# Cruise Ships Coming to Buffalo



Plans for cruise ships to are still in the works tourism could benefit from the proposals submitted for Visit Buffalo Niagara.

Lake Erie cruise ships are planned to arrive and dock in Buffalo, but big announcements regarding Canalside and the Outer Harbor have shown new light on the subject.

Millions of dollars for the development of the North Aud block at Canalside and as millions to restore hundreds of acres of the Outer Harbor have been in the works.

A tremendous undertaking that is transforming the tourist market. However, the most talked about idea going forward that was announced is the idea of bringing passenger ships in particular, to the Queen City.

It has been announced

that the cruise ships would be like the European river cruise ships, which do not have the capacity for thousands of people and in addition, a welcoming center would be necessary.

Patrick\_Kaler, President of Visit Buffalo Niagara, has spoken about the successes of cruises along the great lakes.

"It's a multimillion dollar industry and has been

recently became a member of "Cruise The Great Lakes" not too long ago.

A press release issued by "Cruise The Great Lakes" in June of this year implies that the Great Lakes cruising market collectively raised \$120 million worth of economic impact for the cities that participated.

It was announced that the state would close the funding gap that was required for Buffalo Niagara Waterkeeper to insure a study focused on extending the Buffalo Riverwalk in the near future.

The study was started in early April 2022 and is prothis September. The hope is that the study provides pedestrians and cyclists ways to travel through the region and creates ideal ways to improve traffic flow in and out of the Outer Harbor.

# Thank You, Don Morris

"I feel really good right now," said Don Morris last week in the meeting room of the Hertel North Park Youth Baseball League.

"I'm confident that this new board will continue to keep this league strong here in North Buffalo. I'm very proud of the work they've done this past year."

Est. 1957 Est. 1957 Softball Leading Those were the words of the League's outgoing president, Don Morris last Monday night as he presided over his last meeting as president after 32 years as the 'top volunteer' of North Buffalo Baseball in Shoshone Park. He leaves a legacy of so many accomplishments as the leader in Community Sports in Baseball and Šoftball for over thousands of area children, boys and girls who have come to the tiny Park on Hertel Avenue near Main Street since he held his first meeting back in 1992. His tenure as president of the 65 year old League has brought about so much positive change for everyone involved in making sure every child could play baseball or softball regardless of their talents, their finances or even Mother Nature.

But Morris doesn't want

all the credit for the current state of the baseball and softball operations that have made Hertel North Park (HNP) the place to

play the game within the City of Buffalo. Instead, he knows of all the countless men and women who have served as coaches over the years for the close to 100 youth teams

that play out of Shoshone Park every night during the week and on Saturdays and Sundays from early May until August. This includes everyone from t-ball all the way up to boys and girls playing in a 23 and under Division.

"Keep in mind," he reminds us, "I didn't do this stuff alone. We always had good people with us."

This year especially has brought about so much change for the better in the two years since HNP decided to cancel the 2020 season because of the Covid-19 Pandemic. Nothing could stop a disease that threatened our lives then. But HNP stayed strong during those months and before last year, found their numbers increase by well over 1,000 boys and girls registered to play for 2021. This season, with numbers over eleven hundred signed up to play (their most ever) Morris and his board of officers, worked to improve the lights used in the Park around diamonds one and two for night games at 8:00pm after School was dismissed for the Summer.

Also this season, Morris stood at home plate on Opening Day, May 7th and unveiled two new scoreboards for those same diamonds so everyone could know the score. All this while working to improve the conditions of the League's clubhouse including the kitchen and restroom facilities.

"Any opposing League that comes here to Shoshone Park to play us in Babe Ruth or Cal Ripken Tournaments every year not only finds our teams professional and courteous but also the building and facilities clean and maintained for their games."

Jim Daley, a long-time board member and the boys travel team director for several years now spoke for the board.

"Don Morris is Hertel North Park Youth Baseball and Softball. His 30 years as president has seen unprecedented growth in the number of participants and overall strength of the league. What Don has provided for thousands of girls and boys is priceless. The League is the strongest youth sports organization in WNY with the most diverse demographics. Thank you Don for all you did and all you will do in the future."

Morris feels that he is leaving the office of president in better hands than when he took over the board in 1992. "I just thought I'd serve two or three years," he said recently. "I enjoyed working with some very good friends like Tony Messina, Matt Baudo, Tom Amodeo and Richard "Tiny" Birkemeier and many others on the board over the years."

John Hornung, the League's vice-president under Morris for over five years, takes over as president of the board and will lead a slate of officers to prepare for next Summer. Scott Gallivan, the girls travel team director has been elected to serve as vice-president and will lead four other board members. retained. They are Paul Fuzak, Anthony Messina, Kevin Pritchard and Eric Schmarder.

After the meeting, the new president presented Morris with a beautiful framed photograph of Shoshone Park taken from above Diamond #5, Morris' favorite corner, that he may display in his home. "John will do a good job for us," he said. "He has done so much already."



# Ask Rusty – Can My Wife Claim a Spouse Benefit First?

Dear Rusty: I have been getting Social Security since age 66. My wife turned 62 in June. We are thinking of taking her spouse benefits on my record since it would be higher than hers (we checked online). We began filling out the application but do not see a way to let them know we want her to receive spouse benefits and not her own. How do we do that? Signed: Trying to Apply

**Dear Trying:** You don't see that option because your wife doesn't have the option to collect only a spousal benefit from you without also claiming her own benefit. That option was eliminated by the Bipartisan Budget Act of 2015 for anyone born after January 1, 1954. So, if your wife claims any SS benefit now, she will be automatically deemed to be filing for both her own benefit (from her own work record) as well as her spousal benefit from you. She can't delay taking her own benefit when she claims. Your wife's benefit will consist of her own benefit plus, if she is entitled to one, a "spousal boost" to bring her payment up to her spousal entitlement and, claimed at age 62, both her own benefit and her spousal boost will be reduced. But there are some other factors to consider:

• If your wife is still working, she will be subject to Social Security's "earnings test" until she reaches her full retirement age (FRA) of 67. The earnings test limits how much your wife can earn from working and, if the limit (\$19,560 for 2022) is exceeded, SS will take away benefits equal to \$1 for every \$2 she is over the limit. If her current work earnings are high enough, it could even disqualify her from receiving early SS benefits. The earnings limit lasts until your wife reaches her full

retirement age.

• Your wife cannot collect her full benefits – 100% of her own benefit or 50% of your FRA benefit amount – unless she waits until her full retirement age (67) to claim. But whether she should even claim a spouse benefit at FRA should consider whether her own SS benefit, at maximum, will be more than her spouse

benefit will be. Your wife's maximum spouse benefit (at age 67) will be 50% of your FRA benefit amount, but if she delays claiming past her FRA her own SS retirement benefit will continue to grow (at 8% per year) until she is 70. If your wife's personal age 70 benefit will be more than her spousal benefit from you, she may wish to consider forgoing her spouse benefit and waiting until age 70 to claim her own higher personal benefit. It's a question of which will benefit her most for the rest of her life, which is where her life-expectancy enters the picture. Generally, if your wife is in good health and expects at least average longevity (about 87 for a woman her current age), waiting until the highest available benefit (either her own or her spouse benefit) reaches maximum is usually a prudent choice.

 Your wife's survivor benefit as your widow may be a consideration as well. If her benefit as your survivor will be larger than any other benefit she is entitled to, then claiming her other benefits earlier may be smart. For example, if her benefit as your widow (100% of the benefit you were receiving at your death if claimed at or after her FRA) will be higher than either her maximum spousal benefit or her maximum personal benefit, then her best option may be to claim her retirement and spousal benefits earlier. How much earlier would depend on whether she is working and will exceed the earnings limit before

As you can see there are a number of factors for your wife to consider before claiming her Social Security, but she cannot claim only her spouse benefit at age 62 and permit her own benefit to continue growing.



# Looking For A Sign.

We all at one time or another endure the grief of losing a close loved one. Mother, father, brother, sister, or even a child. To me the hardest is a spouse, husband, or wife. These are live in partners who you spend every day with, sleep with, wake up and end the day with. Dine together, converse, play and just overall are like one person. Met dozens of people who have experienced what I am living through now. Widows and widowers. Seems most times the man goes first. Like Red Buttons said jokingly, "Because they want to." True as if they are like me the adjustment is overwhelming. Never cooked or did any domestic work or any kind. Laundry, shopping, even making the bed. Had to learn and have. Still the loneliness and quiet is hard to understand. Why is it like this? So, I look for a sign that somehow my wife is still with me.

It started out with sounds in the house. One night I got up out of bed as I thought I heard someone walking around. Found nothing. The strange sounds continued in various places. Banging on the inside of the walls. Next to the front door, in the kitchen, and finally one day in the room I watch TV. I sat there and listened as the sound traveled in the walls around the room. Started in the far corner and moved inside the wall slowly to the left till it ended right behind me. This was not above; it was in the walls. One wall is the solid brick fireplace, and the sound went through that. Eliminating that it could be some kind of animal. It continued around the room and ended right behind the chair I was sitting in with a loud noise. Enough to startle me and make me get up. Have not heard another sound since that time.

There have been other signs like my four-yearold grandson being asked why he took to my eldest daughter, who is from out of town, by the hand and clung to her. His answer was, "Grandma told me to!"

These are subject to questioning and I also want to believe but I have a problem with it. I even tried to record the sounds but there is nothing on the recording. Let me give you what I was hoping was one more sign.

My son's Veterans post holds a pancake breakfast once a month. My son, my wife, and I attended regularly. At the breakfast they have these pull-out tab tickets and my wife liking to gamble, liked playing them. Fifty cents each so I would buy \$10 worth and she would enjoy slowly opening them up. Like six tabs on each ticket times twenty would be pulling 120 tabs. You will \$1, \$2, etc. There is one prize in there for \$100. Only one of however many tickets in the jar. Naturally, the chances of winning are extremely rare. Well, my wife opens the one and does not realize it is the \$100 ticket. I usually checked them out just in case she missed something. I looked and sure enough it was the big

winner. I told her she won the \$100. "Get out, I don't believe you," I convinced her by going up and getting the money. To her it is more than the money it is the thrill of winning.

Well since her passing it has been tough going to the pancake breakfast with just my son. This week my granddaughter joined us and made it a little easier. I bought the tickets again as a donation to the Vet post. My son also bought tickets and he went through his right away as he wanted to show his daughter what a winner was. The three in a row thing. Nothing there and he declared himself a loser. I finished my breakfast and started to open my tickets. I would alternate between my granddaughter and me. As I was opening

the tabs, I related the story of my wife winning and trying to convince her it was real. I open the last tab and it shocked me as it was the \$100 ticket. I did not believe it. Showed it to my son and he said yep it is the winner. I got emotional as I so wanted it to be a sign or connec-

I donated part of the winnings back to the Post as I am sure there are other people who need the \$100 more than I do. Also, according to the dozens of letters I have received since her passing addressed to her from charities, she must have been a big donor. I will find one and donate the rest of the winnings in her name. My hope is that it was just another sign, and, in a way, she is still with me. It is the only solace I have.

### Rules Of The Road When It Comes To School Bus Safety



Motorists must stop when a school bus flashes its red lights – It's the law.

summer down, children across Erie County are heading back to school and the "Yellow School Buses" once again dot our roadways. For the over 120,000 elementary and secondary students in Erie County, the school day begins and ends with a trip on a school bus. Many children will be going to school for the first time and may not be careful when crossing the street or running to catch the bus. Older children know the routine, but may forget in their excitement to catch up with friends. Unfortunately, each year some bus trips to school end in tragedy -- children are injured or killed in school bus incidents when motorists fail to follow the rules of the road. There are an estimated 50,000 or more incidences of motor vehicles illegally passing school buses every day in New York Although driv-State. ers are required to stop for a school bus when

it is stopped to load or unload passengers, children should not rely on them to do so, a fact that parents should discuss with their children prior to the start of the school year.

The rules of the road in New York State are specific when it comes to school buses. Drivers need to know and obey the "flashing signal light system" that school bus drivers use to alert motorists of pending actions. Yellow flashing lights indicate that the bus is preparing to stop to load or unload children. That is the time to slow down and prepare to stop your vehicle. Red flashing lights and extended stop arms indicate that the bus has stopped, and that children are getting on or off the bus. Motorists must stop their cars at least 20 feet away from the bus and wait until the red lights stop flashing, the extended stop sign is withdrawn, and the bus begins moving before they can start

driving again. This law applies on all roadways in New York State, even when approaching from the opposite direction of a divided highway.

All drivers should know that the fine for passing a stopped school bus ranges from a minimum of \$250 and up to \$4000 and/or up to 30 days in jail for the first violation. Additionally, a conviction places 5 points on your driver's license and may result in increased insurance premiums. If convicted of three violations in three years, your license will be revoked for a minimum of six months. It goes without saying that even one instance of passing a stopped school bus is unacceptable; it could mean the life of a child.

Parents need to also take time to instruct their school-aged children on school bus safety. Children need to know to stand at least three giant steps (6 feet) away from the curb when waiting for the bus to arrive. Children must also wait until the bus comes to a complete stop, the doors open, and the driver says it is okay before stepping onto the bus. According to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration, the greatest risk is not while riding on the school bus, but getting on or getting off. Children need to be reminded to be cautious in and around the "danger zone" of the school bus, which is the 10 feet in front, behind and on each side of the school bus.

When the new school year begins in the coming weeks, I remind motorists not to drive distracted, slow down around school zones and be alert for children approaching or exiting school buses. For additional information on school bus safety rules please visit erie. gov/clerk/KeepKidsSafe.

n one of his Facebook videos, Jaskula even recognized how tough economic times are for Veterans and their families while pumping gaseline

ing gasoline.

"We know times are hard. Gas is expensive. But it is for a good cause," said Jaskula in one of his Facebook videos encouraging people to register for the K.I.A. Memorial Road March.

While defending freedom around the world as a Sergeant Major in the United States Army, Jaskula's close friend and Buffalo Firefighter and Staff Sergeant Chris Dill was Killed in Action on April 4th, 2005. Dill's death was the impetus for Jaskula to

start the very first K.I.A. Memorial March ten years ago, on November 23rd, 2012.

Jaskula walked more than 13-miles, more than a one-half-marathon, carrying 60 pounds of rocks in a rucksack. It took him more than three hours to finish and he raised \$4,000 for Veterans' causes.




