ECDOH Reminds Residents To "Keep The Bat"

Bat Week is observed each year from October 24-31, leading up to Halloween. The Erie County Department of Health (ECDOH) is using this opportunity to remind residents of how important it is to "keep the bat" if they find one in their house or apartment.

When temperatures dip, bats can seek warmer shelter in places like attics. Bats inside a home increase the risk of human contact with a bat, and with it the potential for exposure to

rabies. Healthy bats will avoid contact with humans and other animals. Bats infected with rabies can lose their ability to fly and can be found on the ground or in water, where people or pets may encounter them. Bats with rabies are often disoriented, increasing the likelihood that they end up inside a dwelling by accident.

The rabies virus affects the nervous system of humans and other mammals.

Bites, scratches or saliva exposure from an infected animal can transmit rabies to a human or pet. These bites and scratches from a bat's tiny teeth and claws may not be seen or felt. Special care should be taken if a person or pet has been sleeping in a room with a bat, especially children and people with intellectual, developmental or physical disabilities.

"Our environmental health and epidemiology staff are very experienced

in dealing with potential rabies exposures,” said Commissioner of Health Dr. Gale Burstein. “Anyone who has direct contact with a wild animal, any sort of animal bite, or who has been in a room with a bat while sleeping - call our department at (716) 961-6800. We have experience with thousands of potential rabies exposures, and can guide you through the steps to protect your health from this deadly disease.”

“Never release a live bat or throw out a dead bat

that has had, or could have had, direct contact with a person or pet, unless ECDOH tells you that testing is not necessary,” said Peter Tripi, manager of the Rabies and Vector Control Program.

What to do if there is a bat in your house or apartment:

1. Do not let the bat get outside.
2. If professional help is not available, capture the bat safely as described below. You will need leather or very thick work gloves (put them on), a small box or coffee can, a piece of

- cardboard, and tape.
3. When the bat lands, move slowly toward it.
4. While wearing the gloves, put the box or coffee can over the bat.
5. Then, slide the cardboard under the container to trap the bat inside.
6. Tape the cardboard to the container, and punch small holes in the cardboard, allowing the bat to breathe.
7. Immediately call the Erie County Department of Health at (716) 961-6800. If it is after regular business hours, please call (716) 961-7898.

Is Taxing Social Security Fair? – Ask Rusty

Dear Rusty: *Taxing Social Security benefits isn't fair. It would benefit everyone if seniors could earn as much as possible without having their Social Security taxed. We would still be paying into Social Security which would help the fund. I also feel that all people earning over \$100,000 should pay into Social Security because they can afford it. This would help fund Social Security without hurting anyone financially. Many seniors are struggling financially and should be able to earn as much as we can without a portion of our Social Security being taxed. Signed: Overtaxed Senior*

Dear Overtaxed Senior: Few would argue that paying income tax on Social Security benefits is fair. Nevertheless, Congress enacted taxation of Social Security benefits in 1983 as part of a reform package that restored Social Security to solvency at the time. When the law was first enacted, 50% of SS benefits were taxable for single tax filers who earned more than \$25,000 and for married couples

who earned more than \$32,000. That was the law until 1993, when Congress added another threshold for both single and married filers. The 1993 law allowed up to 85% of SS benefits to be taxed for single filers who earned more than \$34,000 and for married filers earning more than \$44,000.

Ever since enacted, those laws have been viewed as unfair by many senior organizations and especially by the individuals who paid income tax on their benefits. The unfortunate reality is that eliminating income tax on Social Security benefits without also implementing other offsetting reforms would exacerbate Social Security's now tenuous financial condition (income tax on benefits added \$41 billion to Social Security's revenue in 2020). Thus, calls today for repealing income tax on Social Security benefits go largely unheeded. It's worth noting that 13 U.S. states also levy a state income tax on Social Security benefits.

Although the payroll taxes you pay into Social

Security while working are different from income taxes on your benefits, people earning over \$100,000 today do pay into Social Security through a FICA tax (or self-employment tax) on their earnings. Paying this tax is what entitles you to receive Social Security benefits. The 2021

threshold after which SS contributions are no longer taken from earnings is \$142,800, and this amount goes up a bit each year. But even completely removing that payroll tax cap and further taxing higher earners would not fully resolve Social Security's current financial issues. Social Secu-

rity Trustees predict that monthly benefits are at risk of reduction starting in 2034 unless Congress acts to reform the program. Eliminating income tax on benefits is one of many suggestions now being considered in reform proposals, as is increasing (or eliminating) the payroll tax cap.
