Father's Day 2022



This Father's Day is coming up this Sunday, June 19th so be sure to make this Sunday a great day for Dad!

Father's Day is always celebrated on the third Sunday in June. In 2022, it's Sunday, June 19th.

Some people believe Father's Day and Mother's Day as well are Hallmark holidays, created to drum up sales but that isn't actually so. The story behind how this day became a holiday is actually a story of determination by one woman and a decades-long fight to get fathers the credit they are due.

The first Father's Day observance is often attributed to the 1907 Monongah,

West Virginia mining disaster that took 361 men—250 of them fathers— and left more than a thousand children without a dad. Grace Golden Clayton, whose father was lost in the tragedy, created a service of commemoration to the pastor of her local chapel. In May of 1909, a woman named Sonora Louise Smart Dodd of Spokane, Washington, heard a Mother's Day sermon by Reverend Dr. Henry Rasmussen in her hometown church and thought a similar day should be set aside to honor fathers.

On June 6th, 1910, Dodd came to the Spokane Ministerial Association and the local Young Men's Christian Association (YMCA) with her petition outlining the idea for an annual observance. Spokane's held its first Father's Day celebration on Sunday, June 19, 1910, with moving speeches by her own pastor and those from other area churches.

More than 50 years after Dodd's initial efforts, Father's Day became a recognized holiday by President Lyndon Johnson's Executive Order in 1966.

Christian Arzola blasted a two run homerun over the fence in deep centerfield of the Major Highmark Diamond in Shoshone Park this past Saturday to lead the Giants to a shutout victory over the Dodgers. A key player for the Giants over the past two summers, the 12 year old has been a force for the Orange and Black, helping lead the team deep into the playoffs last season.

Saturday's win, their third in a row and fifth on the season, helped move the Giants up in the standings in a division with eight other teams. The twelve year old teams like the Mets, Dodgers, Cardinals and Cubs play under the lights some nights and the 200 foot fence around the diamond sometimes doesn't stop a baseball.

"Every year one or two of our kids can put the ball over," said one coach recently. "They may be just 12 years old but if the ball comes into their wheelhouse, there's an excitement. Everett Herbeck did it on Opening Day for the Nationals this year. These boys are good!"

Other teams in the Division include the Braves, the Padres and the Reds. On any given day, a team can pull an upset win.

In other games, Ayo Silverman, Oscar Sidell and Jack Porterfield struck out 16 of 18 Mets for a 5-3 Cubs victory and the Cardinals topped the Nationals, 11-5.

In Triple AAA, Greyson Gordon homered in the bottom of the fifth inning to help lead the Angels to a big win over the Athletics. Christopher Then hit a three run homerun to lead the Twins over the Tigers and the White Sox continued their winning ways with a 9-5 win over the Orioles.

In Double AA, the Cardinals have won three in a row led by Xander Mann and Maverick Kelly on the mound and a big hit from outfielder Will Filadora. The Marlins Mateo Todtenhagen shut down the Braves as teammates Kevin Wooten and Noah Lundquist had big hits.

James Devlin hit three doubles and teammate Louie Witt had his first big hit of the season to lead the Angels to a 4-2 victory over the Rangers in Rookie Boys. The Athletics and the Yankees tied at 7-7 and Paul Harrod Jr. of the Orioles made the final out of the game with a great catch of a fly ball in the outfield for a 13-5 victory over the Royals.

Ask Rusty - How Does Social Security **Disability Private Insurance Work?**

Dear Rusty: If someone is collecting longterm disability through their company and the company states the employee also must apply through Social Security, how does this work? Does the amount of Social Security decrease from the amount that the person would normally receive upon retirement? Is longterm disability for life, or just until you are of re-tirement age? How about for the spouse of that individual? Would it have any impact on them? Signed: Concerned

Dear Concerned: It's common for private long term disability (LTD) insurers to require that you apply for Social Security Disability Insurance (SSDI) benefits. Typically, the private LTD benefit will be offset (reduced) by the federal SSDI benefit.

SSDIThe benefit amount, if awarded, will be the full Social Security benefit earned up to the point the recipient becomes disabled and unable to work. That means someone on SSDI before full retirement age (FRA) gets their FRA amount earlier (FRA is somewhere between 66 and 67 depending on the year of birth). The SSDI benefit will be based on the disabled person's lifetime earnings history, unreduced for claiming earlier than full retirement age. SSDI will automatically convert to regular SS retirement benefits at the same amount when FRA is attained. Thus, getting SSDI doesn't detract from the person's FRA benefit amount; rather they get their FRA amount earlier.

Social Security disability benefits last for as long as you remain disabled, or up to your SS full retirement age. To be eligible, the disability must be expected to last for at least one year, and the disability must render you unable to perform significant work. You must also have worked recently (usually at least 5 of the last 10 years) to maintain eligibility, and you must have contributed Social Security FICA payroll taxes (or self-employment taxes) from your work earnings. Only very limited work earnings are allowed when collecting Social Security Disability Insurance benefits. and

Social Security may periodically require confirmation of continued SSDI

eligibility.

Applying for SSDI is a relatively easy process which can be done online at www.ssa.gov/applyfordisability, or by calling SS directly at 1.800.772.1213. Depending on the nature of the disability, it usually takes 3 to 5 months to obtain a determination and, if SSDI is approved, there is a 5 month wait for benefits to start. If the SSDI application is initially denied (about 65% of all initial applications are) you can exercise several levels of appeal, starting with simply requesting a reconsideration by Social Security, followed, if necessary, by a hearing with an independent Administrative Law Judge, a review by the SSDI Appeals Council, or even an appeal to Federal Court. Hopefully, if the applicant is now on private long term disability, the SSDI application will be initially approved.

As for whether the spouse of a person on SSDI is affected, much depends on the spouse's age and how the spouse's own SS retirement benefit compares to the disabled partner's SSDI benefit. Benefits for a spouse are available as early as age 62, but the spouse's personal FRA benefit amount (from their own lifetime earnings record) must be less than 50% of the disabled partner's SSDI amount to get a spousal boost from the disabled spouse. Otherwise, one marriage partner being on SSDI will not affect the other partner's personal Social Security retirement benefit.

Father's Day 2022

There is one thing we all have in common; we have or had a father. Like it or not that is the way it is in this world. It is always a male and the design is that he usually is bigger and the breadwinner in the family. Most cases he is the one that provides the roof over your head and the food on your table. In my family, my dad was the only one who worked and brought home a paycheck. My mom was a stay-at-home spouse taking care of the eight children they had. My dad was un-educated as most were in his generation, but he managed to always have a job and we always had a roof, food, and clothing. Enough to get by.

My earliest recollection, being born at the tail end of the great depression, is the struggle we had to endure to exist. We were fortunate that my dad was able to keep his job at Birges Wallpaper on Niagara Street. Enough of an income to provide the necessities we needed. He met my mother there. When World War II started jobs became plentiful and if memory serves me correctly, he went to work at DuPont in Kenmore. That paid a little more and it was a more stable employment.

With the war, his two eldest sons enlisted in the Air Force and the Navy. The oldest being sent overseas at the height of the combat. Like most fathers at that time the worry was overwhelming as many of our neighbors and friends lost loved ones. Both my brothers returned unharmed when the war ended. It was a joyful day in our family. One thing my dad was famous for was worrying. He worried about everything even down to where he was going to park his car when he got home. We had no garage, so it was hit and miss to find a spot on the street. He worried about the war and how it would end, he worried about his kids, he worried about how he would get to work. What is the phrase? Worry wart?

During the war he made his contribution by buying war bonds. Americans were asked to buy these bonds to finance the enormous cost of the war effort. They did and so did he. At the end of the war, he had amassed enough to do what he always wanted to do. Own his own business. He invested his small accumulation of war bonds into a neighborhood grocery store on the West Side. My mother's family had a store that was successful so he thought the experience would come in handy. It did not work out and he lost everything. Sad day for us all.

My dad was Irish, and my mother was Italian. Being Italian my mom was a great cook. We ate a lot of spaghetti, but my dad was a meat and potatoes guy. When we had sauce for dinner my mom had to cook a separate meal for my dad. Meat and pota-

toes, no sauce for him. It was a treat for us to have a meat and potato meal with my dad. "Hey dad, pass the potatoes". My mom never complained about having to do that. It is what you call love and the joy in serving the one or ones you love.

Dad was a non-combative person. Seldom if ever did I see him mad or angry or want to hit anyone. Except me once in a while but I usually deserved it. He would take off his belt and make like he was going to use it, but he never did. All he wanted was his beer, a cigarette, and a parking spot near the house and he was happy. Even though I gave him grief we got along great. He passed away at 67, young in today's world. 55 years ago, so I have lived my adult life without my father.

I mentioned how he wanted so badly to own a business. Of the eight children I was the only one with the same desire. He was so happy to see me start in my basement and begin to flourish into some form of self-ownership. He bragged to his co-workers how his son was going to own a print shop. He passed when I was about to move from

my basement into my first location on Tacoma. He would be so happy to see the success we have had over the years. Maybe if there is a heaven, he is aware of what we have accomplished. Perhaps he is now taking care of my wife who recently joined him. In any case I wish him a happy Father's Day as I do every year. If you still have a father, make sure you make his day special. They do not last forever.

Know And Follow The "Rules Of The Water"

Summer is here and nothing signals summer in Erie County like boating. Whether you are visiting the Erie Basin Marina, fishing in the Niagara River, cruising down the Erie Canal or motoring to Sturgeon Point, Western New York offers an abundance of waterways providing outstanding recreational opportunities for boating enthusiasts.

Observing boating safety precautions is essential for all boaters, whether you are fishing, sailing, kayaking, or motoring. Just as there are "rules of the road" that govern the safe flow of traffic for vehicles, there are "rules of the waterways" that govern the safe maneuvering of all watercraft.

With the legislation of Brianna's Law, everyone operating a motorized vessel will be required to take a safe boating course and carry a safety certificate by January 1, 2025. This year, all operators who were born on or after January 1, 1988 must obtain certification, including those operating personal watercrafts, such as

a jet ski or wave runner. According to research conducted by the National Association of State Boating Law Administrators (NASBLA), 70 percent of all boating fatalities occurred when the operator had not taken a boating safety class. A list of an approved Boater Safety Course near you can be found at nysparks.com/recreation/boating.

State law also requires that any motorized boat, operated on NYS waters must be registered with the Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV). Having your current registration on board is required. I encourage water enthusiasts to take this opportunity to keep a portion of registration fees local by registering your boat and its trailer at any one of our Auto Bureau offices located throughout Erie County. Proof of identity, date of birth and proof of ownership are required to register a boat. 


