Jimmy Collins Tourney Champs!



The eight and under Champion North Buffalo Green Blaze team, in the Jimmy Collins Classic Tournament held this past weekend in Shoshone Park.

Memorial Day in North Buffalo has a special place in the mind of coach Jim Daley of the Hertel North Park Youth Baseball League. As the League's tournament director for boys, he teaches Shoshone players as young as eight years old the history of the game besides giving them a chance to play. He tells the boys of a famous baseball player named Jimmy Collins, who played for the Buffalo Bisons and went on to play for the Boston Red Sox. The Jimmy Collins Classic Memorial Day Tournament in Shoshone Park has been a winner in North Buffalo.

Leo Scott and Tim Bartels, two up and coming crushers in the house baseball division combined to lead the North Buffalo Green Blaze team defeat the North Tonawanda Reds, 8-4 in the Championship game this past weekend in Shoshone Park that high-

lighted a very successful 13 team tournament after an early morning rain on Saturday.

Scott was named the tournament Most Valuable Player (MVP) with a total of 11 hits and near flawless defense in five tournament games. It was the team's second victory in the eight year old division in three years since 2019 before the Covid-19 Pandemic.

Two other North Buffalo teams competed against other Western New York Leagues in a 12 and under Division and a 13 and under Division and played respectfully. Both teams were coached by League coaches and were made up of some of the finest players in the Hertel North Park House Divisions.

According to Coach Daley afterward, outstanding players on the 8u team included Xander Mann, Wes Polster, Sam Perry, Hunter

Gallagher, Gavin Ramsey and Walter Pitts. The team gave up just sixteen runs in five games and flashing leather all around the diamonds.

The North Buffalo Yellow team played a great tournament led by Leo Nason and his all around play. Ben Auerbach and Zeke Ganci had big hits at the plate and teammates Max Cappacio, Luke Kuwik and Teddy McGowan led a strong defense around the diamond.

A special thanks to the volunteer board members who got the diamonds ready to play after a rain and for their work in the concession stand.

House baseball games continue in Shoshone Park. Seven Divisions are underway totaling 58 teams, playing nightly and on Saturday. T-Ball teams are learning the game on Diamond 8 and will soon play a three inning game where the score doesn't matter. Two more Divisions will start soon for Senior High School boys and girls ages 13-16. The Travel Blaze and Wildcat teams are competing in their regular season and tournament games already.

Clara Siller had two hits, including the game winning RBI for Sylvie Fyda as the Rebels defeated the Devils, 1-0. Leaira Lewis had a big hit at the plate and helped the Athletics defeat the Giants, 7-2 in a Minor Girls game. Penelope Mucitelli hit a two run homerun for the Astros in a 10-5 victory over the Mets in a Major Girls game.

In the Majors, the Reds got by the Giants 7-6. The Braves played the Mets under the lights and came away with a victory. The Padres gave the Cubs their first loss in a 6-3 win last Thursday. More scores next week.

Ask Rusty – Can My In-laws Get Supplemental Security Income?

Dear Rusty: I am wondering what the income limit is for Supplemental Security Income (SSI) eligibility. My in-laws are in their 70's, both drawing Social Security, and each has a pension from jobs they retired from. I am wondering if they are eligible to collect SSI. They have income from all sources that is over \$2100 per month, they are on Medicaid, but they have no savings and few assets. I have been told by a random family member that they are eligible for SSI, but with their income I have my doubts. All of my online hunt and peck research has made this as clear as mud. Any insight you can offer would be greatly appreciated. Signed: Helpful Daughter-in-Law

Dear Helpful Daughter-in-Law: Supplemental Security Income (SSI) is a separate (non-Social

Security) federal supplemental assistance program for low income seniors over 65 and for disabled or blind people of any age, but there are income limitations to qualify for SSI benefits and restrictions on assets as well. Overall eligibility requirements for SSI are quite complex, especially for those with earnings from working (it's also notable that only legal US residents can get SSI). Although some types of income and assets are not counted, only those with very low countable income and very few countable assets can get SSI assistance. Countable income must be less than the federal SS benefit amounts for federal SSI benefits to be paid. If your in-law's current countable income is over \$2100 per month, that alone may disqualify them for SSI because their countable income is more than the federal SSI ben-

efit of \$841 per individual, or \$1261 per couple.

As mentioned, some types of income aren't countable, but pensions and Social Security benefits do count (after a small \$20 exclusion). So if most or all of your in-law's monthly income is from those two sources, they almost certainly won't be eligible for additional assistance through SSI. Something else to be aware of is that any SSI benefit they might

be eligible for would be offset by their Social Security payment, so if each of their individual Social Security payments are more than \$841/month, then there would be no additional benefit from the SSI program. Here is a link at which an explanation of what types of income count, and don't count, toward the SSI income limitation: www.ssa.gov/ssi/text-income-ussi.htm.

From the information

you've shared about their current Social Security and individual pension benefits, it does not appear that your in-laws will be able to gain any additional benefit from the Supplemental Security Income (SSI) program. The income restrictions for Medicaid eligibility are more generous and, since they're in their 70s, your in-laws are obviously both on Medicare as well to help with their healthcare expenses.

More Parents Turn To Homeschooling

Close to two-million American families can't be wrong.

My wife Ashley and I have three children under the age of four. Soon, we will make an important decision on their behalf that will profoundly impact their lives: where will they be educated?

We discussed this when news broke about the horrific school shooting in Uvalde that claimed the lives of 21 souls. Two adults. 19 children, all between the ages of seven and ten.

Prior to the massacre in Texas, we talked about options other than public schools.

As a parent, I'm disturbed at what some folks are trying to insert into the curriculum of children as young as four years old.

Some sensitive, deeply personal issues should only be discussed within a family.

It is not the role of teachers to engage in Critical Race Theory or a highly sexualized curriculum with kids who are not theirs. Public educators must focus on the basics: reading, writing, mathematics, so-

cial studies, and the sciences. What is also sorely lacking from public schools is teaching financial literacy and building trades.

Instead, some public schools obsess over social and cultural issues rather than ensuring students can succeed once they graduate.

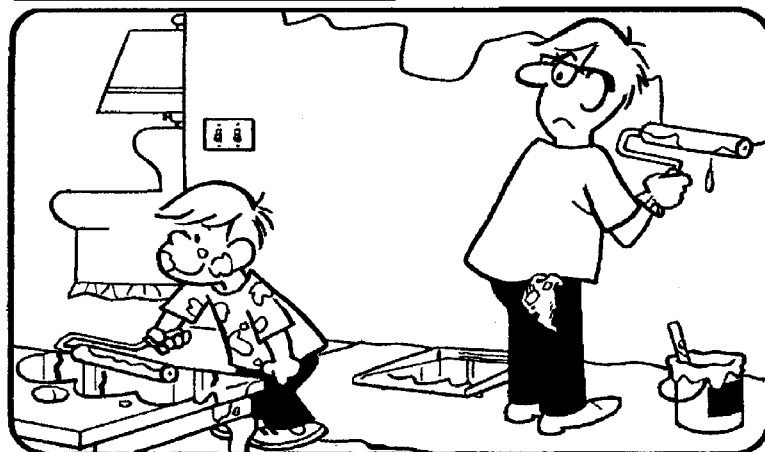
Because of violence in schools and public educators caring more about the birds and the bees rather than the ABC's, we explored home-schooling.

Co-ops utilize social media like Facebook to educate moms and dads on socialization options. Two interesting ones I found are the faith-based co-op "The School of Two Hearts." Another is "The Folksy House" which is outdoors/environmentally based.

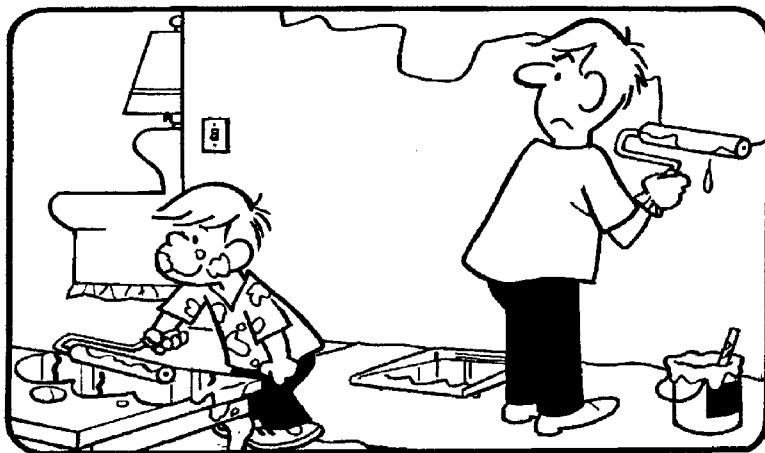
