Shine A Light On North Buffalo Players

This season in the Hertel North Park Youth Baseball League, your sons or daughters will be shining brighter on the diamonds of Shoshone Park.

That's because League officials have been working hard during the long winter to make the 65 year old boys and girls baseball and softball League even better. With Opening Day less than a month away, its board of directors are now asking everyone in the League and their friends to help defray the cost of having new and improved lighting on diamonds used during July and August.

This season's increased numbers in registration of boys and girls to play this Summer has forced the league to schedule games on all diamonds wherever possible. Two of the Park's eight diamonds have four light towers situated at each corner of Diamond #1 and Diamond #2, giving off adequate light to boys and girls over the years however they needed to be replaced.

"The lights were outdated," according to an email sent out by the League last week. "They needed to be replaced with safer, more energy efficient LED bulbs."

Now, after a cost of \$30,000, this North Buffalo institution that's been teaching the game of Baseball and Softball to all children in Shoshone Park since 1957 is asking everyone to help the League by

throwing a "Light Up Shoshone Park" party to be held on Friday night, May 6th at the K O Sports Bar, located on Delaware Avenue near Hertel the night before Opening Day. The event will run from 7:00 - 10:00 pm and will include pizza and beer for just \$25.00 per person.

On Opening Day Saturday, May 7th, boys and girls will walk a mile in order to play baseball and softball

in North Buffalo. Families will start gathering around 11:00 am on the Southeast corner of Hertel and Saranac Avenue where they'll meet League officials. All players will be wearing new jerseys and a baseball or softball cap because of area businesses who have sponsored the many teams.

Soon, a hook and ladder fire truck from the nearby Station 38th on Colvin Avenue will pull up and under their guidance, the many teams that will play this Summer will follow the engine up Hertel Avenue to Shoshone Park.

It's a glorious day for baseball and softball and the Hertel North Park League.

This will be the first time the League will be able to open their season in this manner in three years, since 2019 and thoughts are positive for sunny skies and warmer temperatures. The Parade route will run right through the business district east to Shoshone Park where a ceremony will quickly begin to throw out the first pitch, sing the National Anthem and then yell "PLAY BALL!"

With over 1,000 boys and girls registered to play this Summer, it should be a homerun of a season.

Ask Rusty – Will My Wife Get a Spouse Benefit When I Claim at 70?

Dear Rusty: Is it possible for you to go over how the Federal withholding tax is computed on Social Security benefits? **Signed: Curious Taxpayer.**

Dear Curious: I'm not sure if you're asking about how FICA (or self-employment) tax on your earnings from work is determined, or if you're asking about how much income tax to have withheld from your Social Security benefit, so I'll address both:

The 7.65% FICA tax withheld from your earnings by your employer consists of two elements – 6.2% is for Social Security and 1.45% is for Medicare Part A. Your employer pays an equivalent amount on your behalf. This is a standard amount that all American workers pay, which – after enough credits are earned – enables you to collect Social Security benefits when you retire and permits you to enroll in Medicare Part A for free when you're 65. If you are self-employed, you pay a “self-employment tax” on your net earnings instead of a FICA tax, and you must pay both the employee and employer portion of the tax (15.3%). The only exception to this is that certain U.S. states have opted out of participation in the Federal Social Security program,

thus exempting some state employees from paying the Social Security portion of the FICA tax (they must still pay the Medicare Part A portion). These percentages are set by Congressional legislation and will not change unless Congress enacts future legislation to do so.

Determining how much income tax to have withheld from your Social Security is something best discussed with a qualified Tax Advisor with access to all your income data. Your recommended tax withholding rate for income tax purposes depends upon your overall taxable income level and the tax rate which results from that income (considering your dependents and your tax filing status (single or married)). Having income tax withheld from your Social Security benefit is optional, but if you choose to do so you must submit IRS form W-4V to your local Social Security office. Form W-4V permits you to specify that either 7%, 10%, 12%, or 22% of your SS benefit be withheld for income tax purposes. Here's a link to IRS form W-4V: <https://www.irs.gov/pub/irs-pdf/fw4v.pdf>.

The IRS may levy income tax on a portion of your Social Security ben-

efits depending on your combined income from all sources. Your “combined income” consists of your Adjusted Gross Income (AGI) on your tax return, plus 50% of your Social Security benefits received during the tax year, plus any other non-taxable income you may have had. Tax on your SS benefits is computed at your normal IRS tax rate and based on your tax filing status.

If you file your income tax as “single” and your combined income from all sources exceeds \$25,000, then half (50%) of your SS benefits becomes part of your overall taxable income. And if your combined income from all sources as a single filer exceeds \$34,000 then up to 85% of your SS benefits become taxable income.

If your income tax filing status is “married-filing jointly” and your combined income is over \$32,000 then 50% of your Social Security benefits received during the tax year becomes part of your taxable

income. If, as a couple filing “married/jointly,” your combined income exceeds \$44,000, then up to 85% of the SS benefits you received during the tax year becomes part of your overall taxable income.

"I vividly recall the can-
opy that shaded Cunard
Avenue, it formed a triangle
with Parkside and so your
eyes were naturally drawn
down the rows of trees,"
recalled Sull. "I was trans-
fixed by that sight, so now,
at age 65, I want kids to be
moved in the same manner!"

The street planting will
take place in future years,
he hopes, after construction
concludes at North Park
Community School, the new
name of School 66. For
now, Sull set his sights
on Shoshone Park,
where he used to
spend time with his
buddies after the 3
o'clock bell rang.

A Linden tree will
be planted on April
30th, the day after Arbor
Day, which is when tradi-
tional spring planting sea-
son commences.

Sull contacted Paul
Maurer, founder and chair-
man of Re-Tree to work with
the City of Buffalo Depart-
ment of Parks and Streets to
kick-off his give-back.

He says "it's a way to
give back for an education
and life experience that he
says led him to a successful
career."

"This is what we're all
about," remarked Maurer,

"Abbe will fund the planting
and our volunteers will work
with him and people from
the neighborhood to help
return the canopy that was
once so prominent here."

When construction on
the school is done, Sull wants
to add ten trees a year to the
streets that flank the school.
Plans call for Cunard Ave-
nue and Parkside Avenue
to get planted. They form
an eye-catching apex where
they meet at the north end
of school grounds.

The City of Buffalo
is cooperating by issu-
ing the permits and
making certain that
the right trees will
be planted along the
streets.

"Our tree master
plan is being utilized
and Re-Tree is following our
instructions so that we have
best practices in place to en-
sure a successful planting,"
said City of Buffalo Forester
Ross Hassinger.

As for Sull, he believes
he's got a good couple de-
cades left in him to fulfill his
goal of a completed triangle
of trees like the streets of
his youth. "I'm all-in...we
will celebrate another an-
niversary years from now,
God-willing, and we'll be
looking up at a beautiful
canopy of green!"
