Snow plows need access to clear streets for emergency responders.

Mayor Byron W. Brown today urged Buffalo residents to follow Winter Parking and Alternate Side Parking regulations to aid with snow removal and first responder access as snowstorms move into the region.

Buffalo residents and workers are asked to follow all the posted parking reg-

ulations which will allow our plowing crews to clear streets more efficiently, and help our first responders do their critical work.

Under the City's Winter Parking Regulations, no parking is allowed along bus routes from 1:30 a.m. to 7 a.m. every day through April 1, 2022.

The 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. al-

ternate side parking rules are posted on all applicable residential streets and are in effect year round. Violators of the parking regulations are subject to ticketing and towing.

Warning To Motorists Of New Text Messaging Scam

Erie County Clerk Michael P. Kearns is alerting residents about a new text message phishing scheme that is circulating across Erie County. The text messages include a link that claims to direct consumers to a page that will provide information of overpayment to the New York State Department of Motor Vehicles (NYS DMV). The link then prompts individuals to confirm their email in an embedded link in order to acquire a refund.

Phishing is an attempt by scammers to acquire

sensitive personal information from unsuspecting users by disguising themselves as trustworthy businesses, organizations or individuals, such as a government agency like the NYS DMV. Scammers use this information to steal people's identities or trick them into installing malicious software, known as malware, onto internet-connected devices such as their cell phone.

Phishing attacks are big business and are one of the most common online scams. They often tell a story to trick you into clicking on a

link or opening an attachment and can be carried out through emails, text messages, phone solicitations, fraudulent social media accounts or websites.

The most common indicators of a phishing attempt usually involve tone, grammar and urgency in a text message or email subject line. Major warning signs are an unfamiliar greeting, grammatical errors and misspelled words.

County Clerk Kearns states, "The best way to protect yourself from an attack is to be aware, avoid opening or responding and delete the messages immediately. If possible, you can block the number or email address from your device to prevent further contact."

North Buffalo January 27, 2022
Colvin Avenue – Officers dispatched to robbery call. Officers located suspects. The defendant did display what appeared to be a firearm and demanded money from register. commands and was needed to be forcibly removed from the vehicle. Open container recovered. Defendant refused Standard Field Sobriety Test.

When victim refused arrested stated, he was going to "get people after her." Arrested then kicked in the front door breaking the lock and gained access into the home and did continue to make threats.

Ask Rusty – Will My Social Security Benefits Ever Be Non-Taxable?

Dear Rusty: If we take our Social Security at our full retirement age (66 years and 6 months for both of us) and we both continue to work, what are the income tax consequences? Is there an age at which we can still work and draw Social Security without tax consequences on our benefits? **Signed: Overtaxed Couple**

Dear Overtaxed Couple: Regardless of when you claim your Social Security benefits, whether those benefits are subject to federal income tax depends entirely upon your

income as reported to the IRS. This is true even if you collect Social Security benefits after you reach your full retirement age – there is no age at which SS benefits become exempt from Federal Income Tax. Here's how it works:

Taxation of your Social Security benefits depends on two things – first, the amount of your combined income from all sources (known as your Modified Adjusted Gross Income or “MAGI”) and second, your income tax filing status (whether you file your income taxes individually or

jointly as a married couple). Your “MAGI” consists of your Adjusted Gross Income (AGI) on your income tax return, plus half of your Social Security benefits received for the tax year, plus any other non-taxable income you may have had.

If your MAGI for the tax year exceeds certain thresholds, then some of your Social Security benefits are taxable at whatever your normal IRS tax rate is. If, as a couple, you file your income taxes as “married-filing jointly,” and your MAGI is over \$32,000, then 50% of your Social Security benefits received during the tax year becomes part of your overall taxable income at whatever tax rate is standard for your income. But if your MAGI as a couple for the tax year exceeds \$44,000 then up to 85% of your SS benefits becomes part of your overall taxable income. If your MAGI as a married couple is less than \$32,000 then your Social Security benefits aren't taxable.

For those who file their federal income taxes as a single the thresholds are lower. If your MAGI as a single filer is \$25,000 or less, your Social Security benefits aren't taxable. However, if your MAGI as a single filer is more than \$25,000, then half of your Social Security benefits received during the tax year becomes part of your overall taxable income, and if your MAGI as a single filer is more than \$34,000 then up to 85% of your benefits for the tax year becomes part of your taxable income. But a word of caution for those who are married but choose to file taxes “married – filing separately”- if you file separately and live together at any time during the

tax year, the threshold for taxation of Social Security benefits is zero.

So, Federal taxation of your Social Security benefits depends entirely upon your combined income from all sources and your income tax filing status – your age doesn't come into the picture at all, even if you are collecting Social Security benefits after your full retirement age. Be aware, however, that a dozen U.S.

states levy an income tax on Social Security benefits, so you should check the tax laws in your state of residence to see if some or all your Social Security benefits will be taxed by the state you live in. of earnings and download your Statement of Estimated Benefits to understand whether you are entitled to Social Security benefits and, if so, how much your benefit will be claimed at various ages.

Mayor Byron W. Brown today joined Marco Sciortino, founder of Little Smiles of WNY, for the official unveiling of the new Little Smiles Room at the Buffalo Police Department's (BPD's) C-District, located at 696 E. Ferry St.

The child-friendly room was donated by the Little Smiles organization to make police stations less scary and intimidating to kids, especially those involved in domestic situations, accidents, or are waiting while a parent or family member is meeting with officers.

"We thank Little Smiles for the generous donation to create this special room. This builds on our community policing efforts and outreach to our youngsters to forge positive relations," Mayor Brown said. "This wonderful room is wonderful and Little Smiles is creating similar child-friendly spaces at all our districts." Little Smiles spent \$3,000 to convert a former holding room into a safe comfortable environment for the children to rest, play or eat. The freshly-decorated room

has been outfitted with custom-built furniture, a TV, toys, books, blankets, snacks, and winter outerwear for children who are in need.


"Our board decided to work collaboratively with the BPD help with the well-being of any child in police care. We hope these rooms provide a safe, friendly and comfortable environment to ease the anxiety of being at a police precinct," Sciortino said.

Little Smiles has begun work on a second Little Smiles room at the BPD's E-District, which is expected to open in early spring. Planning is also underway for a third room at B-District.

Founded in 2019, Little Smiles of WNY is a volunteer-driven, non-profit children's charity. Its goal is to help heal hearts and create little smiles by providing gifts and fun activities to children impacted by serious illness, homelessness, or tragedy. The organization works with local professionals, such as doctors, nurses,

child life specialists, and social workers, to help kids escape their unfortunate circumstances, even if only for a short period of time.

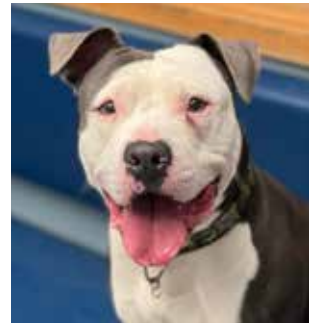
