCs earned in 2021 won't be applied to your benefit payment until January of 2022.

• You can claim up to 6 months retroactive benefits, which would be paid in a lump sum. If you choose to take retroactive benefits, your "benefit-start-month" will be backdated by six months, your benefit amount will be reduced accordingly (by 4%), and you'll get that reduced benefit for the rest of your life (except for Cost of Living Adjustments annually awarded).

So, this may be more detailed than you expected for your simple question, but claiming SS is a serious decision, and it's important you have complete information before you apply.

Hurt In A Car? Call William Mattar!

Ever hear that? Now what does that catchy phrase have to do with this column in the Buffalo Rocket? Believe it or not, there is a strong connection. At one time a young William Mattar used to deliver the North Buffalo Rocket, door to door, in North Buffalo. As did his brother Mark and his two sisters. One of the many good families with good up-bringing, handing down the Rocket routes from member to member.

Had the pleasure of dealing with lots of good fami-lies back in the 70's as the Rocket progressed. The ones I recall, and forgive me as my memory is not what it used to be, are those who had three or more members as carriers. The Boyd family on Crescent, Don, Jeff and Nancy. Still to this day see the mother and father, Winnie and Don. The Zengers on Woodward, became friends with George the father. The Shamrocks on Saranac,

Jo the mother, was on the board of the North Buffalo community center with me.

The Ostrowskis on Hertel and I am sure there are more that I would be glad to mention if I remembered. It was forty years ago and lots of water has traveled under the bridge since then. Let's call it a memory overload.

The Rocket started out as a slinger, delivered door to door by my children to help advertise my printing business on Tacoma. Four or five of my eight, and maybe more, would spend every Wednesday delivering. As the Rocket grew into a weekly and a tabloid it was time to solicit other delivery people. Have to think the insurance laws were more lenient then as I could never afford the coverage now. The pay was a penny a paper (and the benefit of seeing me every Thursday at payday). Back then, getting a route delivering the daily paper was tough to acquire. Deliv-

ering the Rocket was much easier as we always had openings. The usual route was like 300 to 500 papers. No collecting and a once a week project. The decent kids did it properly, and we could eventually tell who did well and who did not. Many stacks of Rockets were found undelivered by the railroad tracks. We relied on the Rocket being popular and people calling if they did not get it. We had people call if they did not get it, and some called and said they did get it and did not want it. Some are so adamant about not wanting it, we would have to discontinue the whole block. That of course would cause a problem for the people who did want to receive it on that block. So we would just tell them the address of the person who was responsible for the non-delivery. Usually that would solve the prob-

My team of delivery people would line up in my hall on payday, which was Thursday, as the paper was delivered on Wednesday back then. I would make my weekly trip to the bank to get cash for my mostly "little" workers. One would assume the three to five dollars they made was enough to keep them content for a week, as they were happy to see me when I returned with the money. Maybe the only

time I have seen so many smiley faces glad to see me all at once. They would all be lined up in the hallway on Tacoma. Some-times if I was maybe a little late, a slight cheer would erupt amongst my young employees as I entered. I kind of liked that, even if it was paid for admiration.

Have to say it was a delight and a wonderful experience having to be able to accomplish this simple little thing. Giving these little entrepreneurs a chance to make a little side money. Giving them the chance to earn a few bucks on their own and learning responsibility at the same time. Every once in a while I run into a former delivery person. They recognize me as I have changed little in the past forty years. At least they tell me that. I have to wonder if I looked this old forty years ago. They were mostly about 12 years old at the time and are now in their fifties and naturally have changed considerable.Usually I remember the name, but the faces have changed. Some I have seen come to contribute greatly to the community, like the Mattar's and the Zenger's to mention a few.

"Hurt in a car, call William Mattar". "Got an empty pocket, fill it with a Rocket." Somebody must have done that as we are still around.


