

Donald "Don" W. Boyd, Jr., 1923-2021 Former Buffalo Rocket columnist

Former Buffalo Rocket columnist Donald "Don" W. Boyd, Jr., 98, of Buffalo, NY passed away Tuesday, Sept. 7, 2021. Mr. Boyd wrote a weekly column entitled "Business to Business" which informed readers of new and upcoming businesses in the North Buffalo area.

Raising his family in North Buffalo, Mr. Boyd dedicated his time to countless organizations including leadership roles: the Kiwanis Club of North Buffalo; Hertel-North Buffalo Business Association; and the North Buffalo Business Development Association. Active in St. Mark's Roman Catholic Church and School, he was a former director of the Holy Name Society and later Co-Founder and Co-Chairman of first Lion Heart Auc-

He was also active in Boy and Girl Scouting and was scoutmaster, district commissioner (BSA) and board member of the Girl Scout Council. Well over 200 youth benefited from his scouting leadership. He earned Eagle Scout and Order of the Arrow as a scout and district award of merit as an adult Scout. Mr. Boyd also served on the boards of

Junior Achievement of WNY, Crisis Services, Food Shuttle of WNY, Tip Club of Buffalo and many more. A 1993 recipient of the prestigious J.C. Penney Golden Rule Award for Outstanding Volunteer Service, his nominators wrote "The tremendous community-wide impact Don has had is nearly immeasurable.' Further mentioning hands-on style and boundless commitment has enriched the lives of countless others and inspires others to be their best."

Mr. Boyd was born on Feb. 7, 1923 to Donald W. Boyd Sr. and Nan S. Boyd (nee Smith) and raised in Amherst. He attended Amherst High School and graduated in 1943 from Colgate University (A.E). Born of "The Greatest Generation", Mr. Boyd served in as US Navy Lieutenant Junior Grade, Supply and Dis-bursing Officer, USS Barnett (APA 5), a transport in the Pacific.

Following war service, he worked in public relations at Champlain College and Clarkson College. While at Clarkson he was credited with renaming the athletic teams "the Golden Knights." Returning to Buffalo in 1952, he worked at Canisius College leaving in 1963 to establish his own firm. Professional Program Management Inc. was involved in the management of associations, tradeshows, & trade publications. As an avid collector of antiques, he was co-managing partner of the former Courtyard Antique Center in Clarence. Among his collections were old typewriters, one of which he still used today to type notes to family and friends.

In 2007, Don and his wife Winnie moved into Rock Oak Estates in Clarence where he served as director of the Rock Oak Homeowners Association. While leading the Clarence Hollow Association for ten plus years, he rallied businesses and residents alike to be involved in the Clarence Hollow Community. He was instrumental in the founding of the Clarence Hollow Farmers' Market. Don began a movement for the restoration and development of the Town Park Club House as a historic site. He is also a member of The Clarence American Legion Post #838.

Active in the WNY Railway Historical Society since 1980, he was recently honored for years of service in leading fundraising projects for the Lehigh Valley Historic site including restoration of the depot in Williamsville. As a resident of The Amberleigh, he established the Amberleigh Learning Academy, where since 2015 he hosted a weekly speaker series for residents.

Why so many volunteer organizations? He summed it up in this statement "I volunteer because I can, because God granted me the desire, strength, knowledge, resources, and opportunity to do so. I volunteer in the hope that it will inspire others to do the same. I volunteer because it fills a space in my life that money, possessions, titles, and awards have never been able to do. I volunteer because each day on this Earth is a gift, and the least I can do is to give back in return." As friends said, "Western New York is richer for having Don Boyd as one of its own." Mr. Boyd is survived by his wife, Winifred G. Boyd; and three children, Donald W. Boyd III (Karen), Nancy Boyd Haley and Geoffrey G. Boyd (Cheryl); five grandchildren; and two great-grandchildren.



Will Retiring Early from Work Affect my Social Security? – Ask Rusty

Dear Rusty: I stopped working at age 55, well before my full retirement age of 66 years and ten months. I had over 35 years working prior to retiring from work. I don't intend to start collecting Social Security until my full retirement age. Will I be penalized for all those years between when I stopped working and my full retirement age? Signed: Planning

Ahead

Dear **Planning** Ahead: Will you be "penalized?" because No, whenever you claim your Social Security benefit, it will be based upon the highest-earning 35 years over your entire lifetime (with the early years adjusted for inflation). Would your benefit be higher if you had continued to work and have high earnings longer? Probably, because

earnings in the latter part of one's career are usually considerably higher than those in the early years. But everyone's situation is different.

Higher earnings today don't necessarily replace those in earlier years because of the inflation adjustment. For example, someone with \$50,000 in 1990 earnings would need to earn more than about \$115,000 in today's dollars to replace the earlier year. And keep in mind that benefit computayour tion uses only the dollars which you paid SS taxes on. So, someone earning \$500,000 this year would, for benefit computation purposes, only get credit for \$142,800 in earnings because the latter amount is what Social Security FICA (or Self Employment) taxes were paid on.

It is from your highest-earning 35-year history that your Average Indexed Monthly Earnings or "AIME" is determined, followed by yet another formula to convert your AIME to your "primary insurance amount" or "PIA." Your PIA is what you are entitled to in the month you attain your full retirement age (FRA). If you claim before your full retirement age, you'll get less than your PIA, and if you claim after your FRA, you'll get more than your Primary Insurance Amount. If you delay claiming past your full retirement age, you'll earn delayed retirement credits (DRCs) up to age 70, at which time your benefit could be as much as 29% more than your PIA. Of course, you can also claim at any time between your

FRA and age 70 to get all DRCs you've earned to the point you claim.

So, as you can see, the Social Security benefit you get will be determined by two main things - your 35year lifetime earnings history and the age at which you claim. You can't do much now to change your 35-year earnings history (short of returning to work and having very high current earnings), but you can control when you claim. And that decision, of course, should consider your health and your life expectancy, how badly you need the money, and your marital status. Your marital status is important if your spouse can collect a spousal benefit from your record or if you are concerned about the amount your survivor(s) will receive if you die first.

Little Bit Of North **Buffalo History**

Back in the 70's the owners of the North Park used to make the theatre accessible to the community for charity events. What was nice about this facility was that it has a huge stage across the front. A platform on which you could have performances and speakers that needed to be visible to large audiences. Local organizations used the theatre for different events through those years. The Buffalo Rocket held a Christmas party at Christmas time with Santa, his elves and Rudolph. After the Halloween parade, costume judging, and prizes were awarded by the event sponsors in the lobby. The North Buffalo Business Association held a teen talent contest and a Miss North Buffalo pageant on that very stage. The events were always associated with local charities as fundraisers.

The theatre was such a great building as it is located right smack in the middle of North Buffalo.

Fundraising was quite common back then as it is now, and I do recall one that was unique in a way. Different as the long-range story of how it turned out over the years makes it worth telling.

Started out with a young mother coming to the Rocket office on Tacoma looking for a part time secretarial job. A strug-gling weekly, the Rocket was unable to hire her, but listened to her story. She had a young son who was born with Cooley's Anemia. A rare blood disease, also called Mediterranean Anemia as that is where it originated. It was common in nationalities that came from that area and the life expectancy was short. Since then, medical improvements have

made the life expectancy for this affliction increase dramatically over the years. This young mother was distraught but courageous and seemed to be making the most out of her unwanted situation. The Rocket with its limited ability as a young publication decided to try to do something if it could, to help. A fundraiser for Cooley's Anemia? We could do that.

With that settled, we had to decide how and what we could do with the limited resources we had available. How about a charity basketball game? What we needed was a name player. We recruited newly elected Councilman Anthony Masiello (he later became mayor) as our marquee player. Mr. Masiello was a star basketball player for Canisius College and was well known locally for his talent. He readily accepted as he was familiar with Michael and his condition. Our two friends, Bob and John Hazlet from Bob and John's Pizzeria were good athletes and were also excellent basketball players. We had three plus me, and a couple of others whose names I cannot remember, made up our squad. We had our team, now we needed an opponent that would also attract patrons. Also needed was a place to play. After tough negotiating, and the help of the council member, Bennett High School gym was available to us. Then, what better group to play against than the Bennett High School teachers? They readily accepted our challenge and with that we were ready to rumble. After selecting a date and time we began to sell tickets. It was not a sellout, but we had a decent crowd.

The night of the game we were all ready and eager to go. I play basketball like I bowl and play golf, lousy. My job was to just throw the ball in from the out of bounds and watch the real players play. The Bennett teachers had brought a couple of ringers and talented players. I doubt they were teachers but guys with good basketball skills. It is obvious, we were behind at half time. Our people needed that well-deserved break as none of us were in the best of shape. At halftime I remember Tony saying to me, "I know this is a charity game, but I do not want to lose to these guys." "Just get the ball to me." I got the message and passed it on to the other

That we did. We got the ball to Tony, and he was spectacular. Slowly we closed the gap and ended up winning the game at the last minute before a cheering crowd. The Bennett teachers were not happy but good sports. This game is not written in any history books but there is a little twist to this story.

Remember the young boy with the Cooley's Anemia in whose honor we played the game. The one with the short life expectancy? Well, he grew up to be a Buffalo Council member in the same seat that Tony Masiello held. He served on the council for nine years before he passed away at the age of forty-six. I followed his career with interest, and he would not remember that infamous game. Not too many would, if any. It is just a small part of North Buffalo history that no one knows about. The game was fun, it was for a worthy cause, and we won. Life is good.


