# A Happy Holiday Season Is A Safe Holiday Season

As Erie County Clerk, responsible for overseeing Auto Bureau operations, it is time to remind everyone this holiday season to not drink and drive or ride with anyone who is under the influence. If you have had too much to drink, for everyone's sake, please do not get behind the wheel of your car.

We all look forward to celebrating this time of year with our family and friends, but if

celebrathose include tions alcohol, you, as a driver, need to plan ahead and arrange for a safe ride home. People who make the dangerous decision to drink and

drive will find that local law enforcement is serious about combatting reckless and irresponsible behavior.

According to Erie County's STOP DWI Office there have been approximately 10,707 DWI arrests throughout Erie County in since 2017. That is an average of 2,141 per year, equaling close to 6 DWI arrests per day. Another alarming statistic is that during the COVID-19 pandemic, arrests for impairment by drugs increased to 12% of arrests, compared to a 7%of annual arrests. Many continue to ask, "What will it take to prevent someone from getting behind the wheel when they have had too much to drink or are impaired by drugs?"

New York State imposes harsh driver license penalties for those with an impaired driving charge for either alcohol or drugs. If convicted of a misde-

meanor DWI, your license will be revoked for a minimum of 6 months. Aside from the tre-

mendous expense for an attorney, fines and insurance premium increases, there is total dis-

ruption of normal life, including possible loss of job and jail time for repeat offenders.

We need to keep in mind that preventing drunk driving is everyone's business, and we all need to take a leadership role in this fight! Driving while impaired is simply not worth endangering the lives of innocent people, while ruining your own life in the process.

I want to also remind everyone it really makes no difference whether the driver is impaired by alcohol or drugs. Impaired driving senselessly hurts and kills tens of thousands of people every single year.

According to the Na-onal Highway Traftional Highway Safety Administrafic tion (NHTSA) more than 10,000 people were killed in impaired-driving crashes in 2019 and NHTSA's National Roadside Survey found that more than 22%of drivers stopped by law enforcement tested positive for illegal, prescription or over-the-counter drugs.

Those who choose to drive under the influence of drugs, whether obtained legally or illegally, pose a danger to themselves, their passengers, and other motorists and pedestrians. Drug-impaired driving isn't a mistake; just like a DWI, it's a crime. Impairment is impairment, no matter the substance.

While celebrating the holidays, know the signs of when to hand over the keys and call a cab, a ride-sharing service or designate a sober driver before the party begins. Drunk driving is no accident; it is a choice and a potentially deadly one.

Let's make sure we all do our part in making this a happy and safe holiday season for everyone. Please don't drink and drive and don't drive high.

**The Blotter** Felonies From "D" District

#### North Buffalo December 7, 2021

Delaware Avenue – Defendant arrested at 2439 Delaware on outstanding warrant. In plain view in defendant's bedroom, one plastic container containing white rock substance weighing more than 500 mg., one glass pipe with burnt residue and one plastic bag containing brown powder. All recovered and submitted by patrol officer. Narcotics weighed 2.5 grams.

#### **December 7, 2021**

Hobmoor Street – Complainant and defendant did get into an argument over social media and complainant stated that defendant did pull out a knife threatening complainant by stating he was going to kill her. Defendant did also threaten to kill himself as he pointed knife at complainant. Defendant did also punch a hole in the wall and broke 2 end tables. Total \$100.00.

#### **December 7, 2021**

Saranac Avenue – The defendant did intentionally throw object at the complainant's house breaking multiple windows including the window on the front door and the living room window. The value of the damage exceeds \$250.00.

Hertel Avenue – Upon in-vestigation of a violent domestic call, officers did observe black Hi Point Smith & Wesson 40 caliber handgun loaded with 1 live round in the chamber and 7 live rounds in the magazine located in plain view on top of the refrigerator in a blue Bill's hat in the kitchen. Officers did also locate 8 red vials of a rock like substance, 11 pink vials of white rock like substance, 4 clear glass vials of white powder substance. 2 crack pipes on the couch under 2 pillows in the living room. A black scale and packaging along with plastic containers in the kitchen drawer. Officer did perform NIK test on the 4 clear glass vials of white powder and that tested positive or Fentanyl. Officer did perform NIK test on the 11 pink vials and 8 red vials and that did test positive for crack cocaine.

#### December 13, 2021

Colleton Street – Intel sent out a BOLO for the defendant and officers observed vehicle pull over in front of Colleton address. Vehicle is known to be operated by defendant, but the registered owner (defendant's mom) was operating said vehicle. When officers asked her to have the defendant talk to us, defendant came out on his own free will. Original report for charges.

#### December 12, 2021

Ontario Street – Victim states that his truck was

broken into a few weeks ago and he filed a report with Lancaster Police Department. Victim found the property on Facebook Marketplace and asked police to escort him to the address. Victim did show proof of property. Officer did then place defendant under arrest. Property consists of 2 Spectrum 350 cache and 2 amps \$799.00 and \$1,499.00.

#### **December 11, 2021**

Amherst Street – At approximately 1522 hours on this date, defendant did select and conceal various merchandise totaling \$610.29 while shopping at Wegman's.

#### December 11, 2021

Amherst Street – Defendant and co-defendant did take \$1,046.58 worth of merchandise and put it in reusable bags and passed all points of purchase making no attempt to pay for items. Defendants were apprehended in Wegman's parking lot.

#### **December 7, 2021**

Elmwood Avenue – The victim stated he went through his boyfriend's phone and confronted him regarding messages found. Defendant did attack victim striking him in the head causing bloody lacerations and punched victim numerous times above the face and head. Defendant did place hands around victim's throat, then did drag victim around the floor and did take his phone.

#### West Side December 12, 2021

Forest Avenue – Complainant states he was having an argument with the defendant about drinking the night before. The complainant went to pack his bags and leave when the defendant used a kitchen knife to cut his bags he was holding and cut his hand which required stitches.



#### December 10, 2021

Niagara Street - Defendant placed victim in a choke hold obstructing her breathing and threw her to the ground. While on the ground defendant struck victim on the head and body multiple time with a large black umbrella and did punch victim in the head multiple times causing swelling under the left eve. Defendant did disable WIFI in the apartment to prevent children and victim from calling for help. Defendant threatened victim that his family was going to come over if they call the police to "f\*\*\* up her family." 911 call was placed by child 2 who witnessed the entire altercation. Child 1 was also witness to entire altercation. Victim would like an order

of protection. Defendant transported to ECMC via AMR for medical evaluation before being brought to Central Booking. Child Protection Services notified. CIT report completed. Domestic incident report completed.

### Ask Rusty - How Do I Apply for Social Security Benefits?

**Dear Rusty:** I am a 74-year-old veteran enrolled with the VA. I have never had Medicare Part B. Should I? My only source of *income is Social Security. Signed: Retired Veteran* **Dear Retired Veteran:** First, thank you for your service to our country. Like

#### you, I use the VA for certain healthcare needs, but, unlike you, I am also enrolled in Medicare Part B. The decision on whether to have both is a personal choice only you can make, but I'll give you some things to consider:

If you are 100% satisfied with your VA coverage, and if that coverage is conveniently available to you, and if the VA provides all the health care you will ever need wherever you happen to be, then enrolling in Medicare Part B may not be needed in your personal situation. For me, the nearest full-service VA facility is about 40 miles away, while just about every imaginable private healthcare service is nearby. Thus, for convenience reasons, I am enrolled in Part B, so I can use any doctor or medical service provider I want within just a few miles of my home. I also travel a fair amount, and I like the convenience and flexibility of using any healthcare provider I happen to be near, without worrying about finding a VA facility or VA-affiliated private provider. So, for me, it all comes down to convenience and flexibility to use any healthcare provider I want. I use my VA coverage when it's convenient for me but otherwise use non-VA providers. But your needs

may be different.

Your choice may especially be different since your only source of income is Social Security. There is a premium associated with Medicare Part B (\$170.10 per month for 2022), which would be taken from your Social Security payment, thus reducing it. That may create a financial issue for you, which is obviously an important consideration when deciding if you should also enroll in Part B to supplement your VA coverage. But there's yet another concern if you enroll in Part B now.

Since you're 74 and have relied solely on the VA for your healthcare needs since turning 65, you'll be subject to a Late Enrollment Penalty if you enroll in Part B now, and that penalty may make Part B even more unaffordable for you. Your VA health care coverage isn't considered a "creditable" alternative to Part B, which means that a Late Enrollment Penalty of 10% additional premium will be assessed for each full year you went without Part B coverage. For example, instead of the standard Part B premium of \$170.10, your premium with the late enrollment penalty could be about \$323 per month. And, unfortunately, that penalty lasts for as long as you are enrolled in Part B and will increases along with any increases to the Part B premium as time passes.

For your awareness, if Social Security is your only source of income, you may be eligible for your state's Medicare Savings Program, which can assist you with paying Medicare premiums and copayments. If your income falls below the required thresholds, you may be eligible for the Medicare Savings Program as described at this website: www.benefits.gov/benefit/4396.
