

Good-Bye 2021
This year marked the return of Hertel North

Park Baseball and Softball to the diamonds of Shoshone Park after the cancellation of the 2020 season. The 64 year old League and its current board of directors worked tirelessly back on January 13th, at their first meeting, to make sure this Covid-19 Pan-demic wasn't go-ing to take away

another season from all the boys and girls who had signed up to play the previous year.

Working closely with the City of Buffalo and

the Erie County Health Department, masks were to be worn, six feet diswere off and boys and girls learned the game of baseball or softball in prac-tices scheduled in late March and April, getting ready for the new season. And what a season it was.

For the first time in its history, the numbers of boys and girls registered to play exceeded the one thousand mark, forcing new teams to be created in several divisions. Triple AAA Boys added two more teams. A fourth Major team was added for the Girls and both the Rookie boys and girls divisions expanded with teams. There were even waiting lists created for most divisions, of boys and girls ready to play, if another child couldn't meet for a practice or team meeting.

By the time the League opened their season on Saturday, May 9th, the usual ceremonies of an annual parade up Hertel Avenue from the Cornelius Building at Saranac was a casualty of 2021

because of this pan-demic. The annual rite of Spring in North Buffalo with children marching with their coaches under the guidance of the Buffalo Police and Fire units through the busy

North Buffalo corridor to Shoshone Park was put on hold by league officials for possibly just one

Mother Nature cooperated with the League throughout much of the season. If there was any disturbance overnight from a soaking rain, the aforementioned board of directors arrived early on a Saturday to get as many as eight diamonds ready for play for sometimes as many as 30 games.

"I think it was because of how we were told to stay indoors and not travel during the height of Covid," said most parents around Opening Day to League officials when asked for the turn out of so many children. "We just needed something for

our kids to do now with better weather outside."

By the time the season ended, as many as nine teams had won Championships in house baseball and softball with some very exciting playoffs for all the teams. In Hertel North Park, every team makes the playoffs and is matched up against comparable talent on its way to the finals. As in any sport, the longer a team keeps winning, their season continues, If a team loses twice in the playoffs, boys or girls all between the ages of six to sixteen, get to go home and enjoy the rest of their summer. Here are your winners from this past season.

Rookie Girls were the Angels; Minor Girls were the Giants, Major Girls were the Cardinals and Senior Girls were the Blue Jays. For the Boys, again starting in Rookie Division, two winners, the Angels and the Red Sox, Double AA were the Pirates. Triple AAA were the Angels, Major Boys were the Reds and Senior Boys were the Phillies. Congratulations to all the winners for 2021.

For the first time this past season, the League decided to present winning trophies to the teams who won the Championships in various Divisions just after the winning run was scored or the final out was made at first base regardless of the night or Division. Gone was the annual banquet for winning teams held in a restaurant catered by a competent staff of workers in a North Buffalo location. Who knows what 2022 will bring? If Hertel North Park has anything to do with it, it might be a homerun of an event.

Ask Rusty - Should I Take Social **Security Even If I Don't Need It?**

Dear Rusty: I am 66 years plus 8 months old, am still working making six figures, and can support myself. I'm a self-employed healthy, single woman and have a State Pension (from a divorce settlement). I will work part-time, probably through next year and until I am 70 years old or more. What should I do about my Social Security - take it or "bank it" in Social Security? Signed: **Fully** Independent Lady

Dear Fully Independent: When to take

your Social Security is always a personal choice which should look at your health, life expectancy, and need for the money at this time. Since you imply that you don't really need the money at this time, you might choose to simply wait until age 70 to claim, which will give you both the highest possible monthly benefit in your later years, as well as the most in cumulative lifetime benefits if you enjoy at least average longevity.

Statistically, according to Social Security, a healthy woman your current age will, on average, live to about 87. If you wait until age 70 to claim (vs. claiming now), your benefit will be about 30% higher, and you'll break even money-wise when you're about 83. Depending upon your benefit

amount and how long you live, that could give you tens of thousands of dollars more in benefits during your later years, and that higher monthly SS benefit would be a good hedge against future inflation.

Keep in mind too that, at your current income level, up to 85% of your Social Security benefits will become part of your taxable income. Even if you are only working part-time, your combined income from all sources (including half of your SS benefits) will cause a minimum of 50% of your SS benefits for each tax year to become part of your taxable income at your normal IRS tax rate. The point being that the amount of your SS benefits which will be taxed by the IRS, is related to your overall income, so

there are tax advantages to waiting to claim until your income is lower.

We can only advise you on your Social Security options. If you wish to consider claiming your SS earlier and investing those benefits, you should seek the services of a Certified Financial Planner who can discuss your investment options, your risk tolerance, and the possible rate of return. From a Social Security standpoint, waiting until age 70 will maximize your benefit amount and, if you enjoy at least average longevity, reduce your "longevity "risk" (the risk you might outlive your money). It will also yield the most in lifetime ŠS benefits. But, in the end, only you can make that decision after carefully considering all your options.

Since the Hertel Walls art project started in 2017 it has become an integral part of Hertel Avenue. The many murals that have become a part of the walls of many businesses shows the culture and lively presence that is constantly happening on Hertel.
