## Sports Cardinals Fly to Victory!

What a special season for the Gallivan family this summer in the Hertel North Park Youth Baseball and Softball League. Eleven year old Peyton and 11 other girls were going to be playing for her Mother, Annette, on the Cardinals team in the Major Girls Division after several years of not having a team at all.

With the increased numbers in registration this year, the Cardinals came back into the nest of what is called Shoshone Park and battled three other teams to win the Playoff Championship over the Dodgers, 7-6 and claim a legitimate place in future seasons.

“The transformation of this team from the beginning of the season was a joy to watch,” said Annette Gallivan recently. “They just never gave up. They played hard until the very end, working together to win these games. I’m proud of them.”

But it wasn’t easy. Thanks to some excellent pitching from Lidia Foglia and teammate Laniyah Leak at the plate, the Cardinals turned their season around after getting off to a slow start with a 10 game winning streak.

Peyton Gallivan, who had never pitched before, worked closely with her Mom to become the closer on the mound late in games to secure victory. Others on the team including Chloe Claeys, Liz Wolfe and

Payge Edelman played stellar in the infield. Catcher Skyler Ball handled the throws from the mound, no matter who was pitching and the team got tremendous play from Alena Markle, Izabella Betz and Daphanie DaRosa.

Besides the Dodgers, two other teams, the Astros and Rockies, both had potent lineups that made for some exciting games during the regular season. Karrington Mann, Claire McGillicuddy, Audrey Zorechak or any other Astro would blast homeruns from the plate and send home girls for some big victories. The Rockies were led by Isabella Kilonsky, Julia French, MacKenzie Gunnarson and Isabella

Bernecki. They surprised many with outstanding play all season long.

In the Championship against the Dodgers, they grabbed an early 5-0 lead until the bottom of the fourth inning. That’s when daughter Peyton led things off with a double, leading to three runs after Laniyah and teammate Izabella Betz both doubled to cut the Dodger margin to 5-3. In the fifth, the Cardinals loaded the bases before Laniyah Leak stepped to the plate for a 7-6 lead and eventual final

## The Blotter Felonies

Is It Always Best to Wait Until Age 70 to Claim Social Security? – Ask Rusty

*Dear Rusty: I'm 66 years old and still (self) employed as a home builder. I have not taken Social Security benefits yet, and don't need to at this time. If relevant, my business struggled when I first started it five years ago but did well last year, and I'll have my highest-earning year in my life this year and possibly next year as well. My question is, and it may be dumb, is it always best to*

*delay Social Security until age 70 if there is no current financial need for it? Also, are benefits calculated by total dollars earned over a lifetime, or is some kind of average or mean computation used? I've enjoyed excellent health throughout my life, and I have longevity in my family. I'm single, if that's relevant. Signed:*

*Planning Ahead*

*Dear Planning Ahead:*

There is never a dumb question about Social Security because it's a highly complex program. No, it isn't always best to delay claiming SS until age 70, but yours might be a typical example of why waiting until age 70 to claim is a very smart move. Here's why:

- Your benefit at age 70 will be about 31% more than it would be at your full retirement age (FRA), which is 66 years and two months if you were born in 1955.
- If you are still working and don't urgently need the money, your SS benefit will grow by 8% for each full year you delay claiming (but you can still claim at any time if necessary and get all Delayed Retirement Credits (DRCs) earned to the point you claim).
- Your benefit amount will be computed using the

monthly average of your lifetime 35 highest-earning years, so if your current and more recent earnings are among your highest, they will be included in your benefit computation when you claim. Your earnings in the early years will be adjusted for inflation, and if you don't have a full 35 years of earnings, they will still use 35 (putting zeros in to make 35). So, if you don't have a full 35 years of lifetime earnings, your current earnings now will eliminate some of those "zero earnings" years, resulting in a higher benefit.

- If you're in good health now and you enjoy at least an "average" longevity (about 84 for a man your age), you'll get more in cumulative lifetime benefits by waiting until age 70 to claim and enjoy that higher monthly benefit for the rest of your life. If you wish to estimate your life expectancy, you can use this tool we use here at The AMAC Foundation: <https://socialsecurityreport.org/tools/life-expectancy-calculator/>
- Since you're single, you don't need to worry about maximizing a survivor benefit for your spouse, but if you marry or have an ex-spouse who outlives you, then waiting until age 70 to claim would give them the maximum survivor benefit they are entitled to.

So, in your specific circumstance, waiting until you are 70 to claim appears to be a wise choice. For others who don't enjoy good health and don't expect to make average longevity, or for those who urgently need the money earlier, claiming before age 70 is often a better choice.

## Northwest Buffalo Beat

### Buffalo Rocket Archives

A few years ago, I was looking through the thousands of photographs the Rocket had accumulated over the years. There were so many memories of the things and events that we covered in the 50 years since we started. It was sad in a way, and then again happy to visit the images of friends who have long since passed away. Literally hundreds of people from North Buffalo and the West Side whose paths I have crossed. People who became good friends, who we spent time with, broke bread together, enjoyed each other's families. Fifty years is a long time. Like all old photos, these images live on.

Over those years the Rocket has had many different photographers and editors. It was suggested to me when I started the Rocket that it should contain lots of pictures. That we did accomplish and looking

at them, they let me take a stroll back in time. A smiling Tom Passanisi in front of his store, Community leader Bob Ryan with his rubber banded folder, Bill Buyers and his mayor's crew, John Hazlet from Bob and Johns, Even Lou and Maer Bunis from the Sample shop, working with the Sunshine family. All the bank managers, the dozens and dozens of merchants who I visited often as I worked the street. Far too many to mention. To revisit them again, and see them as they were, doing the things they did. I would spend hours just looking at these photos and reminiscing, remembering. What a pleasant trip into how it used to be through the eyes of photography.

The thought came to me that there may be others that would like to share those moments. Not real big on social media but it is a way to put these images

in front of people who may enjoy seeing them. I started a group called the Buffalo Rocket Archives. Me being the only administrator and the group confined to publishing strictly photos that have appeared in the Rocket or West Side Times. In the beginning I had four of my loyal friends join. Had no idea how to promote it nor did I feel it was necessary. It stayed at that original four for about a year. For some reason it just did not catch on.

Not until I started to put some photos of long ago, and some of the people who everyone knew by sight. Have to say this was a real chore. There were many editors over the years, and they all had different ways of doing things. One was the filling of published photographs. Almost none of the editors wrote anything on the backs. These thousands of photos were without captions. No identification at all, just the photo. No year, no names, no description. After three location moves the Rocket made, when the dust settled at our place where we are now, all we had were boxes and boxes of photos I felt too precious to destroy. As I looked at them, I knew there were some I wanted to share. Some good shots of things that happened. The most popular was the flood

Since there were no captions associated with the pictures, I had to choose those that I either knew the people or remember the event. With that, the group of four started to grow. It could even reach 100 I thought back then. Seemed that it became worth the effort, so I put more into it. Tried to look back into past issues if I had a clue as to the year or the event the photo depicted. Sometimes this worked but not always. I would have preferred if it told when and where. Think about it, 50 years times 52 weeks, times the two papers used to be 12 pages or more. Over 50,000 pages to match the photo and find the caption. The pictures I do put on are those that may have had a date, or I was able to match the issue it appeared in. That makes me so happy as there are so many good shots I would like to share. Nothing warms my heart more than when I put a picture of a mom or dad of someone who has passed, and the siblings drop me a note on how much they appreciated seeing a memory of their parents. A shot they may have never seen before.

That alone makes the many hours I spend trying to get some order out of this, appreciated.

The Archive group is now up to 800 with new people joining every day. There is no monetary value to what I am doing, just the joy of knowing I can possibly make someone happy. I am really the only one that can do this. It does bother me when I get criticized. I sometimes guess wrong and make a mistake in a caption. But the good makes up for the bad. I will continue to do it as long as I can. Just wish I could do more as there are so many good shots that I know people would like to see. I know I enjoy looking at them. Problem is, there is so little time to do so much before the door closes. Just do me one favor if you would. If you are in the archive group, hit like to as many as you can as you browse through the shots. That makes me smile, knowing someone is looking.
