Park in downtown Buffalo, located at 1 Lafayette Square.





# Ask Rusty - About Applying for Social Security Benefits

Dear Rusty: I will be turning 65 this December and will most likely continue working until July of 2024 at my current job. It is possible I could leave a year earlier. With that being said, when should I submit paperwork to start collecting Social Security benefits? Is there anything I should know previous to applying that will make sure the process is relatively seamless? Signed: Ready to Retire

Dear Ready to Retire: Social Security recommends you apply for benefits 2 to 3 months before you wish your benefit payments to begin, but you can apply up to 4 months prior. When you apply, you will specify your desired benefit-start-month on the application, and that is when your benefits will start. Be aware that Social Security pays benefits "in arrears," meaning your benefit is paid in the month following the month earned. So, for example, if you apply for your benefits to start in January your January benefit will be paid in Feb-

The exact date of your payment depends on the day of the month you were born – born between the

1st and 10th of the month, you get your payment on the 2nd Wednesday; born between the 11th and 20th of the month, payment is made on the 3rd Wednesday; born after the 20th of the month your payment will be received in your bank account on the 4th Wednesday of every month.

You can apply in person, either over the phone or by visiting your local Social Security office, or you can apply for your benefits online at www.ssa.gov/retire. Applying online is, by far, the most efficient method. To apply online, you will first need to set up your personal "my Social Security" online account which is easy to do at www.ssa.gov/ myaccount. I suggest you create your online account now, even if you don't plan to claim your SS for a while yet. Once you have your online account set up, you can see your estimated benefit amounts at different ages, which can help you decide when to claim.

Since you are still working, you should be aware that if you claim at any time prior to reaching your full retirement age (FRA) you will be subject to Social Security's earnings test. If you will be 65 in December

2022 your FRA is 67, and that is the point at which you will get 100% of the SS benefit you've earned from a lifetime of working. If you claim any earlier, your benefit will be permanently reduced, and the Social Security "earnings test" will apply. The earnings limit for 2023 will be a bit more than the 2022 limit of \$19,560. If you are collecting SS and exceed the earnings limit, they will take away benefits equal to \$1 for every \$2 you are over the limit. In the year you reach your FRA (2024) your earnings limit will be about 2 ½ times more than the normal annual limit and the penalty is less, and once you have reached your FRA there is no longer a limit to how much you can earn. For clarity, you can also wait and claim after your FRA and gain a higher benefit (your benefit will

So, how can you make the process "relatively seamless?" Create your online "my Social Securitv" account in advance and verify that your lifetime earnings as recorded by Social Security are accurate. Then, when you're ready to claim, simply go to www. ssa.gov/retire and follow the instructions. The online application process is quite intuitive, and you should have no trouble even if you have limited computer skills. Social Security will contact you if they need more information after you apply online. Of course, you can also apply whenever you're ready by calling Social Security to make an appointment to apply over the phone but applying online is much more efficient.



# **Buffalo Bills 2022**

Sixty-two years the Buffalo Bills AFL team played its first game in Buffalo New York. There was a Buffalo Bills team before, but it no longer existed. It was in the All-American Conference or AAC. Only team that survived that league and went into the NFL was the Cleveland Browns. The Browns dominated the NFL for years. The AAC folded and so did the first Buffalo Bills team. George Ratterman, quarterback and Chet Mutryn, halfback were Buffalo Bills heroes back then. With the demise of that league, Buffalo was without professional football for years. When a Detroit millionaire, Ralph Wilson, bought a franchise in a newly formed league, the American Football League, the citizens of the queen city on the lakes were ecstatic. We had a team, struggling to exist but it was ours.

I attended the first

game in 1960. We played the Oakland Raiders at War Memorial Stadium with eight thousand people in attendance. Not bad for a beginning. The stadium held over 50,000 and I say that as I played a high school football game there in front of an estimated 52,000. That shows you how much Buffalo loved its football. The stadium had wooden bleachers and no seats. It was oval and made for football. Not a bad seat, or bench in the place. Personally, I did not miss a Bills game in the early sixties as end zone seats were three dollars. We only sat there for a little while and moved closer to the 50-yard line as there were plenty of empty seats. The press box was so small only the print media was allowed. I remember Rick Azar, sportscaster on channel seven, sitting in the stands near me. He was very vocal. It was just as exciting then as it is now. The crowd went just

as crazy with every score and the players became our heroes. I eventually bought season tickets and did not miss going to a home game for fifty years.

I go back to those early days. It was so different. It was a struggling franchise, so they did things to promote the sport locally. I joined the Buffalo Bills Booster Club. Guess you would call it the front runner of the Buffalo Bills Mafia. The Booster Club used to have a monthly meeting; I do not recall where, but I do remember attending. There was always at least one Buffalo Bills player at the meetings. The big guy, Ralph Wilson Jr., would also show up and mingle with the crowd. Had a beer with him at one of the meetings and if I remember right, he was moaning about the rising cost of players. Now this is before the merger and the NFL would always get the cream of the crop. We had talented players but still it was considered a minor league. Even then at this time this franchise had grown and was worth more than the \$35,000 he had to put up to form the league. I did not feel sorry for him.

Just to compare then to now. I do know I went to LaSalle Park down on the waterfront to watch the

old Buffalo Bills practice. LaSalle Park is just past the water works down Porter Avenue. Think it may have been a temporary move, but they were there. I remember Daryl Lamonica trying his hand at punting, poorly. The players were right there in front of us, we could retrieve the ball and talk to them. It was unbelievably casual. Seemed so informal. Not like today, 60 years later. Players must be protected from the crazy crowd with barriers. We have super star players that are known nationally and paid more than the one hundred grand Ralph Wilson was complaining about. This Franchise is worth considerably more now than it was back then.

All I know is I am so glad that Ralphie baby had the foresight to invest in the

city of Buffalo and brought football back. Still a loyal fan with all the memories of all those years. Attended the Super Bowls that our beloved Bills played in and lost.
