



In Josh We Trust

By the time you read this, several days will have passed since the heartbreaking loss to the Chiefs Sunday night in Arrowhead Stadium. Whether our sadness is more bearable now, one fact is undeniable.

The Buffalo Bills and its tremendous fan base of Bills Mafia has electrified the NFL, putting this City on the map of football

nation where the team will be discussed before next season. Gone are the

days of four consecutive losses from 1991 to 1994 in the Super Bowls against the Giants, the Redskins and twice to the Cowboys. Instead, a new generation of Bills Mafia will know of how the franchise turned itself around with the seventh overall draft pick of Josh Allen in 2018.

What we witnessed in a prime-time National television broadcast against a favored Kansas City team is continued proof of the direction of this team since the day Terry and Kim Pegula purchased the team to keep them in Western New York and the hiring of a new coach to lead the Bills on the field. It has been an uphill battle since those early days of the franchise, where Buffalo was getting run over by the likes of the New England Patriots in a rivalry that was turning vicious. Once

General Manager Brandon Beane was brought in on the recommendation of new Coach Sean McDermott, the Bills were putting together the key pieces to a winning franchise that they hadn't seen since the days of Bill Polian and Marv Levy.

Then, before last year, when the Bills schedwere uled to make a late first round pick based on

the 2019 season, Beane brought in a tremendous receiver from the Minnesota Vikings by the name of Stefon Diggs to give the Bills and quarterback Josh Allen an offensive threat through the air against primarily AFC teams like the Dolphins. Jets and aforementioned Patriots. The elusive star receiver had up until that time, caught a miraculous 27 yard pass from QB Case Keenum and raced for a touchdown as time expired in a 29-24 victory in a 2018 playoff game against the New Orleans Saints.

Now with the likes of Emmanuel Sanders, Gabriel Davis, Isaiah McKenzie and Dawson Knox also catching a pass from the winner from Wyoming behind center Mitch Morse, Zach Moss and Devin Singletary have found room to run finally on the ground whether it's in Highmark Stadium or any other opposing field in the NFL.

time to the Chiefs ends a roller-coaster season that saw the team lose six previous games during the regular season, includ-ing a 14-10 defeat to New England at home. A 38-20 victory at Kansas City in week five gave the Bills confidence for this Playoff game after a second victory over the Patriots January 15th, 47-27. Had the Bills not lost to teams like Jacksonville and Indianapolis in November, Buffalo would not have sunk so low at certain points in a season that zoomed by quickly. The loss of Cornerback Tre'Davious White during the Saints game that ended his season, was like a speed bump on a fast track.

With 2022 and the added loss of Brandon Beane's "right hand man" Joe Schoen to the New York Giants, July Training Camp can't come soon enough. Provided the team doesn't suffer the loss of a key player or Coordinator like Brian Daboll and Leslie Frazier, WNY and Bills Nation will try to turn the page in the months ahead and shake off this heartbreaking loss in a Pandem-ic year. The Bills make me want to Shout!





Ask Rusty - Is My Analysis Of My Wife's Social Security Correct?

Dear Rusty: I'm 60 years of age and wonder if I will have any Social Security retirement benefits. After all, I did purchase them. **Signed: Uncertain**

Dear Uncertain: Your eligibility for Social Security benefits depends upon your lifetime earnings history from work, from which Social Security FICA taxes were withheld. If you have worked, contributed to SS while working, and have earned at least 40 "quarters" of credit, you will be entitled to Social Security benefits. You can earn up to four credits each year by earning a specific amount of money, which means you must have worked for about 10 years contributing to Social Security in order to be eligible for Social Security benefits. For 2022, you will get 4 credits if you earn at least \$6040 (the amount needed per credit varies by year). The amount of benefit you will get depends upon your av-erage monthly earnings (adjusted for inflation) over the highest-earning 35 years of your lifetime. The higher your annual earnings (from which FICA tax was withheld), the more

your SS benefit will be. But you must have worked, earned and contributed to SS for at least 35 years to get your maximum benefit. SS always uses 35 years of earnings to compute your benefit and if you have fewer, they will put \$0 earnings in some years to make it 35. They will use the monthly average of those 35 years to determine your primary benefit (known as your "Primary Insurance Amount" or "PIA" which is what you get at your full retirement age (FRA).

You cannot collect your personal SS retirement benefit until you are at least 62 years old, but if you claim at that age your benefit will be permanently reduced by 30%. You can only get your full SS benefit by waiting until your full retirement age (age 67 for you) to claim your Social Security. Claiming any earlier means a smaller benefit, but you can also delay longer and earn Delayed Retirement Credits (DRCs) up to age 70, when your maximum benefit would be 24% more than it would be at your FRA. You have an 8 year window to claim your Social Security, and when you claim within that window determines how much of your primary SS benefit you will get.

If you claim before your FRA and you continue to work, Social Security places a limit on how much you can earn before they take away some of your benefits. For example, someone who claims at age 63 in 2022 would have an annual earnings limit of \$19,560, and if that were exceeded SS would take away benefits equal to \$1 for every \$2 over the limit (a monthly limit may be imposed if you claim mid-year). earnings limit applies until FRA is reached, after which there is no longer a limit to how much can be earned.

The easiest way to determine your eligibility for Social Security benefits and how much that benefit would be at different ages is to obtain a Statement of Estimated Benefits from the Social Security Administration. You can request that by calling SS at 1.800.772.1213, but you can also get it yourself by creating your personal "my Social Security" online account at www.ssa. gov/myaccount. Once you have created your personal online account you can see your lifetime record of earnings and download your Statement of Estimated Benefits to understand whether you are entitled to Social Security benefits and, if so, how much your benefit will be if claimed at various ages.



The holiday season is often a hectic time of year. For those who are older, or disabled, the tasks of shopping and traveling can become extremely difficult as the need to get around becomes more demanding and limited. During this time of year, adult children that take care of their older family members begin to realize how difficult it is for them to run errands without assistance. They also note how lonely their family members are as they become busy with the winter season as their visits are often less frequent.

Hearts and Hands can assist with these needs, while providing volunteer-based care giver support. Caregiver support consists of having a friendly conversation over coffee, a meal, or at home, completing puzzles, watching television, reading, and much more. It does not involve giving hands on medical care.

Bridgette, a Hearts and Hands volunteer has become a notable caregiver support volunteer with the organization. Bridgette became involved with the Hearts and Hands after retiring in 2015.
