## Protect Your Pets From The Oncoming Heat

As temperatures rise to record highs in Buffalo and the surrounding areas, we still love spending the sunny days of summer outside with our furry friends, but enjoying the hotter weather can be downright dangerous. Pet owners should pay extra special attention to their pets take extra precautions in these coming weeks so that your fun day in the sun doesn’t turn into a medical emergency.

Here are some tips for keeping your furry loved ones safe in the extreme heat:

NEVER leave your pet in a car. On a mild to hot day, temperatures in a closed car (even with the windows cracked) can exceed

120 degrees in minutes, creating a very dangerous condition for any animal. Cracking a window or parking in the shade does not help.

Give your pet extra water. Staying hydrated is crucial on hot days to avoid illness. Whether your pet is indoors or outdoors, be sure to fill their water bowls several times a day.

Protect your pet’s paws from hot surfaces. Walk your pet in the grass or the shade whenever possible. A quick tip: if the pavement is too hot for your bare hands or feet, it’s too hot for your pet’s paws. If you need to take them outside to do their business, try

## Wildcat Weekend!



### North Buffalo Wildcats.

Chloe Claeys blasted a grand slam homerun and teammate Molly Savage pitched a complete game shutout on the mound to lead the North Buffalo Wildcats to a 9-0 victory over the Orchard Park Stars in its own annual tournament in Shoshone Park in the 12 and under Division Sunday.

The annual Wildcat Tournament, held practically every year since 2004, brings the best of WNY Girls Softball players into North Buffalo to compete against as many as 25 teams in four distinct age brackets. The Championship win was North Buffalo's second in two years, after winning the same age division last year over the Cayuga Gamblers.

"This was another great win for us," said Scott Gallivan, North Buffalo's Girls Travel Director and manager of the

12u team. "It's great to be able to host this tournament again and even more special to win it two years in a row. The Girls all played outstanding all three days and just took care of business out on the diamond."

Playing against teams from as far away as Central New York (Syracuse area) as well as East Aurora, Lakeview and West Seneca, the Wildcats took top cede in the 12U Division with three straight wins, including a 12-1 victory against Orchard Park in round one. Ten Girls made up the North Buffalo Roster led by Peyton Gallivan and Izzy Kilonsky. Both girls also blasted a homerun in the 9-0 Final to lead the way. Other girls on the team included Skyler Ball, sisters Alexandra and Lidia Foglia, Mackenzie Gunnarson, Shea Hall and Clara Rickus besides the

aforementioned Claeys and Savage.

Four other North Buffalo Wildcats' teams competed in the three day tournament in a 10U, 12U, 14U and 16U coached by Chris Ware, Robert Mucitelli, Eric Schmarder and Kelly Kilonsky. All four teams held their own against teams from Amherst, Elma, Marilla, Wales, Fredonia, North Tonawanda and the Sandlot Saints.

"This Tournament has grown every year," said Gallivan. "I just assisted in the early years when it was still small but then it grew fast and I was able to take over from some good coaches. I look forward to this every year."

In House Playoff action, the #6 cede Braves surprised #3 cede Cardinals 7-4 and the Brewers defeated the Marlins 4-3 in the first round of the Double AA Division early last week. They'll move on to face the Pirates and Dodgers respectively while the Cards and Marlins fall into the losers bracket. A second loss by either team eliminates them from the postseason.

In Rookie Girls, Mary Clare Sullivan hit a huge triple and teammate Leah Szymanski knocked in two runs as the Shamrocks defeated the Diamonds 6-3 and in another game, the Devil's upset the Stars, 12-7.

Cristian Arzola of the Giants blasted another homerun over the fence this year, this time in the playoffs as SanFrancisco defeated Washington, 10-7. The Cardinals topped the Braves, 7-1 and the Reds got a 9-7 win over the Padres in the Major Boys Division.

The Athletics defeated the Red Sox, 7-3 and the Orioles won over the Royals, 6-1 in Rookie Boys. The Indians defeated the Rays and the Blue Jays got by the Mariners, 6-5.

Continued from page one. wetting the surface with a hose or water bottle to help make it a little cooler for them.

Don't overdo outdoor exercise. Oftentimes, dogs don't know when they need a break, so it's important to stop frequently for shaded breaks and offer plenty of water. Take extra care with older dogs and dogs with shorter noses. Just like older humans, older dogs can be especially susceptible to higher temperatures. And certain breeds with shorter noses (like pugs and bulldogs) are at a greater risk of heatstroke.

Apply pet-safe sunscreen to your dog. Sunburn can affect pets the same way it affects humans – pain, peeling,

and skin cancer. Use a pet-safe sunscreen on unprotected areas, like the tips of the ears, the skin around the lips, and the tip of the nose. A good rule of thumb for sunscreen: If it's safe for babies, it's safe for your pets. Don't leave windows open while you're pets are unattended. Don't rely on window screens to keep your pet from falling. When in doubt, stay indoors. Avoid being outside for long periods of time during the hottest time of the day, 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. Take walks earlier in the morning to avoid as much of the heat as you can. Animals can get sick quickly on hot days, even if they are in the shade.

## Ask Rusty – I'm 78 and Still Working; Should I Apply for Social Security?

**Dear Rusty:** I am 78, still working, have a good healthcare plan and I make a nice salary. Can I still get my Social Security check since I paid into it all these years? **Signed: Still Working in My 70s**

**Dear Still Working:** You not only can get your Social Security check now, I recommend you apply for it as soon as possible. Regardless

of your current earnings, you'll not suffer any penalty because you are still working. That's because you stopped being subject to Social Security's "earnings test" when you reached your full retirement age (FRA) of 66 some years ago. Indeed, your Social Security benefit continued to grow until you reached 70 years of age, at which point it reached your

maximum benefit, which is 32% more than your benefit would have been at age 66.

Since your benefit reached maximum some years ago at age 70, and since working now won't hurt your payment amount, you should claim your benefits immediately. You should also ask for six months of retroactive benefits. Although your benefit stopped growing at age 70 and you're now 78, Social Security will only pay up to six months of retroactive benefits, thus you have lost some of your benefits by waiting until age 78 to claim.

You can apply for your benefits either by calling SS at your local office or the national Social Security service center at 1.800.772.1213 to make an appointment to apply, or you can apply online at [www.ssa.gov/retire](http://www.ssa.gov/retire). Applying online is by far the most efficient method, but you'll need to first create your personal "my Social Security" online account to do so (simply go to [www.ssa.gov/myaccount](http://www.ssa.gov/myaccount) and follow the instructions).

Since you're still working, and assuming you have "creditable" healthcare coverage from your employer, you can delay enrolling in Medicare until you stop working ("creditable" coverage is a group plan with at least 20 participants). If you haven't yet enrolled in Medicare and you've had creditable healthcare coverage since you were 65, you will not incur a late enrollment penalty for enrolling in Medicare now, but you can also continue to defer enrolling in Medicare without penalty if your employer coverage is "creditable."

I strongly encourage you to apply for your Social Security benefits as soon as possible, because you will continue to lose money by delaying further. You will still get credit for your current earnings even after you start your Social Security benefits and, if appropriate because of your recent earnings, your benefit amount will be automatically increased, so there is no reason to delay claiming Social Security any longer. You earned your Social Security benefits, you aren't subject to a penalty because you're still working, and you'll continue to get credit for your current earnings while still working, so you should apply for your Social Security benefits as soon as possible.

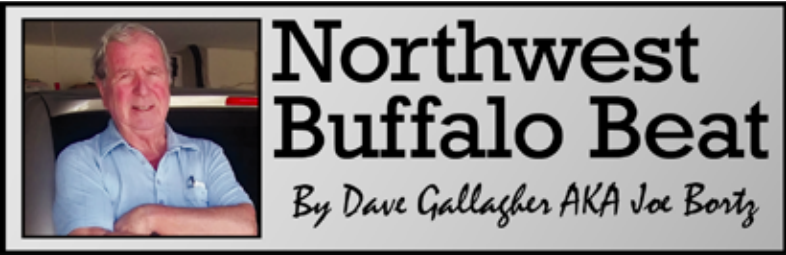

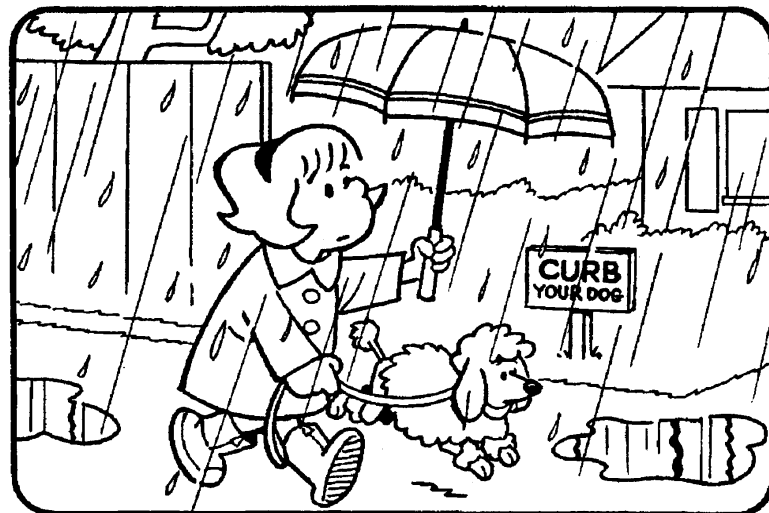

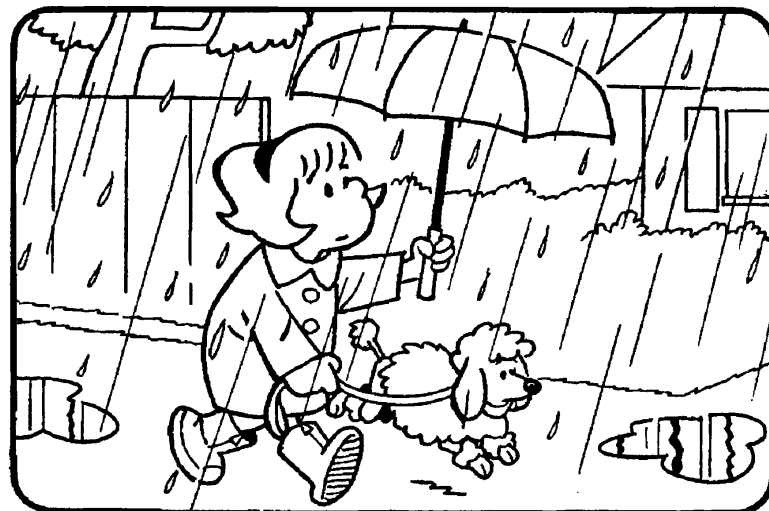
