

# Tango Dance Returns



The iconic Tango Dance neon sign will soon be re-installed at the corner of Elmwood and Bidwell Parkway.

Mayor Byron W. Brown today announced the Buffalo Arts Commission is entering into an agreement with Douglas Development to install the restored Tango Dance neon sign on the exterior of 976 Elmwood Ave., at the northwest corner of Elmwood Avenue and Bidwell Parkway.

“For 33 years, the City-owned Tango Dance neon sign was part of the fabric

of the Elmwood-Bidwell neighborhood and a landmark along the Elmwood strip,” Mayor Brown said. “I am very pleased the Buffalo Arts Commission and Developer Douglas Jemal will be teaming up to return this beloved piece back to its original location.”

Under the agreement, Douglas Development will cover the costs of transporting the large neon City-

owned sign from the City’s Public Works garage, as well as its installation and electrification. The Buffalo Arts Commission will be responsible for its maintenance and repair.

Plans call for renovation of the existing buildings and construction of a new structure at the rear to create a 39,000-square-foot complex which will have 33 apartments and six storefronts.

## Black Rock Riverside Football

zzAfter losing their first game of the season three weeks ago against the Lockport Bengals 13-6, the Black Rock Riverside Raiders have strung together three straight wins, including a victory this past Saturday at home against the Clarence Bulldogs, 29-0 in front of several hundred spectators in Riverside Park.

The 100 yard field was ready, the light towers were illuminated and the cheerleaders were all set to welcome back the four purple and yellow teams that make up football teams in Northwest Buffalo. After not being able to play last year due to the pandemic, the Raiders as well as the Knights and Broncos took the field and battled three tough Clarence teams all afternoon, coming away with a solid win. Another team, the 160 lb Rams, drew a bye this past week in NEYSA League Football.

Four different players each scored a touchdown for the 110 lb Raiders, three in the second half to lead the way over Clarence in the shutout score. Thaddeus Kedron, Daijon Kelly, Braeden Clody and Kaleb Moser all took hand offs from quarterback Michael Wright III and found the endzone on some pretty impressive running for nine and ten year old boys. Head coach Nate Evans and his assistants watched as the offense just took over the game in the second half.

"The team just came all together," said one coach after the game. "Maybe be-

cause we were home, playing in Riverside in front of our families, it made a difference. I don't know."

Earlier, the 90 lb Knights lost the day's first game to the Bulldogs despite some awesome play by their quarterback, Adrian Moser. Head coach Justin Weiss of Clarence was quick to highlight the play of Moser at the end of the game. "Our defense played good but you really had a good quarterback who was making plays."

Head coach Sean Ro-

gan and his assistant, Don Moser, however both stress that the Knights never really lose, they learn. "We take what we did out there and we cherish this. What we did wrong, we learn and use for the future."

The day's third game, the 135 lb Mustangs lost to the Bulldogs 30-0 but played well in the second half to crack the Clarence defense and stop the Bulldogs from additional points. The team was seeking it's second victory after defeating Williamsville Army last week, 12-6.

This week, the four teams play at home again against Cheektowaga. The Raiders play Friday night at 8:00 pm while the other three teams play Saturday, beginning at 2:00 pm. Come on out and watch the purple and yellow.

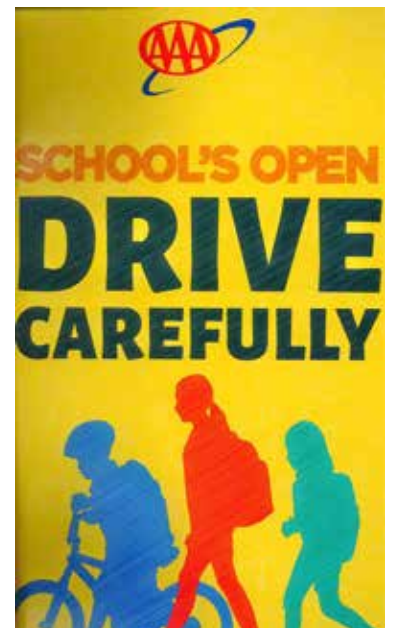

## Is My COLA Increase Based on My Current SS Benefit? – Ask Rusty

**Dear Rusty:** I started collecting SS when I turned 70 to maximize my income. One factor that is never mentioned is that the annual cost of living increase appears to be based on the previous year's payment. I've talked to others who are about my age (77), and we talked about how much of an adder we will receive. Those who collected earlier always get much less than I do. So, it appears that the annual increase is based on the previous year's payment and not on the original payment from when I started collecting, so it has a compounding impact. Frequently the increase received by those who collected early covers the Medicare increase plus a small adder, whereas I have been getting a much larger increase. Can you comment? **Signed:**

**Wondering**  
**Dear Wondering:** I'll be happy to clarify this for you. The annual Cost of Living Adjustment (COLA) for next year is determined by comparing this year's Consumer Price Index for the 3rd quarter (July-September) to the same period last year. If there is a difference (which there usually is), the percentage of difference becomes the COLA increase percentage for next year. The COLA is applied annually, starting with everyone's December benefit (paid in January). Everyone gets a different amount of COLA money because everyone's Social Security benefit payment is different. Your COLA dollar increase is more than most of your friends because you waited until you were 70 to

claim and, thus, have a higher benefit. Your friends who claimed earlier will have a smaller benefit and therefore get a smaller dollar amount as the cost of living increases. COLA is a percentage increase and, since the 2021 COLA increase was 1.3%, applying that percentage to each person's SS benefit amount results in a different dollar increase for each. And you're correct; since the percentage of increase is applied to your current benefit amount and not your original benefit amount, COLA increases are, indeed, compounded. To further complicate matters, Social Security's "hold harmless" provision sometimes results in beneficiaries paying less than the standard Medicare premium amount. If some-

one is now paying less than the monthly Medicare premium (\$148.50 for Part B (outpatient services)), any COLA increase awarded is used to bring their Medicare Part B premium up to (or closer to) the standard premium for that year. That means that sometimes the full amount of COLA dollars aren't reflected in each person's net Social Security payment, further confusing people when they see that their total SS payment didn't increase by the announced COLA percentage. So, as you can see, there are reasons why everyone's COLA looks different, but your basic point is correct – COLA is applied to your current SS benefit amount, not the SS benefit you were awarded when you claimed.

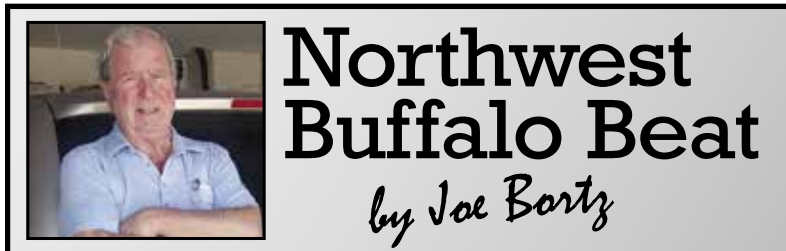

## Northwest Buffalo Beat

Heard these words, "the falling leaves drift by my window" from the song "Autumn Leaves". September 22nd was the first day of Fall here in the Northern Hemisphere. Have not seen any falling leaves drift by my window, yet, but they are coming and soon with all the brilliant colors and a magnificent display of nature at its best to come with it. To some it is their favorite time of year. The actual name for the beginning of fall is the Autumnal Equinox and as we know it happens once a year. That is where Autumn comes from.

As my late brother, who

was a retired science teacher, used to explain, it is the time of year when the sun is directly on the equator. Equinox means the days and nights are equal in time. Supposedly on the day considered the first day of Fall. It also happens in the Spring. Equal days again when the sun is on the equator and is called the Vernal equinox. My brother was much better at explaining it on Facebook with each seasonal change. His was of course giving the scientific reason explaining it in layman's terms. We looked forward to his contribution at the beginning of each season.

From now till December 21st the days continually grow shorter. We know that the first day of Winter is the shortest day of the year. The thing is that people like to dress up in costumes. Even the adults. As I look at the pictures in the archives of past parades. I see many adults really into it. I saw a councilman dressed as a politician and no one recognized him. I have put some of the past Halloween parade pictures on the Buffalo Rocket archive page on Facebook. There are lots of them from the past in North Buffalo and the West Side. Scroll down to find them.


