rain or shine at the Buffalo and Erie County Naval & Military Park on Saturday at 8:30 AM.



Phillies Win Championship! The expansion Phillies ger, Josh Shaw, Angelo Gon-

team in the Senior Division of the Hertel North Park Youth Baseball League added their name to the list of Playoff Championship winners last week with two convincing victories over the top ceded Dodgers team and end the 2021 season of Shoshone Park Baseball.

Huge registration numbers prior to Opening Day May 8th, prompted the expansion of two new teams in the boys 13-15 year Division. The Phillies were joined by the Athletics in an eight team battle that included the Dodgers, Diamondbacks, Mariners, Mets, Pirates and Tigers. In the end, a new manager, Paul Mulhern had the final say.

"It was an honor to coach these outstanding young men and be a part of the Shoshone League this Summer. I wish you all the best and am looking forward to seeing you all sometime in the future."

Back in the middle of July, Mulhern drafted 12 young men who had never played together before, except for two brothers and proceeded to put together a Championship season with upset victories over the heavily favored Dodgers, a team that had only lost one game all season. Mulhern selected Ty Graczyk, Lucas Aponte, Tamias Ramsey, Carlos Perales, Henry Chambers, Chris Williams, Shane Painter, Hunter Geizalez and brothers Alex and Casey Glynn.

The Phils lost their first two games of the season to the Mariners and Diamondbacks but put together an 11 game winning streak after that including four wins in the postseason. Against the Dodgers, played Mon-day, August 30th, Lucas Aponte had three hits including a double and a triple and teammates Carlos Perales and Alex Glynn also were key to support pitchers Tamias Ramsey and Ty Graczyk. Ramsey pitched four stellar innings while Graczyk struck out the final six batters to secure a 7-2 victory.

Two nights later, the Phillies grabbed an early 4-2 lead after the first inning and were threatening again after Aponte got a base hit in the bottom of the second. That set the stage for Ram-

sey, who took a fastball over the leftfield fence for a two run homer and a 6-2 Philadelphia lead. Aponte, Perales, Chris Williams and Graczyk shared mound duty to secure a 10-3 win and the first League Championship for the new team.

"The victory was a total team effort and all my players deserve recognition," said Mulhern. "Casey Glynn was outstanding for us at second base and catcher Henry Chambers was key behind the plate as well as his leadership on the field and in the dugout.

Mulhern is no stranger to Baseball diamonds in North Buffalo. He and Pirates manager John Fracos this year, walked into Shoshone Park with a wealth of coaching experience from the the old RiverRock Baseball League in Riverside Park several years ago. Fracos grew up in North Buffalo and played baseball in Hertel North Park in the early 1980's. Both became long-standing board members of the RiverRock League before it folded almost ten years ago. Both men are glad to be coaching future generations of boys in North Buffalo from now on.

About Including "COLA" in **Benefit Projections – Ask Rusty**

Dear Rusty: In your reply to "Confused Se-nior" about when to claim Social Security benefits, I noticed that you did not take into account any compounded annual increases in benefit payments. While these are not guaranteed and are dependent upon the economy, they do affect the *difference in total amount* that can be drawn between eligibility age, full

retirement age, or age 70. Would you please address this? Signed: Stickler for Details

Stickler: Dear Thanks for your feedback on that article. You are correct, of course, that I did not include Cost of Living Adjustments (COLA) in my response to the question asked, and that was intentional. I seldom include future COLA in these calcula-

tions because doing so would mean introducing a speculative factor, and I don't like uncertainties when it comes to claiming Social Security. It's not that I can't include COLA, but it's usually easier for people to grasp straight (guaranthe teed) mathematical computation without adding a variable factor which could result in an inaccurate future benefit projection.

Historically, COLA increases have ranged from 0% to 14% because COLA is tied to inflation — a variable determined by annual changes to the national Consumer Price Index (CPI). If you remember the very high inflation years of the late 70s and very early 80s, those are the years when the highest COLA

increases were granted. More recently (but before 2021), inflation has been held to its lowest level in recent history, and, accordingly, COLA increases have been quite small. No COLA increases at all were granted in 2009, 2010, and 2015, and the increase in 2016 was a paltry 0.3%. The average ČOLA increase over the last ten years (2011 -2020) was 1.7%, and the average over the last 20 years has been 2.2%. I've done these computations both ways - including a 2% average COLA increase and not including any COLA increase – and the resulting breakeven point for claiming at age 70 vs. full retirement age doesn't significantly change.

For clarity, most early projections now suggest



that high inflation in 2021 will cause the 2022COLA increase to exceed 6%, far above the average over the past 20 years, further emphasizing the speculative nature of predicting COLA. Although the actual future benefit predictions would be somewhat different with a COLA projection added, those amounts would be conjecture (and "not guaranteed," as you have said). Excluding COLA from such analyses, however, does provide guaranteed amounts, and I prefer to use solid numbers rather than speculative ones. If it turns out that COLA improves their benefit amount and break-even age, that will be icing on the cake, but they've made their claiming decision based on solid information and guaranteed future benefit increases.

Other feedback from that same article suggested I should have also evaluated an option to claim benefits early and invest them, rather than waiting longer to get a guaranteed higher Social Security benefit. Just like trying to predict COLA, predicting investment growth introduces a variable that I'm not comfortable using when advising about Social Security benefits. For that type of speculative advice, it would be prudent to seek counsel from a certified financial planner.


