

#### Parochial Baseball 100 Year

It's been a special year for Rev. Richard Zajac of the Buffalo Catholic Diocese. This year marked the 100th season of Parochial School Baseball here in Western New York and everyday he meets a man who once played in this grammar school program, reminding him of their play on the diamonds of Delaware, Cazenovia of Brighton Parks. Begun in 1921 as the Parochial Baseball Association, the Diocese offered the sport originally during the summer months. Schools like Mount St. Joseph's, Our Lady of Czestochowa and Corpus Christi won early Championships before 1960, when the league was changed to the fall Seasons. In 1971, the Church decided to end baseball for Catholic families.

That's when Zajac came in. Known by his nickname now as the "Duke," he got the Father Baker Council Knights of Columbus to serve as a new sponsor. Then, with help from the Amyets Post #45 five years

later, he watched as Jack Jerge from South Buffalo worked side by side with the Duke, to save the game for the countless boys who grew up to play in area Schools. North Buffalo is home to

North Buffalo is home to several area schools who have excelled in Baseball for boys at such a young age. The St. Marks' School on Woodward Avenue is just one of many Parochial Schools to have won several Championships in recent years. The program teaches boys between grades 3-8 the game of baseball every year from Labor Day to Columbus.

Zajac has been a part of this League for 51 years and some credit him for keeping the game going for young boys. Presently, there's 15 teams for players in grades sixth through eighth and another 12 teams in a smaller, JV division for third to fifth grade. His love for the game is just as high as his chosen field of Ministry for the Catholic Diocese.

"I've had plenty of help though, over the years,"

says Zajac, recently. "Three men serve as a Director for different parts of Western New York. If not for Bob Ziolkowski, Jim Kelly and Pat Hanley taking care of certain parts of our area, we'd be in trouble. Our JV Program is strong with both George Kunz and Mike Talluto in charge. Two others have been with me the longest in Paul Riester and Ed Hoak."

Former Buffalo Bison Hall of Fame Member and Buffalonian Cy Williams, who became a scout for the Detroit Tigers, was very helpful to Zajac during the early years. The winning trophy was named in his honor and Williams served as the evenings guest speaker for consecutive league banquets

over the years.

Notable Buffalonians who got their start playing in this League include Mike Buczkowski of the Bisons, former Major League pitcher Billy Scherrer and NBA star Christian Laettner.

Zajac wishes to acknowledge whenever possible his gratitude to the Buffalo City Parks Department and to the Olmsted Parks Conservancy for maintaining the diamonds on City Parks. "I wouldn't have been able to do this without them."

Riester, a long-time coach in North Buffalo, has watched the growth of St. Marks' School Sports over three decades and is responsible for getting the JV program started in 1992. "Some Schools didn't have enough boys in the sixth grade," he said. "We had to add younger boys to the League at a Junior Varsity Level, so they could all play."

The growth of the Parochi-

al School League in these 100 years has helped keep Baseball alive in the homes of Buffalo families. Fathers playing catch with their sons soon discovered various little leagues formed in certain areas of the City. In 1957, four youth baseball teams began playing in nearby Shoshone Park. It's been a celebration ever since



The Cy Williams Cup has been awarded to the Championship winning team of the Parochial Schools Baseball League which this year celebrated its 100th season in WNY. Rev. #### Ask Rusty - How Do I Apply for **Social Security Benefits?**

Dear Rusty: I am a 74-year-old veteran enrolled with the VA. I have never had Medicare Part B. Should I? My only source of income is Social Security. Signed: Retired Veteran

Dear Retired Veteran: First, thank you for your service to our country. Like you, I use the VA for certain healthcare needs, but, unlike you, I am also enrolled in Medicare Part B. The decision on whether to have both is a personal choice only you can make, but I'll give you some things to consider:

If you are 100% satisfied with your VA coverage, and if that coverage is conveniently available to you, and if the VA provides all the health care you will ever need wherever you happen to be, then enrolling in Medicare Part B may not be needed in your personal

situation. For me, the nearest full-service VA facility is about 40 miles away, while just about every imaginable private healthcare service is nearby. Thus, for convenience reasons, I am enrolled in Part B, so I can use any doctor or medical service provider I want within just a few miles of my home. I also travel a fair amount, and I like the convenience and flexibility of using any healthcare provider I happen to be near, without worrying about finding a VA facility or VA-affiliated private provider. So, for me, it all comes down to convenience and flexibility to use any healthcare provider want. I use my VA coverage when it's convenient for me but otherwise use non-VA providers. But your needs may be differ-

Your choice may especially be different since your only source of income is Social Security. There is a premium


associated with Medicare Part B (\$170.10 per month for 2022), which would be taken from your Social Security payment, thus reducing it. That may create a financial issue for you, which is obviously an important consideration when deciding if you should also enroll in Part B to supplement your VA coverage. But there's yet another concern if you enroll in Part B now.

Since you're 74 and have relied solely on the VA for your healthcare needs since turning 65, you'll be subject to a Late Enrollment Penalty if you enroll in Part B now, and that penalty may make Part B even more unaffordable for you. Your VA health care coverage isn't considered a "creditable" alternative to Part B, which means that a Late Enrollment Penalty of 10% additional premium will be assessed for each full year you went without Part B coverage. For example, instead of the standard Part B premium of \$170.10, your premium with the late enrollment penalty could be about \$323 per month. And, unfortunately, that penalty lasts for as long as you are enrolled in Part B and will increase along with any increases to the Part B premium as time passes.

For your awareness, if Social Security is your only source of income, you may be eligible for your state's Medicare Savings Program, which can assist you with paying Medicare premiums and copayments. If your income falls below the required thresholds, you may be eligible for the Medicare Savings Program as described at this website: www.benefits. gov/benefit/4396.



Really enjoyed your column this week about football and especially your experiences as a high schooler at Grover Cleveland. I remember Mr. Missana being the prominent high school football coach in the area for years back then. I don't remember a high schooler being caught up in a mob hit though. Would sure like to know the details. There certainly was a major mob presence for years, as has been well documented. The hit on John Cammilleri in front of Roseland's on Rhode Island Street comes to mind. That was my neck of the woods growing up.

I never played organized football as a kid, but we would get a bunch of us together and go down to Front Park near the Peace Bridge entrance in the shadow of the Oliver Hazard Perry monument and play "touch" among ourselves or against anybody else who showed up. One of our guys was trying out for the team at Hutch Tech, my alma mater, and showed us the training exercises and some plays. No helmets or pads, but I remember putting on as many layers of sweaters as I could, no matter the temperature, just for the padding. Lots of cuts, bruises and a few loose teeth, but nothing serious.

At one of our get-to-gethers, a big Cadillac convertible pulled up in the parking lot next to our field and this huge guy in a red buffalo plaid shirt got out. He had a big brown paper bag and proceeded to make himself comfortable sitting on the front fender of his Caddy. Yukon Eric, a celebrity on the professional wrestling circuit at the time, which was huge in Buffalo, spent his lunchtime watching a bunch of kids beat the hell out of each other while he devoured a whole fried chicken. We didn't get offered any chicken but did get a greasy autograph.



The last game I attended was at some field in the City of Tonawanda where at half time the opposing team, who were losing, was gathered under the stands where I was sitting.
