North Buffalo February 26, 2022

Delaware Avenue - Officers did observe vehicle running in plaza of closed businesses posted Overnight Parking" signs. When officers approached male, male said he did not have any form of ID and when asked his name he gave a false name. Male was advised by patrol officer that it was a crime to lie about name in NYS. When asked again by patrol officer, again the male replied with same fake name. Male was ID'd by patrol officer and has revoked NYS license and multiple warrants. Officers did see in plain view on center console white powder substance and an open bottle of liquor in cup holder (Rem, Martin.) Upon inventory search of vehicle patrol officer recovered six tied off clear plastic baggies with white powdery substance (cocaine.) Clear tied off baggie with white powder substance in passenger front seat area weighing approximately 20.8 grams. Patrol officer did recover multiple clear sandwich baggies in front passenger floor and patrol officer did recover scale with white residue in center console. Bottle of liquor and baggies P-10'd by patrol officer and narcotics and scale submitted to lab by patrol office. Patrol officer did recover large amount of cash \$3,864.07 which was sized at cell block that was in

front pocket of defendant's jacket.

February 24, 2022

Delaware Avenue- BPD Narcotics observed male exiting known drug apartment. Detective knocked on the door and two males fled out the first-floor window observed by Lieutenant. Patrol officer apprehended defendant's next door. Detective 2 recovered clear bag containing 15 grams of crack/cocaine on ground near window of apartment. Patrol officer recovered digital scale containing residue in plain view on kitchen counter. Patrol officer submitted all evidence.

February 24, 2022

Shoreham Avenue- Officers received a call about a domestic in progress. Upon arrival officers did see female victim with a bruised face and blood around her mouth. Victim did not want to sign domestic abuse paperwork. Officers do have witness to incident and Supporting Deposition was written.

February 23, 2022

Jewett Parkway – Victim states defendant (boyfriend) did grab a broken coffee table leg and swing it at her hitting her on the upper right arm causing a bruise. Victim states she did fear for her life thinking he was going to hit her head. Victim states defendant also pushed her on the bed and put two of his

hands around the front of her neck and did apply pressure for approximately 5 seconds. Victim has scratch marks as well.

Riverside **February 28, 2022**

East Avenue - Defendant did strike with closed fists victim in the face causing bleeding bruising pain. Victim states defendant did also choke her to the point of her breathing changed but did not lose consciousness. Defendant also destroyed victim's shampoo and body wash.

Ask Rusty - About Survivor **Benefits For Minor Children**

Dear Rusty: I just turned 64 and now get stuff about Medicare and Medigap and so on. I really don't know how to retire when it's time. What should I do? What am I looking for? Am I eligible for anything as of now? I'm so confused about all this that I don't even know if I can retire when it's time. Maybe I should just continue working so I don't have to try to figure this out. Signed: Confused

Dear Confused: Deciding when to retire from work is usually a difficult decision for everyone, so don't feel alone as you struggle with deciding what's best for you personally. I'll try to provide some insight into what you should be looking at now, at age 64:

The reason you're now getting all that unsolicited information about Medicare and "Medigap" is because you're approaching

the magic age of 65, when you first become eligible for those senior healthcare services. But if you are still working and now have "creditable" healthcare coverage from your employer, you don't need to enroll in any Medicare plan until your employer coverage ends (If your employer healthcare coverage is a group plan with at least 20 participants, that coverage

is "creditable"). So, if you plan to continue working and have creditable healthcare coverage, you can simply ignore all those healthcare solicitations. You don't need to worry about enrolling in Medicare until your creditable employer coverage ends, at which point you will be able to enroll in a Medicare program without incurring a late enrollment penalty.

You also do not need to apply for Social Security now (or at age 65) – you can wait until you retire from working full time to apply for Social Security. In fact, you probably should wait until you fully retire from working to claim Social Security because, at age 64 (or 65), you will be subject to Social Security's "earnings test" if you claim SS benefits.

Buffalo Residents To Apply For The 2022 Firefighter Entry Exam

Mayor Byron W. Brown was joined by Fire Commissioner William Renaldo, City **Human Resources Commis**sioner Gladys Herndon-Hill and Members of the Firefighter Recruitment Team, on February 28, 2022 to announce a new outreach recruitment campaign aimed at encouraging minorities, women, and veterans to join the ranks of the Buffalo Fire Department. The

next Firefighter Civil Service Exam will be administered on Saturday, June 4, 2022. Potential candidates mustfill out an initial application by Friday, April 29, 2022. For more information or to download an application, go www.buffalony.gov/fire-

The theme of the City's fire exam recruitment campaign is "Home of the Brave" and features active Buffalo Firefighters in print ads and videos that will be posted and shared on all traditional and digital communication platforms.

"As we continue to invest in the Fire Department, we are committed to filling its ranks with qualified men and women who represent our city's diverse communities," Mayor Brown said. "The BFD offers challenging and fulfilling career opportunities, and we encourage all eligible Buffalo residents to apply to take the test and become one of the brave in the Buffalo Fire Department.'

"This recruitment campaign is critical to ensuring that the Fire Department's ranks reflect the commu-

nities they serve," said Commissioner Renaldo. "We are confident that this outreach campaign will spur great interest and encourage the many diverse groups that make up our City to apply for the upcoming firefighter exam."

As part of the new recruitment strategy, the BFD will conduct an outreach campaign, placing ads in local publications that target ethnically diverse areas. A special emphasis will be placed on connecting with church pastors, youth groups, community service organizations and area colleges. Buffalo Fire Department Recruiters will also host several Open Houses, where potential candidates can learn more about the

process of becoming a firefighter. They will also distribute flyers and posters, and attend a variety of community block club meetings and outdoor events in an effort to strike up interest in the upcoming fire exam.

To be eligible, the right candidate:

- Must be 19 years old at the time of the examination and 20 years old at the time of appointment • Must be a full-time resident of the City of Buffalo as of January 29, 2022 and maintain city residence • Willing and able to perform physically demanding work
- Manages stress and adverse outcomes well

The firefighter exam in Buffalo will be administered on Saturday, June 4th. Potential applicants can go to www.buffalony.gov/firefighter to download a copy of the application or they can stop by Buffalo City Hall, Room 1001 to pick up an application. Today's announcement continues the Brown Administration's significant investment in the Fire Department since 2006 and demonstrates its continued commitment to filling the Department's ranks with qualified men and women who represent our city's diverse communities.
