





We worked together, officials of all parties and beliefs, to do what's right for the people we serve.

I wish our friends in Albany and Washington would do the same.



Dear Rusty: I started Social Security about 2 years ago, and I thought that the monthly benefit amount stated to me by Social Security in their letter was guaranteed. That written amount was what I based my decision on to retire. Now I hear on the news that we may have to take a 24% reduction in the future. That will make me and millions of other seniors homeless. Was the original amount a guarantee of monthly income, and can the government reduce it whenever they want to?

Signed: Anxious Senior Dear Anxious: The reason you're now hearing about the possibility of a future reduction in Social Security benefits is because the SS Trustees 2021 Report to Congress was just released. This report, usually published in April, recaps the program's financial status at the end of the preceding year and provides Congress with a very detailed analysis of Social Security's (and Medicare's) financial picture. The Trustees report that beginning in 2021;

Social Security income will be less than needed to pay benefits, with the gap to be made up from Trust Fund reserves. Unless Congress makes some changes to the SS program, that trend will eventually result in the Trust Fund running dry, requiring an across-theboard cut in benefits.

This latest report predicts that the combined Trust Funds, which now hold nearly \$3 trillion in reserves, may be fully depleted by the year 2034 – one year earlier than last year's 2035 prediction. Although the 2034 date is new news this year, the mid-2030s potential depletion date has been reported for years, and it is not a new issue. Indeed, the 2019 report predicted 2034 as the possible depletion date, and last year's report predicted an improvement to 2035. One obvious reason for the one-year acceleration in the new report is the economic effect of the COVID-19 pandemic. While it certainly isn't good news, the fact is that the bad news isn't as bad as many pundits predicted. Some were suggesting that the depletion date may be as early as 2029, but the economy rebounded faster than expected. Depending on how you look at things, the depletion date only changing by one year could be viewed as positive considering the economic impact of the pandemic. Rest as-

But here's the botton line:

It is extremely doubtful that Congress will ever let the Social Security Trust Funds be fully depleted, necessitating a benefit cut to all recipients. To allow that to happen would be political suicide because over 64 million people rely on Social Security. Is your benefit guaranteed? Yes, but only within the boundaries of current law, which says that Social Security is allowed to only pay benefits using its own money (from payroll tax income, interest income, income tax revenues, and Trust Fund reserves). No benefits will be cut for as long as the Trust Fund can make up the difference between income received and benefits paid. But if there are no reserves to make up the difference, then (by law) Social Security can only pay out as much as it brings in.

alreadv Congress knows how to fix this issue and avoid a cut in Social Security benefits. What is missing is the bipartisanship and the political will to accomplish it because neither side currently appears receptive to solutions offered by the other side. Congress may continue to drag its feet on this issue, as has historically been done until urgency demands action. But I believe you can rest assured that Congress will eventually find the fortitude to restore Social Security to long-term solvency before any benefit cuts are made. You can help by calling your Congressional Representative and demanding that they adopt a bipartisan attitude toward Social Security reform. A good place for Congress to start would be by adopting the reform proposed by the Association of Mature American Citizens, which can be found at www.amac.us/social-security.



He has done many things, been to many places and certainly has seen lots of people. However, there is a downside to longevity. The longer you are on this Earth the more family and friends passing you must endure. The closer they are to you the more grief you suffer. One is left with just the memories of the times you have spent together. Sad but that is the way it is. Like the song says, "thanks for the mem-ories."

When I started the Rocket, it was with no knowledge or training in the publishing field. In the beginning I was the chief cook and bottle washer. It was just me, selling, writing, taking pictures, while still trying to run a print shop. I would close the shop in the afternoon and go out on the street to sell ads, take pictures, and find interesting topics to write about for the paper. I was no writer, but pictures I could do.

I eventually hired a retired older man as kind of an assistant to stay in the office so it would remain open all day. Funny as he was in his sixties, and I was in my thirties. Everyone thought he was the owner and got offended if I told him what to do. We got along fine, and I was able to get out more and do my thing. It was in those years that I spent going up and down Hertel and Delaware meeting hundreds of people. Many of these people became my good friends.

One of my early assignments was taking pictures of the Shoshone little league football games ev-

ery Saturday. These were good shots and made good copy for the Rocket. Met lots of the parents and of course they all wanted pictures of their kids in the "Rocket." It was here I met two brothers whose kids played football for one of the teams. Bob and John Hazelet. At the time they had a wig store near Mulligan's restaurant. We hit it off and they became my friends like so many other North Buffalo people.

The brothers were athletes and Bob had been drafted by the Detroit Tigers baseball team. Since we were all involved in sports, and especially football, our relationship grew. The brothers bought a pizzeria on Hertel called the La Hacienda. Two Irish wig salespeople, buying an Italian restaurant with a Hispanic name. They committed to advertising in my Rocket every week. The restaurant has never missed a weekly ad since they opened the doors over 40 years ago. We grew together both in business and in friendship. They both were my BFF's. We spent time together and had so many laughs. John helped me financially to buy a house back when we were struggling. We went to their kid's weddings,

Bob and I used to jog

the loop at Delaware park every day. We played golf together. We ran in 5K races together. As far as golf at one time he told me he would never chase a little white ball all over the place. Once I got him to the Delaware Park golf course, Bob was hooked, and really loved playing the game.

The brothers and I used to go out for a beer occasionally. I recall an evening at Mulligans on Hertel after a Buffalo Bills football game talking to O.J. Simpson. Bob was teasing O.J. about being tackled from behind. O.J. used to love hanging at Mulligans after a game and was always friendly.

I had lunch at Bob and John's restaurant just about every day. Chicken wings and a salad. In the beginning their wives, Marge, and Jane, were the only servers. The kids all contributed but were too young to really be a factor. Eventually they all become part of the business. John's son Tom now owns the restaurant.

The years go by and there is no stopping time and the inevitable. We lost John to cancer a few years back and last week my good long time friend Bob went to sleep with the angels. Even with all those fun-loving years we spent together, somehow, we lost contact. Which seems to always happen. Like so many times in life we think about our friends and intend to see them one more time as we are getting older. We are aware that time is running out.

There were plans to meet John for dinner that never happened. Over the years, lost track of Bob as he had left the restaurant business and retired. Turns out he lived within walking distance of my residence when he passed. Did not know, unfortunately. It is a sad thing when your final connection with a friend is reading their obituary. Guess the thing we learn here is to try to contact our old friends and as many as possible. By phone or email and just say hello. Would make you feel better and the person you contact would be happy to hear from you. We found out that this simple gesture works! Try it today.
